

<u>From the vicarage</u>

"A ray of hope flickers in the sky, A tiny star lights up way up high..."

Recognize it? Yes – the opening words of *A Child is Born*, a Christmas number one for Johnny Mathis in December 1976, now mainly heard when Christmas shopping.

Cardinal Albino Luciani, later Pope John Paul I, wrote a monthly column in a magazine when he was a bishop in Venice. He wrote a series of open letters to all kinds of characters, from Charles Dickens to Pinocchio which were later collected and published in a little book called *Illustrissimi*. Someone once gave me a copy. A charming, entertaining read, it made me think – how about an open letter to Johnny Mathis?

You see, I'm not a fan of the song. It begins with the excitement of a new birth – the sort of hopes that we celebrate at christenings. Then, as the orchestra takes up the melody: "All of this happens because the world is waiting, waiting for one child... that will turn hate to love, war to peace and everyone to everyone's neighbour..."

Fine – Christians think that Jesus was just that. But then: "It's all a dream, an illusion now..."

What? Christmas a dream, an illusion? Mr. Mathis, why did you *really* think that Jesus somehow wasn't up to the job? Didn't Jesus talk about loving our enemies as well as our neighbours? Is it really his fault that not all of us do that?

Being only human, people don't always listen. That's the problem. St John's Gospel puts it like this: "The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him..."

So, Mr. Mathis, why not record something about that? Perhaps that would help to build the peaceful world you dream of – one where people listen.

In the meantime, a very happy Christmas to you, and to everyone.





My work recently has been focussed on the issues people in Capel-le-Ferne tell me are of greatest concern.



We must remain ever vigilant. Utility bills worry many people. Quite right too as the power companies seem to increase their prices in unison like they are some kind of cartel. Meanwhile the water companies increase bills every year but pay no tax and their real investment in leaking pipes has been falling. So I've campaigned in Parliament for reform in the water industry. To see our bills cut. I led a Parliamentary debate on this recently and the Government is weighing the case I have been making. With energy, it would be easy to say let's order a freeze. Yet people aren't daft. We all know that fuel prices are global and go up and down. What should happen? I think we should break up the "big six" power companies. We would then have a wider supply of power and a more competitive market. The regulator has been asleep at the wheel for years. It should be woken from its slumber and given wider powers to champion, we the bill payers. To step in if it looks like power generators are acting as a cartel. The previous government's green subsidies push up our energy bills by 10%. I want to Government to put a stop to that and roll back the greenery. We can't afford it. We need to increase our sources of power supply. We should seek as much home grown energy as possible. The new Hinckley nuclear power station will help. There should clearly be a new nuclear power station at Dungeness. It would provide us with more energy security, stable bills and zero carbon emissions. Energy policy is and will be a big issue over the long term. For me, the priority is securing cheap, safe, secure energy that has the lowest impact on the environment.

Re: Battle of Britain 1940

I am always coming up with snippets of information regarding the young pilots who were killed in our vicinity! This one is: Pilot Office Herbert Robert Case from Devon, who had an altercation with the Luftwaffe on 12th October 1940. He crash landed in a field off Winehouse Lane here in Capel and was killed. Farmers carried his body on a farm gate until the RAF picked him up and took the young airman away to be buried. I would love to know exactly where he landed. We could have a village 'flower laying' or something. This is close to home isn't it?? It validates the need for a memorial for these brave young men who fought on our behalf, their stories are amazingly brave. His, and the fuller story is on; http://www.bbm.org.uk/Case.htm - this is the Battle of Britain London Monument's site.

One other story about 'my pilot', I call him that as I sponsored him many years ago. He was Pilot Officer Keith Gillman from Dover. He became the promotional face for the RAF in a recruitment drive. He was shot down in the channel on his second sortie of the day, (as if one wouldn't be enough!!) not far from his home in Dover on 23rd August 1940, again in his very early twenties. I would think you will be able to pick him up on this' bbm' website also.

Any other info I can give you, be happy to do so. We have a number of reference books at the Memorial.

HOUSEHOLDERS THANKED AS DOVER DISTRICT IN TOP THREE AUTHORITIES FOR LOWEST WASTE PER HEAD



Householders in Dover District are being thanked following the latest exciting news that the district has the third lowest level of household waste per head in the country.

Latest figures from DEFRA show that the total waste per head for Dover District for 12/13 was 280.94kg. This is the third lowest in the country, behind the London Boroughs of Tower Hamlets (256.12) and Ealing (280.30). The national statistics also show that Dover District has the fourth largest decrease in household waste per head (ie residual waste and not recycling), with the change from 11/12 to 12/13 showing an impressive decrease of over 15%.

Cllr Nicholas Kenton, DDC Cabinet Member for Environment, Waste and Planning said: "This is excellent news, and we would like to say a big thank you to all householders who have been taking the time to reduce, reuse and recycle. Residents are reducing the amount of household waste they are throwing away, and this is great news for the environment. We look forward to continuing to work with residents to keep up this great record, and to continue to recycle for the future."



Summary of items discussed at meeting on Tuesday, 19th November.



- Speeding on B2011 Following last meeting, i.e. decision to enter the Kent Police Speed Watch Scheme, a request for resident volunteers to assist Councillors resulted in seven (7) further helpers. The Police will now be contacted with a view to arrange training and site assessments in the New Year. Land Allocation Local Plan letter of request had been received from Dover District Council, Programme Planning Officer, to indicate Councillors' wishes to take part in the Hearings with Government Independent Inspectorate in January 2014. Councillors considered this prior to meeting and agreed at the meeting that a member of the Parish Council would attend to present our representation orally on the following: Policy: LA21, 3.273 3.279 Land to the South of New Dover Road, between Capel Court Caravan Park and Helena Road, Policy: LA22, 3.280 3.283 Land to the North of the Junction of Capel Street and Winehouse Lane, Policy: LA23, 3.284 Site between 107 & 127 Capel Street. This representation will be based on the letter of concerns forwarded in February 2013, dependent on what the Inspector's "Matters and Questions" are, which will form the basis for the discussions at the Hearings. These are due to be released at the beginning of December 2013, together with a set of Guidance Notes, together with a draft hearings programme. Highways A meeting recently held with Gas Network contractors and Kent Highways, resulted in reassurance that areas of concern to grounds would be addressed, i.e. areas raked and re-seeded and in spring the reimbursement of loss of daffodils depending on flowering outcome. Thanks expressed to County Councillor Geoff Lymer for the provision of grass verge posts in Capel Street. Neighbourhood Watch Following an extremely productive meeting, the team were continuing to work on areas raised.
- Other items A date for a further Community Event was agreed for 2014, (Saturday, 28th June). This would incorporate a continued celebration of the Playing Field QE II Fields in Trust status, together with marking the 100th anniversary of World War I. Further details to follow! Anaerobic Digester Plant Planning Application No decision had yet been made by Planning Officer. Councillors received copies of 180 letters of objections from residents that had been forward to Dover District Council. Objection Petition on existing bus route this was received by Councillors and would be forwarded to Stagecoach with an invitation for a member of the company to attend an on-site meeting to use the suggested route from Capel to Canterbury Road, Folkestone, as detailed in their reply letter.

Next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday, 17th December at 7.30pm in the Village Hall (Small Hall).



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


League matters next, our league team gained another 9 points to put us top of the league table as of Thursday night. There is still a long way to go but well done to the teams.

Officers are urging people to keep themselves and their valuables safe after a family's Christmas presents were stolen from a car and a woman had her shopping bag stolen just this week. **Stay Safe this winter**

So, as Kent Police launches its Stay Safe this Winter campaign, this is a stark reminder to people it only takes a split second for a thief to strike. Don't give them the opportunity. The campaign will focus on anti-social behaviour, theft, violence, road safety and burglary. As well as promoting crime prevention advice, officers will be actively targeting those who commit crime and anti-social behaviour. In addition, officers will be working hard over the Christmas period to make sure everyone who lives, visits or passes through the county can enjoy a safe and crime-free experience.

Chief Inspector Lee Russell said: 'Opportunist thieves know people are busy at this time of year - don't give them the opportunity to spoil your Christmas. Take a few simple steps to keep yourself and your property stay safe. Don't wait until it's too late.'

Simple steps

Make sure thieves don't spoil your Christmas by taking a few steps to keep your valuables and shopping safe:

- When you go out: Don't leave valuables or Christmas shopping on display in your vehicle, or in the boot or glove box thieves know where to look. Keep valuable items like keys, wallet and mobile phone tucked away, out of sight and spread around your person for safety. Never leave your belongings or shopping unattended.
- When shopping online: If you're buying items online, make sure you use reputable companies, only use a page with https or the padlock icon and pay by credit card.
- **At home**: Keep valuables including presents, wallets and car keys out of view from doors and windows, and secure your home before you go out. Dispose of packaging carefully boxes or wrappings for expensive-looking items left outside your home may tempt thieves.

Driving in bad weather

Are you and your vehicle ready?



- You can help keep yourself and other road users safe while travelling in poor weather conditions by:
- checking the weather forecast and road conditions before you travel (see useful contacts below)
- **carrying provisions** (warm, waterproofing clothing, food, water, a mobile phone if possible and a torch) and making sure you have enough **petrol** for your journey and
- using the appropriate lights or wearing high visibility clothing poor weather conditions mean it can be harder for drivers to see pedestrians and cyclists
- adapting your driving for different weather conditions in the wet, fog and ice, keep well back from the car in front, slow down and use appropriate lights (know where your fog lights are!)
- **keeping your vehicle in good working order** make sure brakes and lights work, fluid levels are topped up and your windscreen is clear before you set off.

KCC has published its Budget consultation. Further details are available from the KCC website at http://www.kent.gov.uk/your council/council spending/budget consultation.aspx.

The deadline is 5 weeks from Friday 8th November - Friday 13th December.

The consultation paper says that they will need to find further savings of another £273m over the next 3 years if they don't increase council tax. KCC advise that savings of £91m have to be delivered next year and similar amounts in following years. They are consulting on their savings proposals of £81m and raising £10m of income through a council tax increase of 1.99%.

There are 2 consultation questions as set out below: Budget consultation - 2 questions

- Q1. Over the next three years KCC has to save approximately £273m out of its total annual spend of £1.43bn as a result of reductions in government funding and the need to fund unavoidable spending increases such as providing for increased numbers of children brought into care. Where do you think KCC should look to make these savings?
 - Radically change the way services are provided to reduce demand and cost.
 Provide only a basic minimum level of service, with no enhancements.
 Restrict access to services to only the most needy.
 A mixture of above
- **Q2.** To preserve some of our most popular services (especially those we aren't required by law to provide such as Arts, gateways, community wardens, apprenticeships, support to business, Kent Freedom Pass), we would need to raise council tax to offset the gap in government funding. **What is your view on this?**
 - I don't want tax increased at all.
 I'd accept a minimal increase of less than 2% to preserve some services. (Equal to £18 per year for Band C taxpayers and the maximum allowed without a referendum).
 I'd accept a more than 2% rise in order to protect some services from the reductions in funding.
 I'd accept KCC increasing charges for service users.
 - I'd accept a mixed solution a low tax increase and some charges to access services where absolutely required Please respond direct to KCC, using the weblink above and below.


