November sees the Village Hall Annual Meeting, open to all in the village so it may be interesting to see the minutes of two keys years in the history of the hall. In 1979 planning for the new (current) hall was the key topic and in 1980 the new hall was opened. A little of the background is contained in these two sets of minutes, as well as an indication of how things have changed over the years. 22nd November 1979: forty one people attended and the minutes of the previous year were read, approved and signed. The chairman's report covered:

- 1. Membership of the committee. The chairman outlined the provisions of the scheme governing the administration of the village hall by the Charity Commission (recorded in the conveyancing document and updated in recent years when the Charity Commission regulations changed) and the appointment of officers.
- 2. Budget and letting charges. The budget for the forthcoming year showed a deficit so it was decided that to increase hiring fees. Several organisations expressed fears of hardship so it as agreed fees would increase for weekend hirings and the deficit would be covered by fundraising activities.
- 3. Fundraising activities. Details were (*remember these are pre-decimalisation*) American suppers £121.30 & £65.62, Grand National Draw £149.45; donations from playschool £20, scouts £45.12 & sports day £2.
- 4. The Capel Spectacular (*forerunner to the village event on the green*). This made a profit of £1,163.88. All involved were thanked.
- 5. Cleaning. Thanks were given to Mr Johnson and Mrs Minnis
- 6. Newsletter. This had been introduced by the committee during the year to keep residents fully informed of developments affecting the hall. Thanks were given to advertisers for helping the publications to be self-supporting, and to those who assisted during the year with distribution.
- 7. Sale of access land. Sale of this had raised £20,000 and transfer of a piece of land.
- 8. Purchase of site on Lancaster Ave playing field.at a public meeting on 22 May 1979 the committee received full support for the purchase of a piece of land from Dover District Council and Parish Council for the sum of £750
- 9. Sale of remaining land. The chairman outlined an offer received for land behind the (old) village hall. It was proposed and seconded that the offer be accepted and unanimously agreed by those present.
- 10. New village hall. Mr L Clark was in preparing detailed drawings for the proposed new Village Hall, prior to display for residents and application for planning permission. This was unanimously agreed.

The treasurer reported an excess of income over expenditure of £1,734.27 and a balance in hand of £4,893.94.

A vote of thanks was recorded for the retiring committee and the new committee.

Seven nominations were received for the new committee. Those elected were

Mr C Smithern - 41 votes, Mr N Perry - 41 votes, Mr J Whiting -36 votes, Mrs G Brooks - 35 votes, Mrs A Holness - 32 votes, Mr S Finn - 31 votes.

In 1978 100 people attended the Annual General Meeting. Excess of income over expenditure was £198.80. 13 nominations were received for the committee.



<u>'Kent's libraries and archives –</u> <u>discover something new</u>

The first National Libraries Week takes place from Monday to Saturday, 9-14 October and Kent's libraries will be celebrating in style with a host of activities for all the family to enjoy.

The county has 99 libraries and this dedicated week provides a great opportunity to show many of the services that residents might not know about. There is no charge for joining your local library and most activities are also completely free. From Baby Rhyme Time to Talk Time, author talks, exhibitions and the chance to explore Kent's rich Archive collections.

Libraries have activities to suit everyone, including reading groups for the visually impaired, the hard of hearing and adults with learning disabilities.

Library visitors can even have sessions to learn more about computers, get help with job searches and applications, and take part in a range of other social activities plus opportunities to gain knowledge and discover something new.

They also offer a range of free online services - so if you are unable to get to a library, the library can come to you. You can log into <u>kent.gov.uk/libs</u> or download the library app to access free online magazines, audio books, and e-books. You can also use the online catalogue to search and reserve books, DVDs and CDs for free.

Mike Hill, KCC's Cabinet Member for Community and Regulatory Services, said: "We are very proud of our library service and want to ensure that as many people as possible are inspired to visit a library, discover what is on offer and encourage their friends and family to get involved.

"Although we promote our libraries, their facilities and events all year round, National Libraries Week is an opportunity to focus on the service and promote them more widely to residents who may not appreciate everything they have to offer."





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

On-road 40mph roundel signage being investigated with Kent County Council and Highways, together with other ways to help make the B2011 a safer road, by educating and encouraging drivers to keep to the speed limit. Issues with 20mph signs in Capel Street and no "repeater signs" at junctions - enquiries to be made with Kent Highways on this. • Planning: Land North of New Dover Road and Land between 107-127 Capel Street – Both sites refused Planning Application by Dover District Council. DDC Review of Local Plan: Working Party of Councillors arranged to discuss a village questionnaire and ways forward to respond to District Local Review of Land Allocation Plan. • Neighbourhood Watch: Concerns expressed over recent fuel thefts, which had been reported to Police. Overgrown hedge in Capel Street and dirty street signs reported to Kent Highways for cleaning. Capel Cares: 14 trained volunteers now available to assist local residents in need of help, with some regular visits now set up and taking place. Tel: Jan Milliken (01303 257003), for more information. • Highways: Tidy of areas at Courtwood Roundabout to be investigated. Chevron signs at Courtwood Roundabout missing and reported to Kent Highways. Noted, postponement of Affinity Water works in Old Dover Road. • Public Rights of Way: Coastal pathway has been tidied by KCC, although area in vicinity of Eagles Nest still requires more attention. Other Public Rights of Ways that received some clearance and was noted, i.e. Old Dover Road to New Dover Road and Alexandra Road to Lancaster Avenue. • Other: Repairs to Zip-wire with replacement of tyre buffer agreed. Tidy of Memorial area to be undertaken with more gravel being supplied also agreed. Broken signs to Skate-park to be replaced. Clerks' Conference attended and several items were noted, including the provision of Defibrillators in rural communities, which would be discussed further at next meeting. Insurance to be checked regarding claims on Traveller access. Donation to Royal British Legion to be discussed at next meeting. New post-box Helena Road/New Dover Road now in situ following its disappearance.




