## From the Vicarage

"I don't want my vicar on a racing bike with Lycra and a black cycle helmet!" said the voice on the radio. My ears pricked up. "I want my vicar on a sit-up-and-beg bike, with a long coat, horn-rimmed glasses and a cheery 'Good Morning!" I try to fit the bill. I returned to two wheels a couple of years ago, more as an occasional cyclist than a serious twenty-mile-a-day man. I manage with just a fluorescent green jacket and a blue cycle helmet rather than Lycra. I've lost the reflective cycle clips – they were useless anyway. I'll attempt the cheery 'Good Morning,' as long as it doesn't involve falling off or hitting anything.

True, in recent years cycling has been transformed from a gentle pursuit involving countryside, lemonade and sandwiches into something much more competitive. As a pedestrian I'm uncomfortable with this - I dislike having to leap into the undergrowth on Dover Hill in order to avoid being run down by Team GB as they race down the footpath I'm using. Nor did I appreciate my close encounter with the Pink Tornado in the white helmet who was going for gold near Sainsbury's the other day.

We vicars aren't allowed to do things like that. The expected smile and cheery 'Good Morning' should be essential kit for every cyclist anyway. Missing your parishioners by a whisker as you tear past lacks pastoral sensitivity, and forcing them off the footpath and into the undergrowth is definitely bad form.

I work on Sunday mornings, but if your Sundays usually feature racing bikes and Lycra, remember – the churches are open. Drop in and give them a try - they should offer smiles, cheery 'Good Mornings,' coffee if you're lucky, and prayers for a safe ride home. Brian

Nostalgia or History? The original village hall stood on the junction of Lancaster Avenue and Elizabeth Drive.

The earliest records for that village hall are of meetings in 1938 when there was an entertainment & social committee and a building committee as well as Trustees. Originally meetings were held in private houses, Lancaster Stores and, when the public were invited, in the (old) school, which was the property of the Ecclesiastical Commission. The President was Lady Raphael, "whose true sympathy for the people of Capel le Ferne was expressed in her care for the welfare of the children in their pleasures and joys as well as their health."

Fundraising efforts were boosted when Capel Variety Club's 'excellent show' raised £10 (remember this is 1938) and donations from local residents. Advice from the National Council for Social Services (N.C.S.S.) and Physical Fitness Council had been received. By April 1938 two plots of land had been offered, one with condition the hall was built within two years, the other with no conditions. At a meeting attended by the public the vote to accept the latter was carried by 76 to 9. (With hindsight this was a smart decision). Following this, the building committee was asked to get on with the work until there was something definite to bring before the public.

By the end of that evening monies raised totalled £89.2.0 – pre decimalisation pounds shillings and pence. By Christmas this had increased to £220 and the Entertainment Committee agreed to arrange Socials and whist drives etc., until the funds totalled £400.

Next minutes are dated January 1946, (it took some time post war to return to the project) by which time funds had increased to £370.13.7. The purpose of that meeting was to create a little enthusiasm so that the funds could be increased before Easter. By October 1946 the target had been exceeded and funds stood at £476.13.2.

The hunt for a hall now began; first a sectional hut, advertised for sale at Selsted, was viewed and deemed unsuitable. Mr Mann offered iron framework 60 feet by 20, which was appreciated but rejected. Discussions were held with the C.O of the Coast Regiment St Margaret's Bay about purchasing an army hut, many of which were being disposed of. A publication in Kent Messenger stated that village halls could be obtained on hire.

Meetings were held with Commander Bahin, Secretary of the N.C.S.S. Agreement was reached, a temporary prefabricated building would be loaned to the village at a rent of £13 p.a for 3 years; ownership would rest with N.C.S.S though the village hall would pay construction costs. Things in those days were just as bureaucratic as today – the Parish Council, Charity Commission, Rural Council, N.C.S.S and appointment of a custodial trustee were all involved. By September 1948, all paperwork, including ownership of the land, planning approval and conveyancing had been completed. Mr Maxton's offer of Anderson shelter as a temporary coal shed was accepted.

By January 1949 plans began to be made for the opening ceremony. The road from Capel Street to Lancaster Avenue needed improvement; rubble from Peppers Plain was obtained, trustees did most of the work and a steamroller hired from the Rural Council. Dr Martin opened the hall which remained in use until the current hall was opened in the 1980s. More of that another day.



This month there is plenty of fresh local produce available, so, a few recipes may get your gastric juices flowing.

- To make use of a cheaper cut of meat try slow cooked belly of pork. I'm told this is a fool proof recipe. Season with a little salt. Brush the pan with a little oil. Place the pork belly skin side up in the pan. Bake at 150 for 21/2 hours. Serve with apple sauce, new potatoes and vegetable of your choice.
- Top tip: To check if it is cooked hit the crackling with the flat blade of bread knife. If it is cooked it will sound hollow.
- For a healthy vegetable which children will love and doesn't take too much time. The baby carrots, complete with green tops are delicious just now. Trim the green tops tidy, but leave some on the carrot. Clean the carrots and shake off the excess moisture. Chop half a red onion (white would do) into thin slices pieces. Mix in a bowl with the carrots and pour on a little oil (there are several schools of thought about which is the best one to use). Stir the contents until the onions and carrots are coated. Season with salt and pepper; if desired include a little parsley or rosemary. For an unhealthy treat include a small spoon of honey. Roast in a pan in a hot oven for 30-40 minutes.

Top tip - line the pan with aluminium foil to keep the pan clean.

- A quick supper dish is based around baked eggs, 12 15 minutes. Fry strips of bacon for a few minutes until they go transparent. Lightly grease some ramekins then line with the bacon. Break an egg into each ramekin, lightly season and bake in the oven 170, gas mark 4 for 10 15 minutes, depending on how hard you like your eggs. Great as they are or with toasted soldiers. Top tip: to save on washing up use an avocado instead of the ramekin. You'll need to cook the bacon separately and bake just the egg in the avocado half. You may need to scoop out a little more of the flesh to make enough space for the egg.
- Ever wondered what to do with the bread which is drying out? We're told it is not good for the birds. Rather than waste it, try making bruschetta. Preferably use unsliced bread and slice it a little thicker than normal. Brush with a little oil then cook both sides on the BBQ or grill, until a light brown (if you want to use a toaster do not use the oil). For the topping chop fresh tomatoes with spring onions or chives and moisten with a little French dressing. For variety add a little ham or cheese.

Top tip: rub a garlic clove over the bread before browning it or try grating a little parmesan onto the bread before adding the topping


• Requests from public to address the Council, Surgery and Other Feedback: Overgrown PROW Old Dover Road to Albany Road reported. • Traffic Management: Meeting held with Charlie Elphicke MP - a question and answer document was presented to Councillors for information and available on website. Traffic Management in Dover District to be reviewed by MP in September/October. TAP system of 40mph had been lifted and works continue on A20 for full signage to be in place by September. • Planning: Land South of New Dover Road – Decision made - the road will be named George Close. Clarification being determined on use of open space land. Land North of New Dover Road – Possibly will now be on DDC Planning agenda for their August meeting – notification will be available on Facebook or email database, when confirmed. Land between 107-127 Capel Street – Waiting confirmation of when this application will be on DDC Planning agenda – notification will be available on Facebook or email database, when date available. Land junction Winehouse Lane/Capel Street – Full planning permission now granted. **DDC Review of Local Plan**: Future development of Capel to be part of the Parish Council's agenda to form a working party to produce a questionnaire and then a suitable document for future response on DDC Review. • Neighbourhood Watch: Notification on PCSO Gretel May leaving Capel - letter to be sent to Police on plans for replacement. Capel Cares received responses from insert and pursuing. • Play Equipment Status: All refurbishment now completed on equipment and agreed all was looking good. RoSPA report on all equipment due this month and will be checked when done. Now on the Parish Council agenda, consideration to replace a couple of the static pieces of equipment in the junior play area. Quotation agreed to top up the surface in the Petanque court, caused by settling. • Highways: Pot-holes in Alexandra Road marked for filling, but it was stated this road requires resurfacing. Letter to be sent to Kent Highways to enquire if 40mph on road surface signage on the B2011 could be considered. Discussion on speed camera required on B2011 and that it would not be considered by Kent Highways due to cost implications. Waiting reinstatement of lining Cauldham Close/Cauldham Lane. • Public Rights of Way: Bridleway Old Dover Road to New Dover Road and clarification on future maintenance to be discussed further with other agencies. Meeting taking place with Trail Manager of ANONB to ascertain future plans for Public Rights of Way, especially the clifftop coastal • Other: Changes affecting services of Folkestone Family Practices to be taken up with MP. Kent Police protect and connect leaflets distributed and available for notifying public how to protect online. Later Life booklets (available at Village Hall and Capel Cares coffee mornings) indicating useful services and businesses for many of your later life needs, including businesses who have staff who have attended Dementia Awareness course.

Next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday, 15<sup>th</sup> August 2017 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall (Small Hall).

At the beginning of 2017 the Trust became a charitable incorporated organisation, a move designed to ensure it can continue to operate effectively. While its new legal status makes no difference to the Trust's day-to-day operations, the new structure means it can continue to carry on its important work with the right safeguards in place.

The logo has been amended to reflect the new set up and highlight the fact that the Trust now incorporates the Battle of Britain Fighter Association, the exclusive body which only 'the Few' are entitled to join.






