From the Vicarage

A conversation I had recently brought back a long-forgotten childhood memory. I must have been about eight, and at school another boy had been picking on me for weeks. In the playground he finally shoved me once too often, and I retaliated by landing a punch on his chin. The sense of satisfaction didn't last, and what happened next must have persuaded me that it wasn't worth it. I've followed a rather different path in life ever since.

The conversation was about the recent tragic events in Manchester and London. In the face of apparently senseless, indiscriminate violence our first thought is so often to hit back. But a while ago I came across an unusual book by former Archbishop of Cape town Desmond Tutu and his daughter Mpho. Entitled *The Book of Forgiving*, what makes it unusual is that it is, I suppose, a handy guide to how to forgive. He writes from his own experience of how, with the end of apartheid in South Africa, the country could have chosen a bloodbath but chose forgiveness instead. He gives examples of the horrors that people there have, amazingly, managed to forgive - they don't make easy reading.

Tutu would probably tell us faced with our own horrors we can choose between forgiveness and revenge. Revenge, he warns, is always costly. Choosing forgiveness doesn't excuse anything – it's not a soft option – but in the end it is those who forgive who find peace. That boy who made my life a misery? We ended up at the same secondary school and, until he and his family moved away and we lost touch, actually became friends. **Brian**

The Village Hall is a registered charity, reporting to the Charity Commission on a regular basis. One of the key questions asked, is about the demonstration of public benefit, and we thought you'd like to see the answer. Superficially it is easily answered- 'by the provision of a facility which can be used by all Capel-le-Ferne residents. In trendy management-speak it contributes to social inclusion plus regular mental and physical activity. But in plain English there is much more to it than that, especially when you remember that it is managed by volunteers. The hall is a venue for many of the village organisations which offer social, sports and entertainment opportunities for local residents. The age range is from a few days old - preschool offers a great range of services for pre-school children - through to older citizens who have retired and all ages in between. Some, such as dancing, brownies and youth club are aimed directly at youngsters of the community. For those wanting something less energetic there is bridge or presentations at retirement fellowships or the WI which also offer social occasions. For home birds there is a wide range of books and jigsaws which can be bought at competitive prices (usually a donation rather than a set price). Highlights for the year include the pantomime and the community carol service. The weekly farmers' market brings fresh locally grown food to the village centre, with the chance to order in advance and even have it delivered to your doorstep. The market, started by Cherry, Gwyn, Jenny and Mick, has won several award during its life and has gained a reputation as being one of the friendlier ones in Kent. Local producers have been known to test the market here before moving on to bigger and better things. Sandgate Bakeries are a real example – what began as a hobby is now a full time business. Farthingloe bake pies specifically for the market and Marsh Farm Produce has extended their range to include diary with their meat. PJ & Kevin provide fruit and vegetables which Barbara and Sprinkles cater for those with a sweet tooth. The craft stalls there give ideas/products for presents, even offering wool to do your own knitting; in fact, several talented residents are able to sell their products at one or another of the events organised by the hall committee. The committee have arranged a postal service which is well used by local residents, particularly in the weeks coming up to Christmas. The refreshment tables offer more social opportunities. with the added possibility of meeting the Community Warden, PCSO or Parish Council representatives, depending on which week in the month it is. A hidden benefit is it is an opportunity for many senior residents to come and socialise without having join an organisation; if someone is unexpectedly not at the market a welfare check can be organised if appropriate. During school holidays, families pop in for tea while visiting to use the facilities on Jubilee Field. The Village Hall also supports the Parish Council by providing toilet and indoor facilities and power for the Community Days on the Jubilee Field as well as power and siting for the provision of CCTV coverage of the playing fields.

The Hall is available for use as a venue for private functions and the indoor includes; p.a system, computer and DVD projection onto the screen which drops down in front of the stage. The quality of the p.a. system makes it suitable for use by professional entertainers, such as live musicians and DJs with their decks. For parties organized at home the Hall has made available tables and chairs for people to use at home. Compared with other halls the hiring fees are low and local residents get a discount. Hiring fee income covers the basis cost of hiring the hall so the volunteers do an immense amount of continuous fundraising (have you joined the 100+ club yet). Organisation of the fundraising often benefits not only the Hall but the wider community; for example all the organisation and advertising work for the Garage Safari, which then brings in many hundreds of pounds direct to local residents and to St Radigund's Church as well as the Village Hall. The local branch of a national charity is using the knowhow and expertise of the Village Hall Committee to run next season's boot fairs. A New Year's Eve event has made a welcome return to the Village Hall and is proving very popular.

Fundraising is supplemented by continuous searching for grants to help fund refurbishment; the Committee monitors the condition and fabric of the building, and compare facilities here with those elsewhere. This ensures the Hall stays up to date and fit for purpose. The High Sheriff of Kent attended recently to present a certificate to one of the volunteers and was very complementary about the Hall, while he tried his hand at short mat bowls. Within the last 10 years, major refurbishment has seen the toilets and kitchen upgraded and a separate disabled toilet with power assisted door and baby changing facilities provided. Windows have been replaced, new curtains for the windows and stage have been hung, new chairs - some more comfortable than others - and tables bought, the Hall is redecorated (time to redo is fast approaching) and a new floor and carpeting laid. Now disabled access is to be improved by replacing the difficult entry via a side door with a simple straight entry via a wider ramp with a gentler gradient. Thanks to the Committee and Treasurer's financial management has ensured all this has been achieved without going into the red.

As a volunteer it feels as if the Committee does a great deal and, while we recognise there is more which could be done, we also have lives to lead. If you would like to get involved please contact a Trustee or pop down to the Market one Tuesday for a chat. New blood helps keep us innovative and commitment could be as little as one hour a month. We do hope you agree that the hall can demonstrate public benefit in more days than you realised.





• <u>Planning</u>: Land South of New Dover Road - Proposed Name of New Development could be George Close and was approved by Councillors. Development of Bridleway, adjacent to site being investigated further. <u>Land North of New Dover Road</u> – Maybe on DDC Planning Committee Agenda for July, watch Parish Council Facebook Page and email notifications. <u>Land between 107-127 Capel Street</u> – Yellow lines in Capel Street proposed by Kent Highways part of an amendment to plans. A response from Parish Council being compiled. <u>Land junction Winehouse Lane/Capel Street</u> – Still waiting more information. <u>DDC Review of Local Plan</u>: Councillors will be meeting a Member of Dover District on their Review of the Land Allocation Local Plan.

• <u>Neighbourhood Watch</u>: Community Warden to arrange a SCAM meeting for residents and also, a meeting for our Speed Watch Scheme Team. We now have a new Kent Police assessed site on Old Dover Road for our Speed Watch. Minor parking issues dealt with. Reminder sent out via media coverage regarding alertness when windows and doors are left open. Care to be taken on part of New Dover Road, opposite development site on temporary surface of hard-core, which may contain some rough material. Concerns expressed on general lack of Police presence and responses.

• <u>Play Equipment Status</u>: Several items at Playing Field to be refurbished over the next few weeks. Cleaning of picnic tables and benches to be investigated. • <u>Highways</u>: On-going traffic issues on B2011 and Capel Street, both of which form a major priority of the Parish Council's agenda, visited at every monthly meeting. • <u>Public Rights of Way</u>: Clearance of Bridleways and footpaths on-going. Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty meeting was attended by one Councillor and he is now investigating and will endeavour to arrange, someone to attend village and walk these to show pending issues. • <u>Other</u>: <u>Proposals for Local Bus Services</u> – Parish Council to request the current Stagecoach Consultation regarding bus services and routes, takes in change of route to Folkestone Hospital and Station, first visited in 2009 and 2013 - Residents & organisations are urged to give views on Stagecoach proposals for local bus services. MESSAGE FROM RESIDENT:

On behalf of all us bus users, a big thank you to the Parish Council for funding our lovely new bus shelter, it even has a seat with a view!! Also, to Cherry for fighting our corner to get it, just a shame the village had to pay for it.

RAISING AWARENESS: Landowners are responsible for vegetation, hedges and trees which overhang roads and pavements, are urged to 'cut it back'.

Overgrown trees and hedges can force people – particularly wheelchair users and parents with pushchairs – into the road, putting their safety at risk. Meanwhile vegetation which overhangs roads can cause a danger to motorists, especially to drivers of high-sided vehicles such as lorries or buses. 'Cut It Back', - maintenance of trees and hedges growing on private land is the responsibility of the property or landowner. "People who have property bordering the road or footway may not realise it's their responsibility to ensure vegetation is not causing a danger or obstruction, or blocking off light from a street lamp. We would strongly encourage people to maintain their trees and hedges responsibly and to inspect them regularly during the growing season." THANK YOU.

The Headteacher of the Vielle Eglise primary school, who was amongst the visitors, made a visit to Capel School with Head Teacher David Metcalfe with a view to developing ties between the schools. Kent County Council launches drink-driving campaign

Kent Council's recent new figures reveals around one in six of all road deaths involve drink drivers. A new study shows that over the last three years there have been 654 crashes and 951 casualties as a result of a driver being impaired by alcohol.

Of the 951 casualties, 161 people were seriously injured while 18 people died as a result of drink-driving.

"You don't have to be drunk to be dangerous on the roads. Just one drink can increase the chances of having a crash, sometimes with tragic consequences for you, the victims involved and their families."

Small amounts of alcohol will affect your ability to drive safely and it will affect your reaction times and ability to drive. "The message is simple - if you're driving, is having a drink worth it?"

Maidstone had the highest casualties with 109 followed by Thanet with 105 and Canterbury with 100.

August saw the most drink related collisions over the three year study period and the most collisions involving alcohol were recorded between 10pm and 11pm.

Half of all alcohol related collisions occurred at the weekend and a quarter of all collisions occurred on a Saturday.

More than half of all collisions happened on roads with a 30mph speed limit.

The penalties on drink drivers can be far-reaching.

Driving bans and prison sentences can lead to drink drivers losing their jobs, while fines and increased insurance premiums can have a long-lasting financial effect.

Throughout the next few months, Kent Police will be carrying out road checks at all times of the day across the county and officers will focus of high risk locations.

Chief Inspector Peter Steenhuis from Kent Police's Roads Policing Unit said: "Drivers should never get behind the wheel if they have had alcohol or are under the influence of controlled drugs as they significantly increase the chances of harming themselves and others."

Kent Fire and Rescue Service Director of Operations Sean Bone-Knell said: "Unfortunately, our firefighters are frequently called out to deal with serious devastation on our roads caused by drivers under the influence of alcohol.

It is simply not worth risking your life and the lives of others by drinking alcohol at all if you intend to drive."


REMINDER TO ALL WHO WALK THEIR DOGS ON THE BATTLE OF BRITAIN MEMORIAL GROUNDS




