3. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 21ST MAY 2019

The Minutes of the meeting held on 21st May 2019 were approved and signed by the Chairman, Cllr. Tony Lake, proposed by Cllr: Holliday, seconded by Cllr: Leppard and agreed by all.

5. MATTERS ARISING NOT COVERED ELSEWHERE ON AGENDA

- a) Traffic Management
 - Order placed with Kent Highways for speed zone roundels on Old Dover Road, New Dover Road and Capel Street. *Action/Resolution: Waiting date for installation*.
 - Vehicles parked inconsiderately and dangerously on the junction of Winehouse Lane/Old Dover Road is being investigated further by our County Councillor, Geoff Lymer. Action/Resolution: Endeavouring to get Kent Highways to realign and change the road junction line markings. He has also issued notices to perpetrators to move.
- b) School Project Donation

Cllr. Holliday reported School requested to defer the donations to give time to sort and distribute. Councillors received quotations from school for a large storage shed and agreed donation of £1,583 + £50 deliver, to fund storage facilities, proposed by Cllr: Holliday, seconded by Cllr: Lake and agreed by all present. Funding for two classes in First Aid Training lessons already agreed and waiting dates to implement. Action/Resolution: Clerk to notify School to fund storage facilities, together with funding for two classes in First Aid Training lessons. Community Warden to arrange suitable dates with School and Training Company.

Quotation received and discussed for the provision of bollards (one set of drop-down) in between trees on the Lancaster Road boundary. Action/Resolution: As some members thought it would look unsightly, it was decided by all to defer, pending further investigations and advice from KCC Public Rights of Way. Meeting to be arranged to discuss, including change of wooden bollards to PROW at side of Hall.

CCTV Security

No reply from NSL Security regarding upgrading system. Action/Resolution: Clerk to chase.

c) Highways

• Cause for concern - Parking on grass verges on New Dover Road, damaging surface and kerb, together with being a hazard blocking visibility when exiting side roads. Action/Resolution: Kent Highways have been notified and will be chased to oversee and resolve this issue, before an accident happens.

Recreational Area Signage

Currently there is a variety of signage attached to railings around the:

• Toddlers play area. • Petanque court. • Skate park

The signs are fixed by various methods. Protruding bolts and edges of metal fixing straps present an injury risk, such risks often feature in the annual ROSPA Safety Report.

Signs fixed with cable ties are frequently torn off as shown below.

Signs that are clamped to railings often slide down.













In general, the variety of signs and fixings used looks untidy.

I would like Councillors to consider an alternative to these individual signs.

Perhaps two free standing signs would be appropriate, one sited beside the footpath as you approach the Toddlers Area/MUGA/Petanque Court and a second sign beside the path as you approach the Skate Park/Zip Wire. The signs could be suitably worded for each location.

Some more thoughts on securing the field for consideration. There are no costings at this stage.

With regard to metal benches, these are from the same manufacturer as the Memorial Benches. http://www.streetmaster.co.uk/

They could be arranged at various angles rather than in a straight line as illustrated.

The railings could run the entire frontage again depending on costs.

The downside of railing is that it does make the entrance point to the field more obvious.

Whichever way Councillors decide to go, it is likely to be a major cost outlay
