General maintenance has included mending doors, new locks, fixing taps and toilets, cleaning curtains; the list seems endless. Events held by the hall have included the Annual Garage Safari, Craft Fair, Film Club, Farmers Market, Indoor Kurling and the Volunteers lunch. Regular hirers now include a vet clinic and dog training as well as the Youth Club, Parish Council, Bridge Club, Brownies, WI, Fit Friends, Judo and Short Mat Bowls, and this is far from an exhaustive list. Thanks go out to all Trustees and volunteers who get out and put away tables, run kitchens, make cakes, put up Christmas decorations, take them down, perform routine maintenance, bid for funding, do marketing and generally the 101 things that ensure a successful community hall. A huge thank you is also extended to our cleaners who do a sterling job particularly when faced with extra demands on their time.



From the vicarage

Grumpy Vicar Moment: NONE of the Advent calendars that I saw in the seasonal aisle of a local supermarket had anything to do with the Christmas story! Grrr!

Now, I can guess what you are probably thinking: "What an old meanie! We've been looking forward to our daily dose of chocolate throughout the first twenty-four days of December all year!" Or perhaps you prefer beer, or maybe perfume – you can buy Advent calendars with those in, too. But the ones I remember were magically Christmassy, with a picture behind each door until you reached the Nativity scene behind number 24.

Then there was the Blue Peter Advent Crown! Remember that? How many families anticipated Christmas by collecting wire coat hangers, wire, baubles and tinsel ready for the moment when Valerie Singleton appeared on our TV screens and showed us one she had made earlier? She didn't just use real candles, she lit them, too! The instructions on the BBC website now recommend the tamer option of more baubles instead.

For me a similar tradition that we have in church – the Advent ring – is my favourite. In the gloom of a grey early December morning we light a single candle (no baubles for us!) for the prophets, who foretold Jesus' birth. A week later, we light another - for John the Baptist, who prepared the way for Jesus. A third is lit for Mary, Jesus' mother until, as Christmas approaches, four candles are blazing away. Finally Christmas arrives, the white candle in the centre representing Jesus is lit, and darkness gives way to light.

All through January the Advent Ring, with Jesus in the middle, lights up the sanctuary. Meanwhile, the chocolate, beer and perfume are all long gone...



Summary of some items discussed

at meeting on Tuesday, 20th November 2018

Councillors agreed to a • Traffic Management: "rolling programme" to fund 20mph zone reminder roundels on the roads in Capel-le-Ferne. Initially this will be in Capel Street and will be implemented by Kent Highway contractors in the Spring, when weather improves and road surface suitable. Depending on funding availability, investigations will be undertaken to include all side roads, including Old Dover Road and then New Dover Road (when the speed limit extensions to the 40mph speed zone is organised on Dover Hill and beyond new development on B2011). Further to this pro-active programme, the Parish Council are taking the immediate initiative to order 20mph zone stickers for wheelie bins (free of charge), if residents wish to use When received, these will be available from them. Community Warden and/or Parish Clerk. The use of these has been agreed by Dover District Council and Kent Highways.

KCC responds to government consultation into non-hydraulic fracturing.

Plans to remove the need for planning permission to explore for shale gas and to make production proposals, for the government to determine, have been rejected by Kent County Council.

KCC has recently responded to two government consultations as to whether to allow non-hydraulic fracturing exploration under Permitted Development rights and to allow plans for the production phase to become nationally significant infrastructure projects. This means decisions on whether to grant or refuse permission is taken away from local councils and allowed under a blanket government agreement or a government appointed Inspector.

Both types of development would currently be for the County Council to determine. KCC, in its response, described the plans as "frustrating for local communities" and "contrary to local democracy

KCC cabinet member for planning Mike Whiting said: "Local decision making is fundamental to our planning system. Whilst recognising that shale gas development may have the potential to assist in securing energy supplies and delivering economic benefits, it is a contentious form of development that does not lend itself to a permitted development process. Such development requires decision making at the local level, where the community voice can be considered properly, in shaping these proposals and ultimately in determining whether development should go ahead or not."

Despite the consultation stating the government remains committed to ensuring local communities are fully involved in planning decisions that affect them, KCC said it was not clear how that would be delivered if non-hydraulic fracturing is considered 'permitted development.'

KCC has also highlighted that areas including green belt, ancient woodland, Special Protection Areas, Special Areas of Conservation, Ramsar – wetland – sites and areas affecting listed buildings should not be include for permitted development. Cabinet member, Mr Whiting continued: "There is no clear rôle for the community voice to be properly considered in a permitted development proposal." The proposed regime is likely to be confusing and frustrating for local communities which rightly expects full community involvement for this type of development.

In the past, Kent has received applications for exploratory boreholes, none of which involved fracking, so would be development that would fall within the remit of this consultation.

From that experience, Kent County Council is aware of the considerable environmental concerns that were raised, including the detailed information that was sought by the Environment Agency and others in order for it to be able to form a view on the acceptability or otherwise of development for exploratory work.

As a result of the additional information that was required, the three applications in Kent were withdrawn. The experience in Kent demonstrated there is not a simple list that can be ticked to evidence compliance and that the issues raised require a bespoke solution that is tested at planning application stage. This is very re assuring for the residents of Kent.

Finally, this year, for me, appears to have flown by and we are heading towards the festive season again. Whilst many of us will be enjoying a few days away from work, spare a thought for those who will have to work over the festive period, the Police Officers, the Ambulance and medical staff, the Fire and Rescue teams, members of the armed services engaged on active duty and many others who keep services operative for us on that special day.

This time of the year will be a hard time for those who have lost loved ones recently or live all alone. If you are aware of someone living nearby under such circumstances, please consider them. They may wish to stay home alone in their thoughts, but it is important they do not feel isolated. Just pop round to show they are not forgotten, could make all the difference for them.

I wish you all a peaceful festive period and a trouble free, healthy New Year for 2019.





Out Shopping

* Keep valuables out of sight

 Keep your handbag shut (purse bells are available from Ashford Police Station reception, £1)
 * Make sure no one can see your PIN number as you type it into a cash machine
 * If you think a cash machine has been tampered with report it straightaway

* Use a credit/bank card contactless protector (available from Ashford Police Station reception, £1)

At Home

* Lock doors and windows * Keep presents out of sight * Don't leave car keys or handbags near doors or windows

* If you are going away cancel any deliveries and use a timer to switch lights on and off

* Don't open the door to unexpected callers, use a door chain and check first * Don't keep large quantities of cash at home

Your Car

* Keep presents and other valuables out of sight * Park in well-lit supervised car parks
* Remove portable Sat Navs from your car and clean the windscreen of suction marks
* Never leave keys in the ignition, even for the briefest of moments

Out and About

* Make sure you do not drink too much and leave yourself at risk

* Drinking and driving do not mix - nominate a driver if going out in a group or get a licensed taxi home * Make sure your drink isn't tampered with – don't leave your drink unattended

* If you are offered a high value product at a bargain price it may be stolen or not the real thing – don't part with your money unless you are sure the source is genuine.


