Should I be shocked? Some are saying I should be. In case you haven't heard, this year there's a Christmas advertisement doing the rounds which some say sends up the Nativity. I've seen it. Accompanied by an angelic choir, shepherds and wise men join a couple in drooling over a designer handbag.

I'm puzzled. Why would anybody pinch the Christmas story and use it to sell a designer handbag? After all, it isn't exactly a story built around luxury items, rather the opposite. If anyone gave birth in a stable today, people would demand to know what Social Services and the NHS were doing about it. If today, almost as soon as she had given birth, Mary, Joseph and the baby were fleeing for their lives it would not be very different to what we have been seeing on our TV screens every evening for months now. It's a disturbing story about homelessness, deprivation and persecution all too often repeated in today's world.

At each of our churches there will be a crib this Christmas, with baby Jesus and his parents surrounded by farm animals and straw, and shepherds. Everything but the smell to remind us of where Jesus started out, and how and where he spent his life. We shall celebrate how God loved our world enough to have risked being part of it, and how the things he taught us can make it a better place, if only we listen. That, to me, is worth much more than a designer handbag. As 'Joe' in the ad says, '*It's only a bag*.' In any case, it wouldn't match my shoes...

Good luck Paul, you will be sorely missed and our very best wishes for the future to you and your family, from us all. In due course, information on our future Community Warden Services for the village will be communicated accordingly when the Parish Council are formally notified via Kent County Council. • <u>Highways:</u> Kent Highways are considering and implementing a "Caretaker Scheme" to check drains, trees and hedges etc – no funding available. Grass verge Bollards outside Primary School to be replaced and some new installed. More planters likely to be placed at Courtwood Roundabout to help alleviate parking of HGVs. Drainage issues causing flooding at Courtwood Roundabout resolved. It's Christmas this month (as if you didn't know) you can order your Christmas goodies in advance at most of the stalls and collect them on 22nd December. This Market will also be the 'Christmas Special'. You never know who will drop in to visit (he may wear red) or to sing (usually wearing hats as disguises)

Firstly a huge thank you to Jenny, Cherry and Julie for all their hard work in keeping the market up and running and doing all the advertising which encourages more customers and stall holders. We would also like to thank Lyn for all her help over the last few months. The market still relies a lot on volunteers to help set up the tables, run the kitchen and then clear up afterwards. If you are new to the village it is a great way of getting to know people and the level of commitment can be adjusted to suit you. The commitment can be as little as once a month and it makes an enormous difference. If interested, please contact Cherry 255114 to find out what is involved.

This month we 'meet Kevin'. During the summer he brought in his soft fruit – the strawberries raspberries and cherries were excellent and the same price as in supermarkets. Whilst they were in season, raspberries and cherries were plentiful on his stall and tasted way better than any available elsewhere. In fact, they were so good that if you didn't buy them on the way in by the time you went on the way home he had usually sold out. Some canny shoppers even ordered in advance so they had enough to restock their jam cupboards. His prices are comparable with those of supermarkets so are not expensive and there is the bonus of being able to talk to the grower direct. Although his fruit is bagged he is more than happy to split bags to smaller quantities. Based near Faversham he got into farming when his father 'retired' and his uncle amputated his toe on a lawn mower, leaving able bodied Kevin in charge. Although he goes to 9 monthly markets this is the only weekly market Kevin does. He sees this as a vocation rather than a job and gets immense satisfaction from knowing that what he picks is in the customer's fridge (or should it be stomach) within a day, so his produce is really fresh. (I find his produce keeps longer than that from the supermarket). He declined to say what he doesn't like about the market, but when pressed he said being outside during the cold and wet. Very diplomatic. He grows 12 varieties of plum, 17 of apple and 7 of cherries. He can be found on the left, by his van, as you walk to the Village Hall.

Marsh Produce have a family run farm located in Romney Marsh where they specialize in rare breed lamb and pork, all born and raised on our farm, and Dexter Beef matured for 28 days. Additionally, sometimes they treat us to a variety of more exotic meats throughout the year, game during the season, exotic meats such as Kangaroo, Crocodile or Ostrich, alongside her usual Pork, Beef, Lamb and Chicken etc. – a chance to try something different without travelling all the way to Australia. Debbie supplements her meats with local cheese – all produced either in Kent or Sussex.

Don't forget the Crafts Section - unusual gifts or household items and handmade cards are on offer. James is on hand for those Passport photos as is the postal service provided by Sally and Rachel. In the lobby Julie runs the WEEKLY DRAW for vouchers to spend at the market, for just 50p a go. The winners' names are always on the board in the hallway. We also provide a photocopying service for just 10p per copy. PLUS – Quiz sheets are available and lots of books and jigsaw puzzles for just a donation!

The Village Community Warden and/or our PCSO are usually on hand at the market to answer any questions. The KCC Mobile Library attends just outside the car park, at 12 Noon every week. So, as you can see, we are more than just a Farmers Market but a real Community based project! We now have the following products on sale:- Fish, Meat, Eggs, Preserves, Jams, Honey & Pickles, Sauces, Condiments, Deli products, Smoked Fish & Cheese, Bread, Cakes, Pastries, Pies, Fruit, Vegetables, Fruit Juice, Plants, a wide variety of Crafts and 'Ruby's Kitchen' for that cup of tea to revive you before your journey home.

We still could do with some more help in the clearing up after the market please, on a rota basis. Could you spare just ½ an hour once a month from 12.30 to 1 p.m.? Maybe you've just retired and want something to do, or are new to the village and want to get involved? If you are interested, please contact Cherry 255114 to discuss what is involved.

Please note: The products for sale are produced (in the majority of cases) by the stallholder, in Kent, unless clearly marked otherwise. We should point out that we ensure our producers hold the relevant certificates i.e. a public liability insurance and, where necessary, health and hygiene certificate and kitchen registration documents.
