Raffle tickets can be obtained from the Post Office at the Farmers Market and also village hall trustees. It is planned that the work will be carried out around the bookings of existing hall users to lessen the impact on their activities. More discussion needs to be held on future plans for the village hall. We have almost signed off the business plan for the next five years but discussions still need to be had on future plans. We are turning away business at the moment because of lack of hall availability but are keen to make sure that the people using the hall, for the most part, are residents.

From the vicarage

The Old Testament prophet Isaiah looked forward to a time when *the ears of the deaf will be unstopped*. In later life my father suffered from hearing loss; and a couple of years ago I realised that it was happening to me, too.

It was while teaching in school one day that I addressed a girl as Kayleigh. She wasn't Kayleigh, she explained gently, but Katie. This and similar incidents showed that I wasn't hearing the't' sound. I saw my GP, was referred to Audiology, diagnosed as a "textbook case of age-related hearing loss" and given hearing aids. They're great, but don't solve every problem, especially not in busy classrooms. Another occasion, when a girl had to repeat the same thing to me three times, finally convinced me that it was time to lay down my whiteboard marker.

Mind you, perhaps there are compensations. I once met someone who had been taught by the late, great and profoundly deaf Professor William Barclay, Church of Scotland minister, one-time Professor of Divinity at the University of Glasgow and, in his day, popular writer and broadcaster who had a reputation for turning his hearing aid off when writing. He recalled Barclay's words to his students: *I would remind you that I wear a hearing aid – and I'm not obliged to listen to rubbish!*

I still cope with tutoring pupils individually, and with most other situations, so please don't let anyone feel that they need to shout slowly or wave their arms for me to understand them – not yet, anyway. I'm certainly not despondent – in Heaven, after all, my ears will be unstopped... **Brian**

Public Health England (PHE) South East is urging people in Canterbury and areas where there is much contact with Canterbury through school, college, work, hospital visits

or social to check their children are up-to-date with two doses of MMR vaccine following five confirmed cases of measles in the area.

PHE is working closely with NHS and local authority partners to raise awareness of how the public can protect themselves and their families and prevent further cases.

Dr Rachel Pudney, PHE South East Health Protection consultant, said:

"Measles is not a harmless childhood illness as many think – it is extremely infectious, can strike anyone and sadly in some instances can have very serious long term and life changing consequences.

"The best form of protection against measles is the MMR vaccination which is why PHE is urging people to check their MMR status with their GP surgery. It is really important that anyone who hasn't already had two doses of the MMR vaccine contacts their GP surgery for an appointment to get vaccinated. If you're unsure whether you or your children have had two MMRs, first check your child's Red Book or contact your GP surgery. You do not need additional MMR vaccines if you and your children have all had two MMR vaccines.

"Thanks to vaccinations like the MMR, measles is not as common in the UK as it once was, but in recent years we have seen more cases emerging, especially among groups and communities where MMR vaccination rates are not as high."

Measles is a highly infectious viral illness that can lead to serious complications, especially in people with immune problems, pregnant women, and in babies younger than one year.

Symptoms typically include:

- high fever (temperature of 39°C or higher)
- sore, red, watery eyes
- coughing
- aching and feeling generally unwell
- a blotchy red brown rash, which usually appears 2-4 days after the initial symptoms

If you think you could have measles, it's really important to stay away from places where you could come into contact with lots of people - so do not go to work or school, visit hospital or attend social gatherings until at least four days after the onset of the rash.

Dr Pudney added: "Everyone should be vigilant for the symptoms of measles and if you're concerned that you or your child may have measles, please do not go straight to A&E or your GP surgery. Instead telephone your GP or ring NHS 111 for advice. This may help to prevent spreading it to other people who may be vulnerable."

<u>One of the highlights of Capel-le-Ferne's year takes place on Sunday, 7th July,</u> when the Battle of Britain Memorial Trust hosts its annual Memorial Day to honour the men whose bravery kept these shores safe in 1940.

A flypast and later flying display by a Spitfire and Hurricane of the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight (subject to weather and serviceability) is again set to be a highlight of what is always a spectacular and colourful day.

This year's guest of honour will be Air Vice-Marshal A M Turner CB CBE, Air Marshal and Deputy Commander Capability, Headquarters Air Command and Air Member for Personnel and Capability. The Kent Wing of the Air Training Corps will provide an arms drill and a band display, while music will be provided by the Central Band of the Royal Air Force and the day will end with a Sunset Ceremony.

The display by the RAF Central Band and the flypast by the Memorial Flight are always well received, while the parade and service of commemoration is brought to life by the colourful sight of standard bearers from many exservice organisations.

This year's event will mark 25 years since Wing Commander Geoffrey Page – one of the Few and the original driving force behind the National Memorial to the Few here at Capel-le-Ferne – invited members of the Battle of Britain Fighter Association to the first such event in 1994.

While the first event was advertised as being "a very informal affair", with no budget to provide either seats or portable toilets, 2019's Memorial Day is the result of a great deal more behind-the-scenes planning, although remembrance remains at the heart of the day's parade and service.

The shop, cafe and Scramble Experience will all be open for most of the day, adding additional attractions to this day of tribute and remembrance. The event begins with a display by the Kent Wing ATC band at 10.30am.

• <u>Requests from public to address the Council, plus</u> <u>Surgery and Other Feedback</u>: None.

• <u>**Traffic Management**</u>: Order placed with Kent Highways for speed zone roundels on Old Dover Road, New Dover Road and Capel Street. Waiting date for installation.

• <u>Village Action Plan</u>: Working Party waiting to schedule a meeting to discuss progress on points raised.

• <u>Planning</u>: NEW Application submitted for development of 107-127 Capel Street, (see page 11). Breach of planning permission contravening the "no access" condition to the Jarvis Homes Development Site from Old Dover Road resulted in a BIG apology received from Jarvis Homes that they are aware to not use Old Dover Road and they blamed the contractors employed who have been chastised. Also the additional and relocation of signage either side of the site is being dealt with by Dover District Council Planning Enforcement Officers.

• <u>Playing Field Security:</u> Quotations received on ways to deter unwanted visitors on Playing Field – this was deferred pending further investigations and advice from KCC Public Rights of Way. Upgrade of CCTV still being investigated on cost and requirements.

• <u>Highways</u>: Vehicles parked inconsiderately and dangerously on the junction of Winehouse Lane/Old Dover Road is being investigated further by our County Councillor, Geoff Lymer, who is endeavouring to get Kent Highways to realign and change the road junction line markings. He has also issued notices to perpetrators to move. Lack of grass cutting in Old Dover Road, New Dover Road and Playing Field was a cause for concern and contractors have been chased, together with concerns on drain blockage when grass cut on New Dover Road.

• <u>Public Rights of Way</u>: Reports received from users of Green Lane how they are enjoying the new improved access. Delegated Councillor chasing lockable bollard repairs, first cut of all PROWs and the unpassable Satmar to Winehouse Lane route.

• <u>Capel Cares</u>: Investigation to take place in setting up protocols for group. Coffee mornings are well attended. • Other:

Village Resilience Plan, for use in an emergency, being reviewed and updated.

Vehicles exceeding the speed limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds. In cases where education is blatantly ignored and evidence of repeat or excessive offences is collated (even across county borders), enforcement and prosecution follow. CSW Online is working on behalf of the Police and communities to organise and coordinate CSW activity. Speeding is not just a local phenomenon - neither is Speedwatch. Speeding continues to be a concern for many communities in both rural and urban environments. Therefore, Community Speedwatch is not restricted to villages and rural towns. Neighbourhood Policing Panels have an important role to play in developing safer urban communities and the adoption of speedwatch schemes could assist them to more easily achieve their goals. Volunteers receive appropriate training, and are supported by neighbourhood policing team (NPT) staff. The scheme aims to cater for the problem of real or perceived speed related offending, and through partnership with the

community it is to be used in circumstances that are necessary, justifiable and proportionate in order to:

- Reduce death and injury on the roads
- Improve the quality of life for local communities

Reduce the speed of vehicles to the speed limit

Increase public awareness of inappropriate speed

Speedwatch activity is not about interfering with neighbours' behaviour; it is a proactive solution to improve the safety and quality of life for everyone in the community.
