



#### From the Vicarage

The other day someone showed me a photograph of a crucifix, and asked me what I made of it. Looking at it, I saw that the figure on the cross was not Jesus, but a gorilla. My first thought was that this might be someone's idea of a joke. But then a closer look revealed that the photograph had been taken in a church. It turned out to be part of an exhibition —an artist's way of pointing to the fact that suffering is not limited only to humans.

The beginning of March coincides with the beginning of Lent this year – the time that leads up to Easter, and the period when Christians think especially about the events that led up to Jesus' death on the cross. Put simply, the cross is not just about the suffering of one man long ago. All suffering is there, and God cares about it all.

At the combined service that we have on the last Sunday of each month, we have begun to offer to anyone who would like it, the opportunity to have others pray for them. Sometimes people ask for prayer for themselves, sometimes for others. Anybody can come. A glance at the Bible shows that people were always going to Jesus to ask for healing, and with our prayers we do the same. Does it make any difference? I have known people who have been prayed for and apparently got better. More often though, people seem to be given the strength just to keep going - which in itself might sometimes seem like a miracle. So whatever is going on in your life just now, why not give prayer a go? There can't be any harm in trying it, can there? **Brian**

Having had no meeting in January, the February committee meeting was busy. In January the committee held a lunch to thank the volunteers for all their help, as an acknowledgement of the important role the local community play in keeping their hall running. We do still need new volunteers of any age – please think of how many organisations would have to close, if more don't come forward to help keep the hall open. Commitment can be your intelligent input at the committee meeting, your ad hoc help with clearing the hall or in numerous other ways. We are planning a spring clear up, so if there is anything in the hall which belongs to your organisation please make sure it is put away properly. We try to avoid things being dumped in the hall but some things get in under the radar— who, and why, on earth would anyone leave a bedstead there?

The building control report for the new front entrance was briefly discussed and a meeting with the builder, will review the practicality of the work in terms of time and cost – and of doing some of the other maintenance works needed. The new entrance will meet new disabled access legislation as well as being drier than the current entrance.

The replacement stage floor should have been completed by now – apologies to all the hirers who were disturbed by the work, however we are sure everyone understands the importance of keeping the hall safe. Talking of which, the static electrical installation checks have been done and a small number of remedial work is to be done. Quotes have been received for replacing the damaged worktop in the kitchen and window sill in the small hall. It will be quite an art finding time to do the kitchen worktop. If you notice anything which needs repairing, please write it in the comments book in the kitchen.

Thanks to grants from Dover District and Affinity Water, an automatic door has been installed to the disabled toilet. It's even been redecorated (thanks Jenny) in a unique colour. We got off to a bad start with the door when it was mysteriously re-programmed but this has now been dealt with. If 'three old ladies (or anyone) got stuck in the lavatory', instructions for release are inside and outside just by the control panels. The key is on a chain, so there is no reason for it accidentally going home with someone. If there are any other problems please ring one of the Trustees, details in the back of Grapevine.

When hiring fees were reviewed last year, they were not increased. Whilst we try to keep them low, and local residents get a discounted price, they were quite complex. The committee have simplified them and the new fees will apply from September 2017. Letters to clubs and organisations are being sent.

February saw the last boot fair for Capel le Ferne Village Hall – until someone volunteers to run it. Maybe your organisation would like to arrange one as a fundraiser for your club/charity? A huge thank you to Sylvia for all her work, as well as the kitchen team, (their bacon rolls will be sadly missed) and the gentlemen who put tables up and then down. On a brighter note, the Samaritans are learning the ropes with a view to running them from October.

Our new Trustee has already proven his value – he has descaled the water boiler and now has the instruction manual. If there are any problems, rather than trying to solve them yourself, please write them in the book.

We now have information on how we can legally screen films for local residents. We just need to know how many people are interested. It could be you ... let a trustee know.

If you have been inconvenienced now that the mobile library has reduced the number of days and the locations that it calls in Capel remember, the village hall has a wide range of books – and jigsaws - available for a donation. (The money raised is used for maintenance, which you can see we need regularly). We are grateful for all the books and puzzles which are given to us. People are extremely generous; the books are regularly tidied and sorted, any which stay on the trolleys for too long, are weeded and taken to charity shops, including the Pilgrim's Hospice Books shop, British Heart Foundation, Cancer Research, Oxfam, Scope and Mind. So none of them go to waste and they help keep the hall running.

#### **News from the Farmers' Market**



At last spring is in the air, though the winter hasn't been too bad, all things considered. January and February are quiet months and as the weather improves so more people come to the market, whether as customers or stall holders.

We have a new nursery man – Howard. When the weather was at its coldest, the plants got frost bite, but with the arrival of spring his stock is ready for sale. Time to look at what new plants will give the garden a lift, or something to brighten up indoors.

How much do you know about organic produce? For most people it is about not using pesticides and chemicals in growing or grazing. However to get the organic mark can take several years and requires an annual registration, which potentially increases the cost of the produce. A chat with our stallholders will give you much more information.

Our vegetable man, Paul, uses organic principles on his farm and when you buy local produce from him you know it has been grown in Kent. Identifying his produce is a little more difficult because he goes to Covent Garden before the market so that his customers have the range of fruit/vegetables the modern family expect to see. Talk to him about his farming methods and the organic label.

As summer approaches we can begin to think about the soft fruit season – and mouth-watering strawberries and raspberries from Kevin. In the meantime he has plenty of his apples and pears – available individually, by the bag or mix and match.

Alternate weeks are specialty week – fresh fish from Boy Callum, Italian farmers' treats. The cakes ladies alternate, increasing the delicacies to tempt you. Check with Carol or Barbara to confirm you can freeze them – slice and freeze then in portions.

Ready meals can be found on PJs treat stall, liver bacon and onion, cauliflower cheese and plenty of other meals to just pop in the oven after a busy day or when you're just too tired to cook. Farthingloe Farm will offer meat pies — many regulars but one, cut it in three and freeze two portions. Their sweet treats vary from week to week but include buns, doughnuts and cream slices.

With the improving weather, thoughts turn to salads and outdoor eating. Plenty of choice in the market – smoked salmon, scotch eggs, sausage rolls, cheeses and breads to tickle the appetite. Then there's the weekly Farmers Market Draw, entry is only 50p and all takings go out to winning numbers. Just inside the door.

A postal service can be found in the small hall. The stall holders and stock change from time to time, so it is always worth popping in to see if there is anything of interest.

## Summary of some items discussed at meetings on Tuesday, 21<sup>st</sup> February 2017



• Requests from public to address the Council, Surgery and Other Feedback: Lack of cats eyes on B2011, provision of disabled access on Old Dover Road clifftop to benches. • Neighbourhood Watch: Community Warden continues to investigate any incidents reported. Removal of concrete base for flag pole at St Radigund's Church to be monitored. "Capel Cares" progressing with volunteers waiting DBS Checks. Notification of items of interest can be obtained via NHW scheme emails and Facebook page. • Equipment status report: Vegetation removed from surrounds of the MUGA and a broken down tree from the BMX Trail. Reinstatement of markings on the MUGA and refurbishment of football area goal posts to be investigated on costs. • Highways and Public Rights of Way: Councillors continue to lobby Kent Highways on the relocation of the 40mph speed limit zone on B2011 and the 20mph on Old Dover Road in view of the impending new development of 40 new houses. Cracks on B2011 reported to Kent Highways, also the replacement of the chevrons at Courtwood Roundabout. Speeding around the village of great concern to Councillors and the reinstatement of the SpeedWatch Scheme (see below), hopefully will help make drivers aware and slow down. Parking on grass verges (see page 9). • Planning: Land South of New Dover Road (Jarvis Homes) - Work to commence in March and estimated to take two years to completion. Street name to be consulted on with Developers and Dover District Council – Councillors request to be in keeping with the "royal" theme in the village. Land North of New Dover Road (Quinn Estates) - waiting Dover District Council Planning Committee meeting date when this will be discussed and decision made. Councillors would appreciate, if as many residents as possible could attend this. Land 107-127 Capel Street - Closing date for comments 10th March (see front page). • Other: Commemorative bench, further waste bins, donations to organisations, use of Village Hall old post office room and Wi-Fi, are some of the other items being considered by Councillors.

Andrew will then be contacting you, by organising a rota of sessions accordingly.

Kent County Council is looking into the feasibility of a number of small lorry parks across the county to help alleviate illegal lorry parking. The new parks would be run as a private and public partnership. KCC will work closely with the private sector to identify what funding options exist to deliver the sites. Leader of Kent County Council Paul Carter said "We are taking action to find a solution to the widespread problem of illegal lorry parking in Kent. These illegally parked lorries are a blight on the county, antisocial and dangerous. I believe a series of intelligently placed small lorry parks would alleviate this problem and, if we put these plans in place and drivers have somewhere safe and secure to park overnight, I am confident the police will support the plans by imposing tough enforcements on lorries parking in unauthorised places." It comes as KCC launches a consultation into overnight lorry parking, preventing lorries going along rural roads and minimising their impact on local communities. The Freight Action Plan sets out five ongoing actions for managing freight through. The five priorities are:

- To tackle the problem of overnight lorry parking in Kent
- To find a long term solution to Operation Stack
- To effectively manage the routing of HGV traffic to ensure it stays on the strategic road network for as much of its journey as possible
- To take steps to address the problems caused by freight traffic to communities
- To ensure that KCC continues to make effective use of planning and development control powers to reduce the impact of freight traffic

KCC has already successfully delivered a number of initiatives to mitigate the impact of freight traffic through the county. This includes lobbying government to achieve £250 million of funding for a permanent lorry holding area as a solution to Operation Stack The demand for overnight parking is growing as the volume of cross-Channel freight increases.






