Another recent change is the position of the Farmers Market. For nigh on 15 years this has been successfully run every Tuesday at the hall. Current stalls include bread, cakes, fruit and veg, halloumi, eggs, jams and pickles and plants and flowers. Not to mention all the wonderful craft stalls. The brainchild of Cherry Leppard and Jenny Barraclough, it has survived where many in Kent have fallen by the wayside – in 2018 the Farmers Market was runner up in the Kent Life Farmers Market of the year. The current manager of the market, Debbie Ovenden, has now taken over running it in her own right as a hall user. However the kitchen café operated by Ruby and her army of volunteers, will continue to be run under the auspices of the Village Hall allowing the community to still have the chance for a cup of tea and a natter once they have made their purchases. I would like to take this opportunity once again to thank our volunteers - without them the hall couldn't function. Whether you make tea, put tables and chairs up and down, display signs, sweep floors, carry eggs and bread, fix taps or perform the 101 other things necessary to ensure the operation of a successful community space, we salute you all.

Other plans for the hall will include painting of the main hall during the summer holidays. The hall gets a lot of use and is beginning to look a little tired and tatty. We seem to need to paint the hall every 3 or 4 years which we realise can sometimes mean a little flexibility of the part of regular hall users during the week or so of the work. We are hoping to get this done with the least inconvenience to you all and will keep everyone informed of what is happening well in advance of the work.

From the vicarage

Easter is late this year, and as I write most of Lent stretches ahead of us. So perhaps it was contemplating the thought of no cake for the next few weeks that drew my eye to a newspaper article by the singer Charlotte Church.

In her case, it was not cake but alcohol that she had been abstaining from. Feeling the benefits of 'Dry January' had led her to embrace a dry February as well, resisting pressure from others to drink and feeling so much better for it.

Apparently, the current health and fitness cult has pinched some features of Lent – the "giving up" bit when it comes to chocolate, cream cakes and the rest – but mostly leaves the prayer, Bible reading and other bits to one side. But as liberating as the ideas of wellness and wholeness might seem, as with anything else the joy drains away all too easily when reduced to a list of do's and don'ts: *Thou shalt drink green tea and go to the gym; thou shalt not loaf in front of the TV eating pizza*...

No commandment demands that *Thou shalt give up cake for Lent* – it's my choice. Just as Charlotte Church finds that her new-found regime makes it easier for her to reach out to people and connect with them, so doing Lent – with *all* the bits – does something similar for me. It shifts my attention away from my own selfish wants – even for little things like cake – and keeps the joy by helping me to reach out to God and other people and connect with them.

So, bless you if you're doing Lent - especially if you're doing it with *all* the bits. And a very Happy Easter to you, when the time comes. **Brian**

• <u>Requests from public to address the Council, plus</u> <u>Surgery and Other Feedback:</u> Parking on grass verges; Potholes Hockley Sole; • <u>Traffic Management</u>: Meeting arranged between two Parish Councils and Kent Highways to discuss position of white speed zone reminders on highway in Old Dover Road and New Dover Road. Capel Street roundels position already agreed. These will be done when road surface warms. • <u>Village Questionnaire Data</u> <u>Results:</u> The Community Plan document with results from the questionnaire, should now have been delivered to every household. The Parish Council hope you find this useful. The Action Plan will be visited regularly by a "working party" of Councillors.

• **<u>Roadside Planters:</u>** These awaiting gates being painted when weather improves and will be replanted when completed.

• <u>Council Vacancy</u>: Due to Parish Elections this year, any vacancies as a result, will be revisited at May meeting.

• <u>Planning</u>:

DDC Review of Local Plan: Expected date for consultation on this now expected from District Council in 2020. As per evidence received from the Village Questionnaire, Councillors met with representatives from District Council to request consideration to change the status of the Village in the New Plan. Councillors were informed this will be deliberated accordingly, but changing the status will not stop development in Capel-le-Ferne, it having no real meaning to land allocations. The inclusion of any village status for the Local Plan will be revisited by the District Council.

• <u>Neighbourhood Watch</u>: Lorries in lay-bys, especially outside Amin Stores, was a cause for concern and would be investigated further on ways of prevention by our County Member, Geoff Lymer. Clear up of Courtwood Roundabout reported to Kent Highways and due to be carried out.

• <u>Recreation and Other Equipment</u>: Repairs to Zip-wire and Multi-Use Goal Area underway. • <u>Highways</u>: Extension of 40mph on B2011 due to be carried out soon.

• **<u>Public Rights of Way</u>**: See report on Page 6.

March into Spring with a Free Health MOT

"NHS One You teams" are busy this March with a series of special events across Kent, providing free onthe-spot Health Checks and health 'MOTs' in local venues including high streets and shopping centres.

Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust's One You advisors are teaming up with WellbeingPeople this month to offer Health Checks in Gravesend, Maidstone, Canterbury, Dover, Folkestone and the Isle of Sheppey.

Figures for these areas show that they have some of the county's highest levels of heart failure and disease. Cancer, heart and lung disease also account for a large percentage of premature deaths (under the age of 75) in these districts while stroke is another major health issue.

Health experts advise that prevention, and spotting and managing the early warning signs such as high blood pressure, is an important part of how we can help people to look after their own health.

While many people will already be receiving treatment from their doctor and local health services, it's feared others may be unaware of potential health issues.

If you are aged 40 to 74-years-old and with no relevant pre-existing conditions, you can sign up for a free NHS Health Check for advice on keeping yourself healthy and active. Your blood pressure, height and weight will be checked. You will be given a small finger prick test to check your blood cholesterol and you'll also be asked some questions about your lifestyle and family history. The check will identify the risk of you developing heart disease, kidney disease, diabetes or dementia in the future.

Mark Cummings, One You Locality Manager for Kent Community Health NHS Foundation Trust (KCHFT) said: "We know that some people don't like to go to the GP, so our One You Roadshows are helping people across Kent to get a free NHS Health Check in a convenient location; or some simple lifestyle advice to support them to make the change to a healthier lifestyle. We're really grateful to all of our venues for hosting us this month – particularly Morrison's who have been especially helpful".



Health Checks are led by KCHFT and commissioned by Kent County Council. A series of events were carried out in Thanet and Swale earlier this year. Andrew Scott-Clark, KCC's Director of Public Health, said: "There are many people suffering from debilitating conditions and reaching the end of their life prematurely which is a tragedy as many of these conditions and premature deaths can be prevented through simple lifestyle changes such as quitting smoking, reducing how much alcohol you drink and increasing physical activity."

He added: "High blood pressure and high cholesterol often cause no symptoms whatsoever, so unless you have a check you won't know you have them. High blood pressure can trigger an irregular heartbeat which increases the risk of a stroke. If you know that you are at risk, there are services that can help you to get on the right track and small changes to your lifestyle can really help to lower these issues, and you'll feel fitter and healthier too."

Dog Fouling Increase in certain areas of Capel-le-Ferne Reported to Dover District Council Dog Warden.

Apart from the obvious unpleasant effects of dog fouling there are potential health risks. Dogs can be affected by several types of worm, one of

which can cause serious illness in children. It is important that you:

* clear dog mess from public places and your own garden

* worm your dog every 6 months

* wash your hands after playing with dogs * train your dog to go at home and take a plastic bag and poop scoop when you go out

* It is an offence for any person in charge of a dog not to remove any faeces deposited by a dog in their charge.

Anyone found guilty of an offence will be issued with a fixed penalty ticket (currently £75 fine). This gives an opportunity to discharge liability to prosecution.

Should the fine not be paid, or offences be persistent we may prosecute with a maximum fine of ± 1000 .
