

Thank you to those who came to the Annual Meeting – it makes the committee feel more appreciated – we hope you found it interesting. Highlights of the last year were presented and copies of the annual report and financial statement are being sent to the Charity Commission who monitor us. A copy of the annual report is on the notice board and if you would like your own copy please contact Sally Cook, secretary. Contact details are on the inside back page of Grapevine.

Whilst all the trustees work hard, bringing their own expertise, Brian as Chairman and Sally as Secretary are important in ensuring the committee runs smoothly. We'd also like to recognize the contribution made by Julie Young and Jenny Barraclough, both of whom resigned this year after many years on the committee. Details of the new committee will be published in the February edition of Grapevine. There are many volunteers who help in the hall doing a variety of jobs. Without them the fundraising events could not happen, so in mid/late January there will be an informal lunch to say thank you to them.

The great hall tidy-up is being planned for the new year. It is amazing how much 'stuff' which does not belong to the hall, accumulates over time and once again, the store room is overflowing. If anything belongs to your organisation, please ensure it is either stored in your cupboard or clearly labelled. Anything unlabelled in the store room will be taken to the recycling centre.

Can you help reduce the cost of running the hall? During the last year arrangements were made for a commercial **waste collection**. This was a trial to see if it helped those hiring the hall to leave the hall clean and tidy. Initially it worked well and a fortnightly collection was adequate. Over recent weeks the bin has been filled to overflowing and weekly collections are becoming necessary. The problem is that, as a commercial collection, the hall has to pay for the service. One **week costs £42**; whilst a fortnightly collection can be absorbed, if it becomes a weekly event it will be unsustainable. So, if you hire the hall could you help by ensuring the bin is securely locked once you have put your non recycling waste in the bin? Your recycling could go home to put into the domestic recycling, which would be more environmentally friendly. Most importantly, if you see someone not hiring the hall putting rubbish in, please discourage them. It would be a shame if it became too expensive to keep.

The organisers would like to wish all the customers and stallholders a Merry Christmas and a Happy 2017. Time flashes by so quickly as one ages, and in 2017 the Farmers' Market will be 14 years old.

Diary dates:

Tuesday 6th December talk to the stallholders about your orders for Christmas

Tuesday 13th December last orders for Christmas for produce to be collected on 20th December (there will be the usual range of items to buy without prior ordering but pre-ordering will ensure there is a sufficient supply of what you'd like).

Tuesday **December 13th** the choir from Capel-le-Ferne Primary school will be singing carols.

Tuesday December 20th the WI will be singing carols. Tuesday December 20th collect orders.

Tuesday 27^{th} December and Tuesday 3^{rd} January the market will be closed – the days before these are bank holidays and the stallholders deserve some time off

Tuesday 10th January MARKET RE-OPENS for produce. The crafters re-join the market in February.

Christmas time we all tend to eat more and richer foods than normal, so a few ideas for simpler meals – especially if they use left overs – are worth having up your sleeve.

Try making shepherd's pie with rabbit, pigeon or boar (mixed with a little pork to moisten it). Alternatively use leftover roast meat and vegetables for the base under homemade mash potatoes. The secret to a good mash is to cut the potatoes small then, when the water is boiling, cook over a low heat for 15 minutes or so until a fork goes though easily but before the potatoes get flaky.

Another good way of using leftover meat, with or without vegetables is to cut them into small pieces, mix with mashed potatoes to bind the ingredients together. Using your hands shape into burger shapes then when ready, gently fry in a little oil. For a fancier model, roll in egg then breadcrumbs. A great way of using left-over turkey, chicken or beef or use cooked fish and call them fishcakes.

Peaches cut in half, sprinkled with a little sugar and cinnamon and roasted for 25 minutes in the oven make a tasty light dessert for Boxing Day. For an alternative try wrapping a peeled banana with a little cinnamon and honey in foil, then baking it for about 10 minutes, depending on how gooey you like your bananas.

Whatever you decide to cook, it will taste better if the ingredients have come from the Farmers' Market. Most fruit and vegetables on sale are Kent grown. Bananas and peaches may not be grown in Kent, PJ drives up to Covent Garden before coming to the market and chooses the freshest for us.





• Request from the public to address the Council, Surgery and Other Feedback: No ball games signs on playing field; No space on the Playing Field had been limited for recreation; the signs are there as a cursory request to users of that part of the Field to consider not playing football and/or cricket, due to closeness of properties, which have conservatories and greenhouses; The signs also act as a compliance for insurance; Monitoring of the issue will take place as an enforcement to this policy and will be re-visited by the Councillors if further problems occur. Councillors considered a re-planting scheme and agreed it was a very good proposal, this will be re-visited if the need arises. Several hedges in village requiring cutting were noted and would be reported to Kent Highways and/or residents concerned. • Neighbourhood Watch: Speed Watch – Grant from Kent County Council to be applied for to purchase a Speed Indicator Device for the Parish. Demonstration of equipment had been received and decision made to go ahead, as feedback received that the machine chosen was well constructed. Speeding is a continued concern to Councillors and hopefully, by purchasing this equipment, some education to speeding drivers can be carried out. When equipment received, re-registration and more on-line training will be notified to volunteers • <u>Equipment status report</u>: Report circulated – a few minor issues to attend to and sign repairs. • Highways and Public Rights of Way: Following attendance at a Kent Highways seminar, Cllr: Tutt reported on future for cutting hedges, grass verges etc., may change. • Planning: Land South of New Dover Road (Jarvis Homes) - Appeal hearing attended by Councillors and a few residents, Inspector had visited village and also had a site meeting with Chairman and member of Dover District Council and we now wait decision. Councillors discussed further that there was an increase in affordable housing from 6 to 9 properties and the speed limit at this part of the B2011 and the extension when development proceeds. Land North of New Dover Road (Quinn Estates) – Nothing further to report.

• <u>Other</u>: Approximately 1,400 daffodil bulbs have now been planted on the Lancaster Avenue boundary (under the trees) to commemorate HM Queen's 90 Birthday year – thanks to B Young Grounds Maintenance for their services. "Capel Cares" on 9th December arrangements made, please come along and join in and give some feedback on needs in our Village. An enquiry with Dover District Council for more waste bins on B2011 to be addressed. Policy and procedure to be put into place on donations from the Precept – more details in February Grapevine.

With nursery and school terms well underway parents and guardians of children aged two to seven, are being encouraged to get the free flu vaccination for their children. This year children aged two, three and four, or in school years one, two and three, are all eligible for the flu vaccination on the NHS. The child-friendly nasal spray means children can avoid having an injection and instead have a quick, painless, squirt into each nostril.

Children aged two to four years old can visit their GP for the nasal spray vaccination; while school nurses are running clinics for children in years one, two and three. Children of all ages with a health condition that puts them at greater risk of flu are also eligible for the flu vaccine.

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness in children causing fever, stuffy nose dry cough, sore throat, aching muscles and joints and extreme tiredness. This can often last several days. Some children can get a very high fever, sometimes without the usual flu symptoms, and may need to go to hospital for treatment. Serious complications of flu include a painful ear infection, acute bronchitis and pneumonia.

Children can become very poorly if they catch flu and are good at spreading it to others too. We know an ill child affects the wider family, as parents or carers may have to take time off work to look after them. The nasal spray is safe and tailored each year to specific flu viruses – so please do take up this free NHS offer."

Kent Council Director of Public Health, Andrew Scott-Clark said: "It is particularly important that we reach parents and make sure children are protected as they can easily spread the illness among their friends and family. In the worst cases, seasonal flu can result in a stay in hospital, and it can even be fatal. Younger girls and boys can get the vaccine as a nasal spray rather than a jab but having one can make a huge difference."

It is important to get children vaccinated even if they had the flu vaccination last year. The flu vaccine provides protection against the strains of flu that are likely to circulate this year and which may be different from last year. So make sure you visit your GP when offered the nasal spray vaccine (for pre-school children) or complete the consent form so your child can have the vaccine at school (for four to seven year olds.

This year the flu vaccine is being offered to:

- Children aged two, three and four years i.e. born between 1 September 2011 and 31 August 2014
- Children in school years 1,2 and 3 i.e. born between 1 September 2008 and 31 August 2011
 - Children with a health condition that puts them at greater risk.




"CAPEL CARES"





Residents without access to the internet can call **01304 872428** (**until 3.30pm on 13 February 2017**) and leave their contact details. Callers will receive a call back from Dover District Council to complete the registration form. How does it work?

• Energy providers will compete to offer you the best Energy Deal at a reverse auction on **14 February 2017**. What happens then?

You get a personal offer (all tariffs fixed for 1 year) showing whether you can save – offers will be **sent out from 27 February 2017** You Decide!

If you want to switch the deadline to accept the offer is 28 March 2017 (you'll be helped through the process).


