

Research shows that the more severe the consequences, the less likely people are to admit their failings or learn from them. I learned that as a student. When I started teaching discovered that it was true. In those days the thick ear was still part of a teacher's essential toolkit in many schools. Not surprisingly, many pupils quickly learned how to avoid getting caught, how to deny everything when cornered, and how to blame someone else. Lessons learned in childhood are taken into adulthood, which explains why many of us go through life covering our backs and blaming others when things go wrong. So with an election looming, spare a thought for bankers, teachers, social workers, health care professionals and all others whose failings someone – not having read the research - will no doubt be pledging to tackle yet again.

However, Easter is also looming. As April begins, Christians remember the failings of Jesus' disciples who either denied him or ran away when he needed them most. Yet incredibly, he appeared to these same people that first Easter and sent them to tell others about what had happened. Forgiven, and with the chance to start again, they continued what he had started.

"Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you," wrote one of Jesus' followers to the church at Ephesus. I'm blessed by the kindness of my congregations who, bless them, forgive me and my failings, and let me start again. **Happy Easter!**Brian

Capel has an active community and the village hall is well used, whether by preschool or Farmers' Market in the morning or by the various organisations who meet for sports or leisure activities. Details of these are in the hall. Some, like short mat bowls, meet several times a week, others, like the pantomime or bird show are annual events.

There is some capacity for private hiring's so, if you would like to organise a party come and have a look round, there are two halls, which can be hired separately or together.

The main hall has plenty of tables and chairs and there is still space for dancing or running round. A PA system means you can hear the music or speaker if you have one – we are happy to show people how to use it. There is a stage with curtains – you could use this for the disco, band, speaker or you could put some chairs there so adults can sit and watch the children run around on the main floor. For AV events there is an electrically driven projection screen, whilst for that very special party there is a net to let release balloons.

The small hall is perfect for more intimate groups or meetings, or can be used as the chill out space or food/drink service area.

Both halls have use of the kitchen – including instant boiling water (capacity up to 100 cups in 15 minutes) and plenty of china, mugs and cups. A separate hand washing sink complies with Food Hygiene Regulations. The electrically operated shutter allows you to close the kitchen off so your guest can party on while the washer uppers tidy up.

Hire either or both halls, depending on how much space you need. Licenced for most things (except hypnosis and boxing) including sale of alcohol, PRS, raffles. If you would like to start a new club or activity then talk to the letting secretary about when a regular booking can be made.

If you plan to have your party at home tables and chairs can be hired form the hall. £2 or 50p respectively. Contact Jayne on 01303 211480.

The boot fair season has drawn to a close – a big thank you to Sylvia and the kitchen team for all their work – the monies raised will be used to maintain and use the hall. Before the boot fairs recommence there will be the Garage Safari Day – organisation lead by Cherry Leppard. The date for the craft fair is 14th November and Chicory Tip is returning for News Year Eve. More details later.

The committee meeting was lengthier than usual this month - - the main topic was consideration of potential improvements and their practicality. Replacement of the lights remains top priority – we are looking for something that lights the hall well enough for people to see the fiendish picture round during quizzes, doesn't cast shadows for the badminton players and can be dimmed for parties and dances. They also need to be easy to maintain.

Many people are aware of the problems when it rains hard. We are investigating how this can be remedied. We want to take the opportunity to improve access to and the appearance of the main entrance to the hall. Possible solutions identified to date are proving to be a bit expensive so we need to be absolutely clear of all the potential benefits and losses before proceeding. At present this is just an idea at a very early stage and, if we decide to proceed, it could be several years before work is completed. If you have any views one way or another, please let us know.

The need to purchase additional chairs is also on the list of things which may be needed this year.

There has been an approach by a business to use the car park for a mobile hot/cold food. Regrettably it has proved difficult to accommodate this without causing inconvenience to hall users. The business is applying to DDC for a street traders licence so they will be able to look at alternative locations in the village.

There was a final report on the potential mobile cinema. The committee would comply with legislation and licencing. To pay these and to purchase/hire the equipment (including films) would cost several thousand pounds so the price to viewers would be high. A cinema is planned in the Dover re-development. In view of all this it was agreed to not progress the idea.







• Request from the public to address the Council: None received • Equipment status report — Due to incorrect parts being sent by manufactures, the refurbishments of the climbing frame have been delayed. Renovations to other equipment will continue. Fencing to Petanque Court and Memorial will start week beginning 6th April. • Crime Reports (PCSO Gretel May)/Neighbourhood Watch — Vandalism to Bus Shelter and telephone box on B2011 and reported for repair. • Traffic/Road Improvements, Highways & Public Rights of Way — Reports received from Cllr: Tutt/Cllr: Hale on; closure of Old Dover Road for highway work, reinstatement of grass verges following gas mains installation works on-going, weight limit sign junction Old/New Dover Road awaiting Kent Highways attention, Green Lane footpath awaiting Kent PROW attention. Items discussed and waiting further investigation; horse fouling on bridleways, bridleway deep trenches adjacent to farmers' land, footpath Cauldham Close/Lane to Capel Street and trees in Green Lane behind Elizabeth Drive. • Other items discussed — Awaiting decision from Dover District Council on installation of new waste bins around village and lighting at Playing Field. Speed-Watch Scheme encountered problems with inoperative equipment. Traffic flow system for Garage Safari/Classic Car Show events on 6th September under-going further investigation by District Cllr: Scales. Kent County Council under "well-being budget" identified 20mph scheme in Capel Street. Development of Land South of New Dover Road — Jarvis Homes holding Open Day for residents to view emerging plans - Councillors to take feedback from residents in order to form their response from Parish Council to Dover District Council when Planning Application submitted.
