From the Vicarage

I have never been able to keep a diary, and admire the self-discipline of those who do. Maybe that's why, when I first came across it years ago, I enjoyed reading a book entitled *Transport of Delight* by Methodist minister and now-retired Norwich bus driver Jack Burton. Over a year, he wrote about his day-to-day existence – not just about church and his wife and family, but also his love of football, evenings in the pub, and life seen from behind the wheel of a bus. One entry describes how, while on a meal break during their shift just before Christmas, he persuaded his conductor to join him in visiting Norwich Cathedral. This was not something his conductor would normally have done, and walking through the door, he gazed around. In front of them was a huge crib, ready for the Christmas services. He looked at it, turned to his driver and asked: *Is this for everyone?*

Sadly, some people seem to think that churches only welcome a certain kind of person. Not true - Jesus seems to have been ready to mix with just about anyone, and I'm sure that if asked, Jesus would say that he wants his followers to do as he did. I once invited someone whose wife had recently died to a church coffee morning, hoping that he might try making new friends. *But I'm not religious!* He said. *But you can drink coffee and talk to people – so you're in!* I replied.

When we can, we keep our churches open so that people can just go in and pray, be quiet, look around or whatever. You don't have to be a churchgoer or a certain type of person to be welcome. It really is for everyone.

Even so, several people commented on how nice the hall looked after the committee decorated. Two Christmas trees were donated and put up, one in the new porch, one by the internal entrance. Both looked beautiful and we'd like to thank the people concerned. Compliments are always appreciated.

Advantage was taken of the school holidays to freshen up the kitchen, apologies to those hirers who were inconvenienced; we hope you think it was worth it. Could we ask people to take care when using the kitchen? The painting was finished Thursday evening and by Friday evening there were streaks down the wall by the bin. The wall has been now repainted and a Perspex sheet put in front of it to try to keep the wall looking good. New doors have been ordered to replace those under the kitchen sink, so more improvements are in the pipeline.

There was an interesting time during the heavy rain over the Christmas break, when the porch turned into a mini waterfall. The builder and roofer were exceptional and came out to the hall to investigate (in the pouring rain and strong winds) and undertake some remedial works. There aren't many who would have done so during the Christmas shut down and we are grateful they did. The cause, and a cure, has been identified but it will take some time for everything to be completed.

As a charity, the Trustees formally report on how they are meeting their responsibilities in terms of providing a benefit to residents of Capel-le-Ferne and in terms of prudent financial management. This was done at the annual meeting in November when the annual report and audited accounts were presented. Thanks were given to all volunteers who had helped run the hall and who had helped in all the events to raise funds to maintain and improve the hall. The new committee were elected and at the December meeting, Brian Wilson was re-elected as Chairman and Sally Cook as secretary with Jenny Carter as Treasurer.

There are a variety of events planned for the coming year which we hope will be supported. As well as other thing, the hall needs redecorating; if you feel there are other improvements you'd like to see, please let us know. Equally if you have a few hours to spare to help with fundraising occasionally, we'd love some help.

All at the Farmers' Market hope you had a good Christmas and look forward to seeing you in the coming months. The Capel le Ferne Primary School Choir was well received when they visited the last market before Christmas. Their attendance is one of the highlights of the year and enticed Father Christmas to pop in for a few minutes. Could we also say thank you to the WI for their carol singing? (Their collection this year was for The Pilgrim's Hospice, an organisation dear to many hearts in Capel.) Numbers for both choirs were depleted by the bug which seems to have affected many more people than usual for a Christmas infection. We look forward to seeing both choirs back again this year.

After the cooking, eating and socialising over the festive season January is a time to recover and maybe even detox. The food from the Farmers' Market is free from many of the additives used in the larger food chains and there is plenty of opportunity to speak directly to the producers, another advantage over the supermarkets.

For the computer literate a click and collect service is available – try farmersmarketonline.co.uk. (Note the 's' on the end). For those less technology minded a visit to the market will be a more social event. Ruby's Kitchen offers drinks and toasted teacakes and plenty of people to chat to while you enjoy your refreshments and swap thoughts on the produce on sale.

An amazing group of volunteers help set up, run and clear up the market every week. Without them the market wouldn't function. There's always room for more and it's a great way to get to know people in the village, especially if you've moved in recently. Just pop into the market and ask for more information.

In January/February a range of rich game products is available, perfect for making a hearty meal through the winter months. Produce includes rabbit, hare, partridge, duck and pheasant, though not all every week. For the more conservative palates Debbie will still have her range of sausages, beef, lamb, chicken and other meats. Some people will have had to work shifts over Christmas. If you're planning a belated family get together try ordering a boned and rolled joint. Easy to cook and even easier to carve and there is far less waste.

Root vegetables enhance the flavour and nutritional value of a meal, or make a hearty soup for a lunch, especially beneficial for anyone who has decided to diet after all the Christmas treats. January and February seasonal foods are cabbages, Brussels, celeriac, beetroot, Jerusalem artichokes, purple sprouting broccoli, celery, chard, kohlrabi, leeks, parsnips, radishes, swede, turnips and carrots.

Beesborough Farm will have their range of stored apples and pears, perfect for snacking or adding to other fruits for a homemade fruit juice – more thirst quenching than shop bought fruit juices and preservative free. Farthingloe Farm and Mike Vine's delicatessen are both stocking their range of pasties, pies, pastries and smoked products as well as ham and humous or taramasalata.

Eggs from Sherley's Farm can make an economical healthy meal. Try putting them into a greased ramekin with a little bit of milk, yogurt or cream. Cover with a little grated cheese (dairy products are on sale at the market), season and pop in a pre-warmed oven (190C/170c fan/gas mark 5) for 15-20 minutes until set as hard as your taste buds prefer. An easy supper with chips and roasted tomatoes. Simple variations mean you can cook the eggs individually in muffin tins or all together in a casserole dish. Alternatively line the ramekins/casserole dish with sliced bacon and cook as above.

Cake portions available at the market are generous – I buy them and cut them in half to give us a little treat at teatime without putting on too much weight. This avoids making a large one and over indulging. Whatever you fancy by way of fresh food there is something to tickle your taste buds at the Farmers' Market as well as an opportunity to meet old friends and make new ones. See you there.

Summary of some items discussed



• **Requests from public to address the Council, plus Surgery and Other Feedback:** Closure of roads and diversions, Affinity Water work, Footpath installation at Jarvis Homes on B2011, Fridges left outside property, grass verge damage in various vicinities, street lights not working – all reported or being investigated. **Defibrillator:** On order, waiting delivery then installation outside Village Hall.

• **Traffic Management:** Investigations on-going for provision of speed indicators and/or repeater signs in various locations in Village. Cllr: Greening to take over as delegate and co-ordinator of Speed Watch Scheme. Courtwood Roundabout signage still not reinstated by Kent Highways. • **Planning:** Several applications and their status reported – full details available on Dover District Council website: <https://www.dover.gov.uk/Planning/Planning-Applications/View-Applications--Decisions/View-Applications.aspx>

DDC Review of Local Plan: Questionnaire to residents being sent out with February issue of Grapevine, which will include ways to return, collection dates and drop-in sessions to discuss with Councillors. This will form a basis for response to Local Plan when up for consultation. • **Neighbourhood Watch:** Investigations on-going to; replace Village flower boxes at speed limit signs; cleaning of the two bus shelters owned by Parish Council; circulation of inappropriate parking leaflets; **Capel Cares:** Monthly Coffee Mornings to be held in Church Hall from 2nd February. Report for monthly newsletter being considered. • **Recreation Equipment:** Bi-monthly status report received by Councillors. Zip-Wire now repaired and reinstated. Two new replacement infant swings installed. Consideration will be given in next financial year to replace un-used equipment in junior play area, together with enhancement to hedgerow to clear out brambles and overgrown undergrowth. • **Highways:** Potholes continue to be a cause for concern in how they are repaired and classification of “what is a pothole” or “surface damage” according to Kent Highways. Contact to be made with newly appointed Project Manager at Kent Highways to arrange meeting to discuss several Highway issues. • **Public Rights of Way:** Cliff paths reported to be very muddy and slippery – Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty to be contacted for advice on surface dressing. I wish everyone a peaceful and healthy 2018.

Over the recent festive holiday many may have over indulged in the consumption of alcohol for just a few days and then be back in control until their next celebration.

Others, either will find it more difficult to stop, or this festive period may be the start of a downward spiral leading to the start of alcoholism and all the alcohol related illnesses it will attract eventually over the next fifteen to twenty years, then there is the additional costs such as the grief alcoholism gives to families, marriages, relationships, employment not to mention the phenomenal costs to the NHS and the Local Authority.

To combat this problem Kent is rolling out a Dry January campaign.

As Dry January gets underway, special training is helping Kent's frontline staff to identify and support people who may have an alcohol dependency.

The sessions for professional workers, including probation officers, job centre staff, careers advisors and social workers, are just one of the many support services available from Kent County Council-commissioned drugs and alcohol charity 'change, grow, live' (CGL).

Felicity Rudman, West Kent Housing Association Tenancy Support Officer, explained why she took part in the training: "We go into all sorts of issues in our jobs, from rent arrears to property neglect, and some of the times alcohol does play a part. After doing the training, I can now look back and I know I've experienced this with a few cases. It helps to be able to relate to the things that people are dealing with as well as knowing there's somewhere we can refer them to for specialist help so it can be nipped in the bud before it gets to the point that we can't deal with it."

In Kent, it is believed that more than 327,000 people are drinking at dangerous levels. Kent hospitals treat approximately 20,000 cases* of alcohol related illness and injury a year while there is also a huge impact on emergency and health services due to accidents on the road, in the workplace and the home. Alcohol-related issues cost the NHS in Kent an estimated £108million a year.

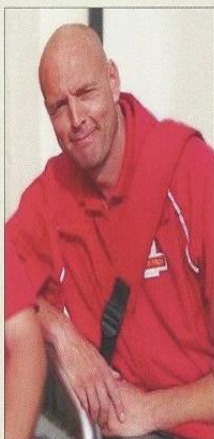
Mike Trace, CEO of The Forward Trust, the charity which runs the East Kent Community Drug and Alcohol Service, said: "We know from experience that issues with alcohol can have a significant impact on people from all walks of life, as well as their families, particularly during and directly after the festive season. That's why our East Kent Drug and Alcohol Service hubs are running a series of informal coffee mornings throughout January for people who are worried about the amount of alcohol they drink. People can drop in without an appointment and talk in confidence to a member of our team about their concerns. "Forward supports people throughout East Kent who have issues with drugs and alcohol, no matter what those issues are. If you need help, do get in touch or drop into any of our five Hubs."

Inconsiderate parking is a stressful part of everyday life for us all.

Unfortunately in and around Capel-le-Ferne at the moment we are seeing a lot more of it than we use to, and we need to be aware of how and where we park and problems it may cause to others.

We appreciate that some roads in the area are quite narrow and need to ensure that when parking on the road, there is enough space for other vehicles to pass safely – especially in the case of emergency vehicles, but we also need to leave enough room on footpaths for those who need to pass with pushchairs, wheelchairs and mobility scooters.

If we park on pathways in a manner that obstructs other users or their property, it can be deemed illegal, and is enforceable by Dover District Council. 
