At university one Wednesday morning, I found myself with a few moments before my next lecture, and decided to grab a coffee. Beside the till in the coffee shop was a plateful of muffins – carrot cake muffins, no less, irresistible to Yours Truly. Moments later I sat contemplating the muffin that felt as though it had been destined for my tummy since the beginning of time itself, and recalled a conversation that had ended with the words, "You'll be there, Brian – there will be cake!" I wondered – could I really be addicted to cake? If so, what else could I be addicted to?

Fast forward to the same coffee shop one week later, with more muffins on show – but this Wednesday was Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, and this time I did manage to resist temptation and make do with just the coffee.

The forty days of Lent recall the stories from the gospels of Jesus fasting in the wilderness and resisting temptation in preparation for what was to follow. The Village Hall Committee would like to thank all those who gave up their January booking to facilitate Jay's funeral. We apologise for the inconvenience and hope you understood the desire to accommodate what was virtually his last wish. The Committee offers condolences to Kellie and family. The hall is in use from 8.00am until 10.30pm every week day and regularly on Saturdays and Sundays, so making time for extra-ordinary events is challenging. We are extremely lucky that there are so many organisations offering a wide variety of leisure activities. For people moving to the village, these offer ample opportunity to meet others with similar interests. The Committee takes its role in being a community service seriously and tries to organise events that residents will enjoy and want to support. These events have the added benefit of raising funds for the maintenance and improvements to the hall. Day to day running costs are only just covered by the hiring fees; last year the income from rent exceeded these running costs by less than £200. The Committee aims to keep hiring fees as low as possible and all residents automatically get a discount. We hope you will help by supporting the additional events organised for the community to enjoy.

This month's meeting was a busy one, reviewing what activities the Committee can organise for the community to enjoy. Some ideas became more complicated because of bureaucracy and current legislation. We are researching what can be done without bogging ourselves down in reams of red tape. To help, we urgently need volunteers, if you can help please let one of the trustees know. On a more positive note there will be:

- The Railway Swing Band on 9th May. (Page 9). This popular 40+ band consists of semi-professional, ex-professional and serious amateur musicians. It was first formed at the Railway Hotel in Walmer, hence the name. The reward for the musicians is making music and giving pleasure to audiences whilst raising money for charities. The Valiant Sailor has kindly offered to sponsor the event.
- New Age Kurling events; the one in February proved popular.
- The return of the Craft Fair on 10th November. (Page 13)
- There is potential for another concert.
- New Years' Eve with Chicory Tip. Feedback is that this is a popular event, so book your ticket early -talk to Jenny Carter or Jayne Stone – numbers on the inside back page (page 15). The format will be the same as last year and more information will be given soon. The help given last year in clearing up after was very much appreciated, thank you.

Storage has occupied the minds of the Committee and at last a practical solution has been agreed. Priority is being given to those organisations who use the hall at least monthly. Preparatory work is in hand, the flooring, cracked window and window sill will be replaced and the room repainted. Once this is completed, work will begin on placing cabinets. We will of course liaise with organisations directly about the move.

Capel le Ferne's Farmers' Market has a reputation for being more than just a food outlet. It is also a community event with refreshments served and time to catch up with friends (whether known for some time or newly met). There is news of what's going on in the village, a chance to meet Andy Hawkins -the Community Warden and, once a month, the Parish Council are in attendance.

In the foyer are plenty of books to suit most tastes and a variety of jigsaw puzzles. These are given by residents and the donations given by those who see something they'd like to take home to read, go towards the upkeep of the hall. This benefits residents twice, firstly offering reading material at a reasonable cost and secondly helping maintain the hall. Excess books, or those left on the shelves too long, are taken to charity shops, so donations are not wasted – huge thank you to those who bring and/or buy.

The community aspect of the Farmers' Market is seldom emphasised; articles usually refer to the quality, freshness or range of produce. The chance to meet neighbours, or to have an objective for leaving the house is invaluable to many residents. For the stall holders the market is hard work, not only running the farms, but loading and unloading the crates to bring produce to the market. The short supply chain and small travel distance ensure fresh produce and competitive prices, compared with the more established supermarkets. Stall holders really appreciate the chance to talk to their customers.

Shoppers can give feedback directly to the producers, leading to a better relationship and an opportunity to influence what produce is brought to the market for your delectation. Much of what is on the tables in the Village Hall has been asked for by residents; conversely stall holders can trial products and get feedback straight from the end users.

The majority of produce is seasonal – game has been popular, though the season is coming to an end. Items on Sue's fish stall are as fresh as possible – Doug is a local fisherman and what is on the stall is dependent on what he has caught overnight. Timing is so tight it is hard to advertise in advance what seafood will be at the market, but Sue aims to be there fortnightly. We are heading up to the fruit season – for jam makers now is the time to talk to Kevin about when his soft fruits will be available.

Talking of 'seasonal', Easter is at the end of March – an Easter Egg hunt for children (of any age!) is being organised – more details will be given nearer the time.

For the benefit of residents, Audrey and Sally offer a postal service – buy stamps, arrange to post parcels or ask for help. They are always happy to oblige. You'll find them in the small hall with the crafters. Here handmade items are on sale, either stock items or order personalised items. Cards are always available for when you realise you've forgotten a birthday or suddenly need a sympathy card.

This month's recipe uses Sherley's Farm eggs and Mike Vines' smoked salmon and is just the thing to brighten up Sunday morning breakfast as we head up towards spring, or even an Easter Sunday breakfast. Complement it with bread and butter, both available from the market.

Make some toast and butter generously. Cut the salmon into strips. Melt a little butter into a pan – non-stick will make cleaning up easier – I use my frying pan, with a lowish heat. To high and the eggs will set too hard, too low and they will barely set. Break 3 eggs per two people, whisk with a fork and season with salt and pepper. Pour the mixture into the pan and keep stirring while the egg starts to set. People like their scrambled eggs at different consistencies; just before the consistency you like, remove from the heat – the eggs will carry on cooking for a few minutes. When set to your taste, pop the eggs onto the toast, cover with salmon strips and serve.

CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of some items discussed



• Requests from public to address the Council, plus Surgery and Other Feedback: Presentation received on development scheme for consideration to provide housing for the elderly.

Defibrillator: Now received and waiting installation. An open demonstration meeting to be considered.

Traffic Management: On initial response viewed from questionnaires, Councillors were informed that the subject of traffic management in our village was noticeably a concern to residents. Councillors to meet with Kent Highway representative to discuss further.

Planning: Several applications and their status reported – full details available on Dover District Council website: https://www.dover.gov.uk Planning >Planning >Planning > View-Applications > Decisions

DDC Review of Local Plan: Questionnaires have been coming in and will form an important and essential part of a response to the DDC Review when it enters the consultation stage. • Neighbourhood Watch: Cleaning of street furniture being investigated further. Dog Warden services to be contacted for attendance in various areas of village suffering dog fouling. Litter Clearing Days and a Community Information Day being investigated further by Community Warden. Speed Watch: Several sessions had been held by the volunteers and a report was presented to the members. Further volunteers and more training being considered. Capel Cares: Access to bus services and facilities locally in Folkestone raised as a concern and would be addressed to attempt some improvement.

• Recreation Equipment: Zip-wire now repaired and back in use; Petanque Court drainage - Capel Groundworks to be requested to inspect. • Highways: Several items reported; Repeater sign on B2011 missing, Courtwood slip road signage, parking on grass verges – all to be reported to Kent Highways. KCC Traffic Order from bottom of Dover Hill to Battle of Britain site for a speed reduction to 50mph was read and Councillors to respond accordingly to the effect that 40mph would be preferred. • Public Rights of Way: Depending on analysis of Village Questionnaires, Councillors will address comments made with Kent County Council. • Other: Commemorative Event - 100 years of the end of the First World War, being contemplated.

WARNING ... BURGLARIES IN CAPEL-LE-FERNE. ADVICE FROM KENT POLICE TO SECURE YOUR HOME

· Lock doors and windows when you go out or work in the garden – if you have uPVC windows or doors then double-lock them with the keys to secure them properly. · Never leave keys or valuables on display near windows or doors. · Avoid keeping large amounts of cash at home. · Photograph and security mark valuable items and keep receipts somewhere safe. · Consider installing a good quality safe to the appropriate British/European standard. · Safes should be bolted to a solid wall or floor and concealed, for example in a cupboard or fitted wardrobe. For information on safes visit www.securedbydesign.com · Consider fitting intruder alarms, door chains, a spy hole and external lights. · Don't open the door to unexpected callers – use a door chain and check their identity first. · If an offer seems too good, it probably is – don't part with your money unless you are sure the source is genuine. · Dispose of packaging carefully – wrapping and boxes for expensive items can advertise rich pickings for criminals.

Public Health England (PHE) will be working with dental teams in the South East to give sugar the brush off and help parents change the snacks they give their children. PHE's Change4Life campaign advises families to *look for 100 calorie snacks*, 2 a day max, after research showed children were eating nearly three times the recommended amount of sugar; with half coming from snacks and sugary drinks. Too much sugar not only leads to weight gain and obesity but also dental decay. In East Sussex, 20.3% of five-year-olds have decayed, missing or filled teeth. In West Sussex this figure is 17.5%, in Surrey 18.7%, in Medway 18.4% and in **Kent 16.2%**. This works out to be an average of 17.9% in the South East area. To help fill in the gaps of people's sugar-busting knowledge, PHE is working with dental teams from the region to promote the Change4Life public health campaign, particularly around reducing sugar. PHE has developed the Top Tips for Teeth dental toolkit to support dental teams with their advice to parents who come into their surgeries about the best ways to prevent tooth decay in children. The most important advice is:

- reduce sugar
- Brush twice a day with a fluoride toothpaste
- get regular dental checks from an early age

Being sugar smart – swapping sugar based food and drinks for healthier food and drink choices – is a vital step in the fight against cavities. Another is to visit the dentist regularly and recommend parents bring their children in from the moment their teeth start coming through – so around six months. Regular visits after that will help dental teams to work with parents to maintain their children's teeth healthy. Much of what has been stated may seem like common sense – but by brushing up on these messages hopefully this will get parents and kids thinking about how to improve their dental health. It is important to make it a priority and introduce good teeth brushing and eating habits early – after which they will hopefully last a lifetime. Kent County Council's Public Health department uses surveys by Public Health England, alongside mapping of current dental health promotion activity and dental outcomes, to examine what works in terms of best practice and interventions to improve dental and oral health. KCC Deputy Director of Public Health, Allison Duggal said: "Improving oral and dental health continues to be important for Kent as it is nationally. We support Public Health England campaigns to tackle healthy lifestyles among children such as Change4Life, Sugar Swaps and the 10 Minute shake up. We would encourage parents to consider how much sugar is in their children's diet and cutback where necessary. We also support and advise regular dental check-ups, these should start as soon as first milk teeth appear." If you encounter pot holes in the road in the area where you live or in fact anywhere in Kent don't wait to report it to your parish councillor the next time you meet them, or just ignore it, operating on the prospect someone else will do it, for KCC Highways Department needs "the finder" to report it, just in case they need to contact the informant for additional information, which a third party may not be able to provide. It also eliminates the risk of information being passed on by a third party being misunderstood regarding location, size, depth of pothole etc. To report a highways defect is straight forward, just go to





Report dangerous or illegal parking



Inconsiderate parking is a stressful part of everyday life for us all.

Unfortunately in and around Capel-le-Ferne at the moment we are seeing a lot more of it than we use to, and we need to be aware of how and where we park and problems it may cause to others.

We appreciate that some roads in the area are quite narrow and need to ensure that when parking on the road, there is enough space for other vehicles to pass safely – especially in the case of emergency vehicles, but we also need to leave enough room on footpaths for those who need to pass with pushchairs, wheelchairs and mobility scooters.


