Dear Friends,

From the Vicarage

Using a computer is like driving a car. Both offer opportunities to explore the world – but first you have to get them to start. For a while I taught computing, encouraging young people to learn how to drive computers so that they could use them to explore the world, rather than merely to amuse themselves. Too often they often settled for merely amusing themselves.

Has technology made life better? You may well ask. E-mail, for instance, has caught on to the extent that in the USA some workers spend the equivalent of two working days each week just checking, writing and reading e-mails, slaves to a monster that once promised to make life easier!

Easter continues through May, Christians recalling how God surprised Jesus' followers by raising Jesus to life, and again at Pentecost by sending his Holy Spirit upon them. In the New Testament Book of Acts Peter, on the Day of Pentecost, explains this to the crowds. It ends with the crowds asking Peter what they must do about it. He replies that they must repent, be baptised, and receive the Holy Spirit.

Technology easily takes on a life of its own. It makes all kinds of things possible – and with it comes the temptation to just use technology for its own sake, rather than using it to make the world a better place.

For Christians our world, filled as it is with technology, is the same one that Christ died for and in which his Spirit lives and in which God can still spring surprises. Nothing has ever been invented that can compete with repentance, baptism, and the gift of the Holy Spirit for power to change the world for the better. **Brian**



Saddle up for Air Ambulance bike ride - Life-saving charity Kent, Surrey & Sussex Air Ambulance is appealing for cyclists to sign up for this year's Double 100 Cycle Challenge and help save lives at night. The 100-mile or 100km bike ride is to be held on Sunday, September 28th, to mark the first anniversary of the launch of the night flying service. Last year's annual event raised more than £12,000 and organisers are aiming to double its success this year with two starting points at the helicopter bases at Marden and Redhill.

The charity now has to raise an extra £1million a year to fund the cost of a 24-hour service, up from £5million to £6million. The ride is open to regular and occasional cyclists including individuals and teams with feeding stations along the scenic route. The first 200 riders to sign up will receive a special Air Ambulance jersey.






This season's competitions are now on the board and players can start their heats. The first name drawn out should contact their opponents to arrange the match. Good luck everybody.





At the July meeting members were warned about the dangers opening unexpected gifts. Speaker John Pearce, an ex-police detective, gave a talk entitled 'Murder comes gift wrapped'. In 1984, Barbara Harrold, a 53-year-old grandmother opened a gift wrapped parcel delivered to her home on The Street in Ightham. It was a bomb filled with air gun pellets and parts of fireworks. She died of her injuries six days later. During the evening various members were sworn in as deputies to help solve the case, using information & forensics available in the early 80s. Working from the letters S E A the detectives were eventually identified where the parcel had been posted. Further information suggested Keith Cottingham, a Kent-born businessman, as a suspect. He was living comfortably in Spain (with whom there was no valid extradition treaty) and was dissatisfied about a property deal with the Harrolds. Eighteen years later he was extradited from Spain to stand trial for the murder at the Old Bailey. Unfortunately, he proved too ill for court and died in London's Belmarsh prison a year later, leaving his alleged guilt and eventual punishment to a higher authority. Social time was another 'May special' – a quiz on Underground stations in London. Great fun and, as always, cryptic enough to get everyone scratching their heads.

Next month's meeting speaker is Mr. Tony Harris talking about Flying for fun. The competition is a PAPER aeroplane and there is only one way to judge that – by which can fly the furthest!

The book club discussion was lively this month, talking about 'Life after Life'. A less controversial topic is the subject of the next book The Sea Change. Darts and Scrabble are about to break for the summer though craft sessions will continue. Knitting club at the school has also 'broken up' with the girls taking home their own knitted animals. Congratulations to them all on their achievements. <u>CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL</u> <u>Summary of some items discussed at meeting on Tuesday, 15th July.</u> • The meeting received no requests from the public to address the Council:



• Equipment status – Consideration being given now to the following; refurbishment of the junior play area, firstly with the re-painting of the climbing frame/slide equipment, tidy and cut back of area by BMX trail, fencing around the petanque courts, fencing around memorial stone together with stone chippings and replacement of other items in play area. Monitoring of all equipment on the Playing Field continues on a regular basis. • Land Allocation Local Plan – Nothing further to report at present, still awaiting Inspector's final confirmation of the Plan. St Mary's Churchyard Maintenance – Letter received from Parochial Church Council that they are considering applications for grant funding. • Crime Reports – No reports received. • Highways – Kent Highways to be notified of Councillors' disappointment that all hedgerows on rural country lanes surrounding the village, have not been cut back. Meeting is to be arranged with grass cutting contractor to discuss maintenance in certain areas, including Playing Field. • Other – Costings for more waste bins on Playing Field being sought. Thanks were expressed by the Chairman to everyone for their help and assistance on Saturday, 28th June at the Community Fun Day. Several Public Rights of Way issues were reported to Kent PROW department for maintenance - Cllr: Viv Hale agreed to become the Council's PROW representative delegate. Planning issues discussed and subject to further investigation. An additional Councillor will now form a 5 member delegate Planning Committee. District Councillor Scales reported on several issues including; Joint Transportation meeting, Quality bus partnership and bus passes, slurry repairs to pathways (Hougham to Dover Hill), Street Lighting, Memorial Day and meeting with Dover MP, Charlie Elphicke, on B2011 Crossing. County Councillor Geoff Lymer reported: Arrangements underway to hold a stall on "Ways to Healthy Living" at a Farmers' Market session in September.






More help is required for helping with the clearing up after the market, on a rota basis if necessary.

We should point out that we ensure our producers hold the relevant certificates i.e. a public liability insurance and, where necessary, health and hygiene certificate and kitchen registration documents


