

In the second of the historical AGM minutes those for 1980 are below. This is for the first AGM after the new (current) hall opened. Minutes of the AGM held on Tuesday 25th November 1980. The meeting was attended by 96 people. The minutes of the previous meeting were read, signed and approved.

The chairman gave a comprehensive account of the year's work, divided into the following categories:

- 1. **Membership of the committee**: The chairman outlined the provisions of the Scheme Governing the administration of the village hall by the Charity Commission and the appointment of officers. The attendance record of each committee member was given. Mr Finn would not be seeking re-election and was thanked for the work he undertook.
- 2. **Building of the new Village Hall**. An offer for the site of the old village hall had been received. The potential purchaser was invited to submit a quotation for construction of the new hall. Subsequently other quotations were sought. Shepway Building contractors responded with a lower quotation for the construction and a comparable offer for the land. The committee had therefore decided to accept the offer from and also award the contract to Shepway Building Contractors. Building work began on 22nd March 1980 and was ready for the Spectacular held on 19th July. The opening ceremony on 12th July was performed by Miss Samantha Washford and Miss Ethel Chadwick, representing the youngest and oldest residents of the village. On behalf of the committee the Chairman thanked all involved, particularly Mr L Clarke, the committee's architect, who generously gave his services free of charge.
- 3. **Budget and letting charges.** The committee anticipated the running costs to be higher in the new hall. However, rather than cause hardship to regular users of the hall it was agreed to raise the letting charges for weekend users.
- 4. **Fundraising activities**. A number of fundraising activities had been held raising the following sums of money Christmas dance-£47.89, Pantomime (Cinderella) -£310.68, Dance-£33, Grand National Draw £104, Jumble Sale £63.50, Dance £56,33, Dog Show £102.17, Spectacular Night Dance £125.89, Barn dance (run jointly with the scouts) £61.75, Firework night £4.25, House to house collection £587.30. Thanks were given to all involved. The chairman tendered grateful thanks to DDC for the donation of £1,000 towards the cost of furniture and to Capel le Ferne Parish Council for the donation of £500 towards the cost of curtains and heating.
- 5. **Capel Spectacular**. Despite the weather this has been successful and raised a net profit of £1,568.18. The chairman thanked all those involved in organising the day or running a stall.

A heartfelt vote of thanks and congratulations for all the work done by the committee during the year was received from Mr J Lawrence, Chairman of the Parish Council on behalf of himself, fellow councillors and inhabitants of the village.

The treasurer distributed copies of the balance sheets to those present and reported that excess income over expenditure amounted to £25,973.13. The increase of approximately £24,000 over the previous year was mostly due to holding the proceeds of sale of access land

A vote of thanks to the retiring committee was recorded and nominations for the new committee requested. There being 6 nominations the need for an election was dispensed with. The six elected to serve for the coming year were Mr C Smithern, Mr D Avery, Mrs A Holness, Mr B MacMillan, Mr N Perry, Mr J Whiting.

The Annual General Meeting of Capel Village Hall Committee will take place on Monday, 27th

November 2017 at 7pm in the small hall of the Village Hall. Voting will take place for the posts of Chair,

Vice-chair and General Secretary.




CAPEL-LE-FERNE FARMERS MARKET

He was amazed at how much the market is a community event and how many people in the village help out. (There's always room for more people to help if you would like to volunteer - many hands make light work). The market is so much more than just a farmers' market, the PCSO and community warden pop in and the parish council hold a monthly surgery there.

The market was started to provide a service to local residents and has continued to be a diary date for many. As well as an opportunity to buy high quality local produce, there is Ruby's Café, where many people meet to catch up on the gossip.

Space limitations meant that not all stall holders could be mentioned by name in Kent Life. Farthingloe Farm bake bread and pies especially for the market and Mike Vines works hard producing his artisan bread and delicatessen foods. He uses his smoker for the cheese and salmon on his stall. Mike has gained a name for his scotch/black pudding/haggis eggs.

Paul has a mixture of local produce as well as fruit and vegetables which he collects from Covent Garden early in the morning. His veg boxes are proving very popular and can be pre-ordered for collection or delivery after the market.

In addition to the ingredients for dinner/lunch, inside the hall there is a stall filled with ready meals. The ingredients come from local farms and if there are special dietary requirements just ask. For elderly resident, or those who just who want a day off from the kitchen, these are an absolute boon. For dessert or an afternoon treat fresh homemade cakes can be bought, either as whole cakes of in smaller slices. Alternatively, free range eggs from Derek go well with Debbie's bacon and sausages make for a quick and easy lunch or supper.

The day that Bruce visited, Rachel was running the postal service. Since then she has taken up full time employment and Sally Cook is keeping the service going. With Christmas in mind she has a healthy stock of stamps, so customers can start buying them a few at a time before Christmas. Rachel's hand stitched cards are still available for those looking for something a bit different at a reasonable price.

Talking of Christmas the craft stalls are in the small hall; well worth a visit if you're thinking of presents for Christmas. Many of the stall holders will take orders or personalise goods.

Details of Christmas arrangements will be in next month's Grapevine; stall holders will be taking orders from November.

If you did buy a copy of Kent Life there is a recipe for pheasant breast with lemon thyme and chilli. As soon as the season start Debbie has a range of game on her stall. The breasts are rubbed with lemon, chilli and fresh thyme before being grilled for 8-10 minutes, turning once. Lemon slices can be grilled as a simple garnish.

Data List of Accidents on B2011 updated. Information received of concerns raised on works at properties in village to be reported for investigation. Many concerns on fuel thefts • Traffic Management: Two (2) Parish Councillors and District Councillor Frederick Scales held a (see separate box below). meeting with Charlie Elphicke MP on the lack of consultation by Kent Highways to the Parish Councillors' request to relocate the speed limit zone on the B2011. Charlie Elphicke promised to write to KCC Cabinet Member for Planning, Highways, Transport and Waste, to arrange a meeting to discuss further. Police Data on traffic volume to be requested to compare with previous, now TAP works completed. • Planning: Full details of all applications discussed available in Minutes of Meeting. DDC Review of Local Plan: Questionnaire to be delivered to residents in December for completion. This will form the basis on a Local Plan for the Parish Council's future information and use. • Neighbourhood Watch: Halloween and Firework advice notification requested to be circulated for residents' information. Fuel Thefts for a second time reported to Community Warden and Kent Police (see separate box below). Capel Cares: Residents requiring help and assistance continues, with a social event maybe. Investigations being made on the viability of a community transport scheme. • Recreation Equipment: Still waiting for picnic tables and benches to be cleaned. Vandalised signs replaced. Maintenance to Zip-Line being carried out with replacement of rubber tyre and cable wire that was frayed due to wear and tear. • Highways: Following a Kent Highways seminar attended by two (2) Parish Councillors the following was reported; only potholes of 50mm deep being filled and a survey to be completed on Kent Highways Service. Affinity Water mains works continues on New Dover Road and Capel Street, with traffic diversion via Avondale Road and Lancaster Avenue. Meeting taking place to discuss the reinstatement of ground and daffodil bulbs. Snow Warden Registration and training offer received from • Public Rights of Way: Long standing clearance of PROW being chased. • Other: A £20 Donation to The Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal agreed. 11th November Remembrance Event (details on page 9). The provision of a Defibrillator in the Community being investigated further on cost and logistics – Councillors would welcome your views on this being purchased by the Council, please contact Parish Clerk.



FOR INFORMATION WHAT ARE THE RULES RELATING TO FIREWORKS?

Provided by the 'Ask the Police' website. Produced by the Police National Legal Database (PNLD) team, 'Ask the Police' is an official police site approved by the National Police Chiefs Council (NPCC).

It is an offence to:

• possess adult fireworks (all fireworks except party poppers and sparklers) in a public place by anyone under the age of 18;
• possess category 4 fireworks (professional display fireworks) by anyone other than a fireworks professional; • it is illegal to supply adult fireworks to those under 18; • throw or cast or fire any firework in or into any highway, street, thoroughfare or public space (this would include throwing or firing from a private place into a public place, street, highway etc); • to discharge any firearm or firework (without lawful authority or excuse) within 50 feet of the centre of a highway which consists of or comprises a carriageway.

There is a curfew on the use of adult fireworks between 11pm and 7am, except on;

- Bonfire night (when the curfew is between 12midnight and 7am); New Year's Eve (when the curfew is between 1am and 7am);
- Chinese New Year (when the curfew is between 1am and 7am); Diwali night (when the curfew is between 1am and 7am).

The penalties for using fireworks outside the hours of 7am and 11pm are imprisonment (maximum 6 months) and a substantial fine. Please note, you could also commit offences if they were being used to cause a nuisance.

ANIMALS ARE REALLY AFRAID OF FIREWORKS.

The best thing to do is to keep the animal indoors with the windows closed. Also try to keep the TV on, or music playing to perhaps muffle the sound of the fireworks. Animals have better hearing than humans do and for them fireworks are extremely loud and scary. There are some products that vets may be able to offer to help keep your animals calm. If at all possible try and make sure someone is at home with the animal as it will be comforting to have a familiar face around.



NOTE FROM LOCAL FARMER

This is for information and a reminder!
Report received by Editor on vandalism to fencing on the field (behind the school), to gain access from Green Lane, that there is a Public Right of Way entrance at the far corner of the Playing Field and across this Farmer's Field to Winehouse Lane. 


