TAKING A LEAD ON DOG CONTROL - HAVE YOUR SAY - PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER CONSULTATION Dover District Council is launching a consultation on plans to introduce a single order relating to dogs in the district – aiming to create a more consistent approach in the district and balance the needs of dog owners and other members of the community.

DDC intends to bring in a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) under new powers introduced by Government in October. The order will replace outdated legislation relating to fouling and dog control. The proposals follow a range of work by DDC, including feedback from Town and Parish Councils. The consultation runs from 17 November to 29 December 2014. The planned PSPO covers four key areas: • Exclusion of dogs from certain areas - this includes enclosed children's play areas, and also certain beaches at specific times of the year. • Failure to clear up your dog's mess. • The keeping of dogs on leads in specified areas. • Leads by order – this covers the need for people to put and keep a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorized officer. Any breach of the order could result in the issue of a Fixed Penalty Notice of £75, in line with the fixed penalty level for littering offences. Cllr Nicholas Kenton, DDC Cabinet Member for Environment said: "We recognise that the vast majority of dog owners are caring, responsible people. However, we do get regular complaints from people about dog fouling and the behaviour of some dogs, and it is important that we respond to these concerns and set out clear rules. This new PSPO will bring greater clarity and consistency for the benefit of everyone and we look forward to hearing people's comments on the consultation." 

Summary of some items discussed at meeting on Tuesday, 18th November.

- Request from the public to address the Council: None received Equipment status report Zip-wire under investigation by suppliers following notification of areas of corrosion. Quotations received for refurbishment of other equipment and the fencing of petanque court area and memorial agreement was reached to leave final decisions to Lead Councillor Keith Pilcher. Survey by children in village on replacement of some junior play equipment had resulted in a sit on springy and a trampoline as being items as favourable substitutes costs to be investigated. Crime Reports (PCSO Gretel May) Seven (7) burglaries or attempts, in and around close proximity to village, had been reported resulting I two (2) males being charged. Neighbourhood Watch Notifications continue to be circulated via our Facebook page and the email database for 1st hand information received direct to your computer, request the Parish Clerk to add your email address to the database, or "like" our Facebook Page https://www.facebook.com/CapelLeFerneParishCouncil or follow on Twitter: Twitter Account@CapelParishCoun or visit our website http://www.capel-le-fernepc.kentparishes.gov.uk/
- Traffic/Road Improvements, Highways & Public Rights of Way Salt, new bin and gritting machine to be purchased and located at Village Hall for use on clearance of car park and adjacent public footpaths. The following items were received from Kent Highways following a Parish/Highways seminar attended by Councillor Brian Tutt; Winter "snow" classification of roads and their priorities, clearance of gullies and ditches and size of repairable potholes, Roundhill Tunnel A20 closures for routine maintenance date to be arranged, A20 diversions for renewing road markings from Courtwood Interchange to Aycliffe Roundabout and possibility of traffic lights being installed at roundabouts at York Street in Dover. In-operative "solar powered" 40 mph flashing sign (Folkestone bound) subject to further investigations, following classification by Kent Highways as a low priority for repair, due to it not being a mandatory sign. Footpath (Dover bound North side of B2011) from opposite Battle of Britain Site to Royal Oak Public House, has been listed by Kent Highways on programme of works for resurfacing, some to be completed this financial year, remainder in next year. There are now several items which have been highlighted and will be prioritised by all the Councillors to form a basis for discussions with Kent County Councillor Geoff Lymer to hopefully resolve solutions and get them on the programme for Kent Highways attention. Other items discussed Thanks were expressed to Parish Clerk for organising the Remembrance event at the Village Memorial and also to Ben Millbery (Lone Piper) who broke the silence by playing a Lament to the Fallen, "Flowers of the Forest". Request for further bus shelters and changes to existing bus routes being investigated further by District Councillor Frederick Scales in conjunction with the Dover Joint Transport Committee and the Dover Quality Bus Partnership.

Councillors noted, that in high winds, rubbish, waste and recycling containers get blown over and the contents distributed across roads, gardens and cliff top. The Councillors would very much appreciate your help in this. If everyone could please endeavour to make Capelle-Ferne Village a "neighbourly" area and assist in these circumstances to pick up the spilled contents when this occurs. Thank you.

I am concerned at the number of reports of criminals' intent on getting your personal data over the internet. Initially some of the attempts were quite amusing, an example I heard of some years ago was of an alleged West African senior military officer who had to remove so many millions of pounds/US dollars from his country for safe keeping due to internal conflict and in the email he stated if you would be so kind as to pass to him details of your bank account so that he could transfer all of the money into your account, to demonstrate his gratitude he would pay you a few million pounds for assisting him. Of course there was no such millions of pounds, the intention was to obtain your bank/personal details and then he would drain your bank account. Laughable, yes it is, for no one, not even a fool would have fallen for such a story. Sadly that was not so, for it was quite often people who would have considered themselves intelligent or who thought they would not be caught by such a scam who became victims. That was then. Now the fraudster, potential thief, for that is what they are, have become a little more sophisticated. How do they operate? Or put it another way, how could you be caught? The answer is on your computer, your phone either landline or mobile, by letter, whilst carrying out a bank transaction are but a few ways. As with the majority of crimes the criminal has to perform a confidence trick, however subtle, to put you off guard, do not for one minute think I am ok, I am not elderly so they would not prey on me or I am still young and therefore alert, so they would not 'have me over.' This crime cuts right across the ages. Here are a few tips to hopefully protect you from people trying to steal your personal information, known as data. A common email circulating at the moment purports to come from let us say one of the major banks such as Barclays. The email will state there has been some Administration or IT update required and if you could open an attachment to enter your bank account number, sort code and your PIN, they will update your bank details and they will thank you for your assistance and apologise for any inconvenience caused. The email will look very authentic with the banks logo contact details etc. the two responses to this are; 1) If you do not hold an account with the bank, either delete it or forward the email to the bank fraud unit, under the name of the bank they are using. The bank fraud email address can be found easily on Google. 2) If you do hold an account with the bank named, be assured they will never ask for these details via email.

So once more, delete the email or forward it by email to the named banks fraud unit. The criminal may attempt to obtain these crucial bank details over the phone. Under these circumstances to put you at ease they may invite you to hang up and dial the bank to assure you it is a bank that has phoned you. They are even kind enough at times to give you the phone number. However the trick is when you hang up, they do not, thus keeping the line open, so that when you dial the number supplied or that you have obtained independently, when they answer you may assume you have connected with your bank, when in fact you have just reconnected with the criminals. So rule of thumb here, if you receive a cold call from a bank, purporting to be your bank, if the call is genuine they will never ever ask you for your PIN, by phone or by email. If someone claims to be a bank official requests your PIN, never give it and either delete the email or hang up from the phone call. Should you receive a similar request by letter with a prepaid envelope, normally addressed to a post office box number and you are uncertain, take it to your bank. The time you could easily fall prey to these criminals is when you are in a rush and you have not really scrutinised that email sufficiently, that is what the criminal is relying on. Other types of criminal activity being carried out at the moment are cold callers to your property trying to convince you the roof needs urgent work carried out or they work for the local council repairing roads and have some tarmac left if you would like your driveway tarmacked, or your tree is looking dangerous and needs work to it. The advice here is to never accept work from cold callers. They could seriously overcharge you, then, threaten you if you cannot afford or refuse to pay. Always obtain at least three quotes. A quote has to be adhered to; an estimate could go up considerably from the original price given. Look for the works vehicle, is it sign written, if so most businesses have a landline as well as a mobile number. Is the landline STD local, ie: 01303/01304. Remember good tradesmen never have to cold call. When obtaining quotes always ensure they are in writing and be mindful that even scrupulous tradesmen will often write an estimate instead of a quote. If you receive an estimate when you requested a quote, politely remind them it was a quote you requested, ask for a quote once more and do not let them convince you it is the same, for they should know better especially if you have a civil claim over the final bill, you could be on weak ground with an estimate. A lot has been happening since my last column in Grapevine. I thought it would be a good idea to update you on developments that affect Capel-le-Ferne.

Jobs: We have a really encouraging picture on jobs in our area. Local unemployment is down 37% since 2010 and by a whole quarter in the last year alone. Youth unemployment has come down over 40% in the past four and a half years. More people locally are finding work and have the security of a pay packet to support themselves. The next piece in the jigsaw has been getting real wages up. That's why it's so encouraging that full-time wages in our area are now going up faster than inflation. More money in people's pockets to spend on themselves and their family. I now want to see this trend continue. These figures show we are on the right track in our corner of Kent.

Healthcare: I continue to fight for a fairer share of healthcare in our area. Progress on the new state of the art Dover Hospital continues apace. It will open in Spring next year. The Hospital will be just three miles away from Capel and provide great local healthcare for residents. The next step is getting the care beds and emergency services people want at Dover Hospital. This will save people from Capel taking costly journeys to Ashford and Margate Hospital. This is particularly important for those who cannot travel very far. People in Capel are really pleased the NHS budget has been protected. For too long, we never got a fair share of healthcare in our area – this is now changing.

Immigration: From going round the village, I know that immigration is one of the top local concerns in Capel. We are on England's frontline and people have been very concerned by the recent chaos in Calais, where the French authorities have lost control of the town. People want to know we are keeping our borders safe and secure. In past times, migrants could basically wander into Britain. This is no longer the case. Our border controls are now at Calais instead of Dover. They are strong and hardly any illegal migrants manage to get through. Sniffer dogs find illegal immigrants trying to break in and vigilant ships patrol the English Channel to stop illegal dinghies and rafts. That's why so many migrants are stuck in Calais. We need to keep our controls in Calais and not allow migrants to set foot in the UK to claim asylum. The French authorities need to get a grip and process migrants in Calais, rather than let them concentrate in Calais and any illegal migrants who break into Britain, should be repatriated to their home countries.

Dover Port: Since my last newsletter, we have seen great progress at Dover Port. In 2010, our Port was threatened with being sold off. Now, its future is secure and regeneration will make it an even greater asset for our area. A community fund will plough profits from the port back into the community and provide support for skills and training for our young people. The first community director is being appointed to ensure the port is run in the interests of our community. The Western Docks revival plans hope to create 600 jobs and really regenerate the Port. The future is looking bright at the Port and it will see everyone in the community share in the benefits.
