We were asked recently what we did at the village hall meetings. It's a good question. These tend to follow a pattern as certain things get discussed every month. Maintenance, communications, finance including lettings, and fundraising activities all have a regular spot on the agenda. Also each trustee has the opportunity to raise any particular issue particularly if he/she represents 'as many representatives as are necessary to cover the various organisations in the Parish of Capel-le-Ferne' – the last a direct quote from the trust deed and constitution that governs the actions of the committee of which there are currently eleven trustees. Matters arising tends to take up most of the evening's debate. Currently under discussion are the forthcoming village fete, the changeover affecting the Farmers Market and the painting of the main hall. The village fete is also being managed at sub-committee level as everybody on the committee has volunteered to either organise or take part in it. This means that we are currently holding two meetings a month. The trustees also communicate widely by email and phone between the meetings. The Farmers Market has had a successful handover and is looking forward to better weather where the outside stalls can start to shine. The community café is still going strong and Ruby and her teams of willing volunteers are kept busy with the demand for teas, coffees and the odd toasted teacake. The painting of the village hall has been arranged although we are waiting to hear about some possible funding before we arrange a date and make final arrangements with hall users.

Thanks to all those who contributed. And while on the subject again a huge thank you to all our volunteers without whose hard work the hall couldn't function. Whether it's taking stuff to the tip, putting out (and back) tables and chairs for the café and helping stallholders at the Farmers Market, sorting out books, meeting people to discuss maintenance, insurance or letting out tables or just generally helping out, your help is greatly appreciated. Occasionally we have guests to the meetings like the St Johns Ambulance who spoke to us on defibrillators or residents who have an interest in a particular item. They obviously don't have voting powers in whatever is under discussion but often have excellent points to raise. We do need to know of intentions to attend, however. So in general the meetings tend to be quite busy and can go on for a while depending on whether we get side tracked by sudden ideas and new brainwaves. Meetings are minuted as per the constitution. We welcome any input from residents on issues and are happy to feed these into the committee details of trustees can be found on the contacts page. From the vicarage

On Sunday mornings at the church where I served as a curate a small group of familiar faces would gather in one corner, just as the service began. Mumbling their way through the hymns and hardly ever going forward for communion, or even a blessing, they knew that after the service everyone stayed on for coffee and biscuits. They always chose the nearest corner to the coffee urn, and as the last chords of the final hymn died away the biscuits would start to disappear.

Jesus once compared God to someone who, his invitations to a banquet having all been turned down by those for whom they were intended, then told his servants to bring in anyone they found on the streets or in the hedgerows. For me, that small group always brought that parable to life – here were not just characters in a story, but real people from the streets and hedgerows for whom free church coffee and biscuits might easily have been breakfast.

As I write, Easter is still a week away and once again, in church, we are thinking of what led up to Jesus' crucifixion and that first Easter, and the parts played by those whom Jesus chose as his friends in what happened. They were not just characters in a story, but real people who, just like us, could get things wrong, fall out with each other and maybe even turn their backs on a friend at the worst possible time.

But Easter is about new beginnings. Convinced that he was risen from the dead, those same friends set about spreading the news that people still talk about today. It reminds Christians, that God isn't defeated by our failings, and doesn't give up on us either. **Brian**

 <u>Neighbourhood Watch</u>: Field in Old Dover Road (Folkestone end) investigation to be made of owners regarding fence. No crimes reported from Kent Police. Reply to Dover District Kent Police to be sent on PCSO duties. Investigations underway on offender's wood work available. 1st Aid sponsorship by Parish Council agreed to be offered to Primary School children. Village clean-up to be organised by Community Warden for May-June.

• <u>Recreation and Other Equipment</u>: Renovation to Multi Use Games Area and Refurbishment to Zip-Wire now completed.

• <u>Highways</u>: Parking on grass verges, damaging surface, a cause for concern along B2011. Reinstatement of ground works continues where Affinity Water have been working.

• <u>Public Rights of Way</u>: Seasonal cut back of overgrown vegetation on PROWs will be undertaken late June/early July. Works to enhance Green Lane (ER252) progressing with cut back of overgrown vegetation, new edging and surface being installed. The Parish Council encourage you all to do the same, as this is in contravention of laws for using Bridleways; i.e. bridleways are for walking, horse riding, bicycles, mobility scooters or powered wheelchairs. Notification also sent to Kent County Council (Public Rights of Way). The more reports the Authorities receive, they may attend and enforce the law that a bridleway is not for motorised vehicles. Hopefully when bollards are installed, this may deter the perpetrators. Thank you for your assistance. <u>Capel-le-Ferne Parish Council</u> <u>Chairman's Report 2019</u>

The Dover District Council 2015 Local Plan continues to deliver new housing in Capel.

The new estate on land south of the New Dover Road formally known as 'Grasslands' is nearing completion and will be named George Close. The development at the junction of Capel Street and Winehouse Lane is also well underway. Plans for the Capel Street site in the Local Plan are currently being redrawn. Capel Parish Council would like to welcome the new residents to the village.

The Section 106 fund from the George Close development has been used by Dover District Council to improve the surface of the Bridle Path between New Dover Road and Capel Street, making access on foot easier to the Village Hall and the School.

Dover District Council has now embarked on a new Local Plan. The Plan will potentially bring more development to Capel. Land owners have come forward with plots of land to be considered for development. The plots of land in Capel will be displayed during a consultation period which is likely to be early in 2020. I would strongly advise Parishioners to get involved and voice your opinions to help shape Capel's future.

The Capel Community Plan was recently published and distributed. During the coming year the Parish Council will be acting on issues raised by Parishioners. High on the agenda is traffic calming throughout the Parish. During the next few months speed reminder roundels will be installed in Capel Street, New Dover Road and Old Dover Road. This project will be funded by the Parish Council because KCC Highways budget constraints mean they can only fund traffic calming projects in blackspot areas. The 40mph speed limit has recently been extended to the bottom of the hill at the Folkestone end of the village. We hope to see the 40 mph limit extended to Winehouse lane at the Dover end before 2020. The Parish Council have campaigned for the 40mph limit to be extended beyond the Royal Oak for a number of years but KCC Highways feel it unnecessary.

The Speedwatch Team have been very active during the year, the Parish Council would like to thank Roger Tapley for organising the monthly rotas.

New volunteers are always welcome.

Sadly, during recent months two former Councillors have passed away, both Mr Collin Blake and Mr Peter Woodsford were passionate about the Village and gave their time to help improve the community environment.

After 24 years of service our Ward Councillor, Frederick Scales is retiring from his position. Frederick has strongly supported and guided the Parish Council over many years and will be greatly missed. On behalf of the Council I would like to wish him every success in his future ventures.

I would like to thank KCC Councillor Geoff Lymer for his advice and support during the year.

I would also like to thank Chris, our Vice Chairman and all Councillors for their support, dedication, and hard work during the year.

On behalf of all Councillors I would like to thank the following: Maureen, our Clerk to the Council for her most valued work, Andrew Hawkins our Community Warden for his contribution in keeping our community safe and David Reed for his work keeping our village free of litter.

Finally, it is with regret that we say goodbye to Councillor Brian Tutt. Brian has served with the Parish Council for around 40 years; his departure will be a great loss to the Council.

Thank you everyone who attended our Annual Parish Meeting and Presentation evening, Tuesday, 15th April 2019. Presentations were made by Vice-Chairman of the Kent Association of Local Councils, Mr Christopher Woodley. The Kent Association of Local Councils Certificate Award is to acknowledge and give recognition to those that have made a significant contribution to their local community and was presented to Capel Cares Group and accepted by Janet Milliken. Long Term Service Awards and gifts of Garden Vouchers were presented to District/Ward Councillor Frederick Scales and Parish Councillor Brian Tutt. More than 2.6 million fully-indexed baptism, wedding banns, marriage and burial records spanning more than 400 years of Kent history are now available to search online exclusively.

By improving access to these rich documents and making them searchable for the first time, Find My Past will provide family historians from around the world with even more opportunities to discover their Kent based ancestors. Researchers can now uncover details of their families past and add new generations to their family tree with greater ease than ever before.

Today's release builds on an existing partnership between Find My Past and KCC Archives which already has resulted in the online publication of more than 2.5 million Canterbury Archdeaconry records held by the Canterbury Cathedral Archives. These new additions join Find My Past's Canterbury collection and existing collections of Kent Family History Society records to form the most comprehensive online repository of Kent parish registers in the word. Find My Past's UK Data Strategy Manager, Paul Nixon, said: "Now with more than 5 million indexed parish register entries for Kent, Find My Past really is the only show in town if your ancestors had put down roots in the Garden of England. We're thrilled to be working with the Kent History & Library Centre."

Mike Hill, KCC's Cabinet Member for Community and Regulatory Services, said: "We are delighted that the majority of the parish registers held by the Kent Archives service will now be available to view and search around the world for the first time, through the publication of images and indexes on Find My Past.
