#### <u>From the Vicarage</u>

When I wrote about my Father McKenzie moment back in May – how, during Holy Week, I ended up in church with only the angels, the archangels and the whole company of heaven and the words of a sermon that no one would hear, just like the priest in The Beatles' song *Eleanor Rigby* – it certainly struck a chord with some of you. (Sorry!) Thanks to those who kindly wrote or sent emails.

As far as church is concerned, let's be honest – I'm the only one who *has* to be there. People were probably busy with other very important and worthwhile things that evening. Most of us live busier lives than ever before. Even if we don't expect to be busy when we retire, the chances are that our children will be, so we shall end up being busy with our grandchildren.

The gospels tell us that when Jesus' disciples were so busy that they did not even have time to eat, he invited them to come away to a quiet place by themselves. I sometimes think of church that way – being in a service is a lot like putting being busy to one side and coming away to rest, listen, and be quiet for a while. Rabbi Lionel Blue once wondered whether prayer is like a cigarette (this was before the smoking ban came along) - a chance to pause, he said, but without the nasty side-effects.

Prayer has more going for it than that. It isn't smelly or messy, and you don't need to find a sheltered corner at the bottom of the garden. You can do it indoors – St Mary's Capel, St Anthony's at Alkham and St Laurence Hougham are all open during the day. Come and treat yourself to a quiet moment soon. **Brian**

Firstly, huge congratulations to Michal Marshall. The village hall committee was one of the many organisations which supported the nomination. Whenever help is needed Mick is never far away and is known to many residents in Capel le Ferne. His connection with the village hall goes back to the old 'hut' and his efforts during fundraising for and building of the new (current) hall were strenuous. He is extremely modest about what he does and not many people realise he was one of the original instigators of the Farmers' Market. He is still a regular volunteer.

Planning permission has been granted for the alterations to the front of the hall and preparations have begun in earnest. We are aware that, whilst many people are supportive of the project, not everyone believes the work will improve the hall. The proof will be in the pudding as they say. One of the first jobs for whichever builder is selected is to organise an alternative entrance so users can continue to use the hall.

There currently is a great deal of publicity around reducing food waste. If you would like to do your bit, then please consider using the Farmers' Market. The stall holders will be happy to talk to you about the best way to use their produce. If you would like some recipes. Let us know and we'll make some available. For instance, scoop out the middle one of Mike's artisan breads, fill with cheese fondue mix and pop in the oven. Use the scooped out pieces to dip into the cheese. Simples.

As part of the service to local residents, table and chairs can be hired for private parties at home. The tables are the folding Gopak ones, available in two sizes, the chairs are the stacking bucket chairs. From time to time the committee consider hiring out the folding chairs, but for a variety of reasons believe it not appropriate to do so. The decision will be reviewed periodically and in the meantime anyone requesting chairs from the hall will be offered the stacking chairs.



As I write this, the countryside is finally basking in the sunshine of high summer after the long cold spring, which means that now is the perfect time to indulge in some wonderful locally-grown produce. There really is no better way to enjoy any precious warm days than with a feast of wonderful summer foods, grown and produced close to home. At this time of year, everything is so good, you can follow the 'less is more' precept and keep preparation and cooking to the minimum.

Grass-fed summer LAMB is now at its very finest and, as a more fatty meat than some (the fat gives the meat flavour and keeps it from drying out), it's ideal for the BBQ. A boned-out leg or shoulder can be marinated overnight and cooks perfectly in under an hour. I make up a paste of ground spices, lime juice and yogurt or use the Moroccan spice, Ras al Hanout, rubbed over the skin before cooking (try on cubed lamb for kebabs). On the fish front look out for mackerel – bought silvery fresh from the market and cooked the same day to enjoy at its very best. Midsummer is a great time to enjoy CRAB – all you need to make a feast is to serve dressed crab with simply buttered new potatoes and good mayonnaise, homemade if possible. Serve with a chilled glass of one of the excellent English white wines.

Amongst an abundance of produce at this month's market, you'll find tender BROAD BEANS (freshly picked little pods can be enjoyed whole), fresh GREEN PEAS, radishes, beetroot, spring onions, spinach, and of course, new potatoes. Cucumbers, beans, both french and runner, and courgettes should be there alongside all kinds of salad leaves and great bunches of fresh herbs.

The slow cooler start to the season has been good for STRAWBERRIES, especially now that the weather is warming up to ripen the fruit – so indulge yourself with the best of the British summer fruit all at its peak this month. You'll discover a completely different experience from the pale imitations that can be found all year round in supermarkets, varieties grown for flavour rather than ease of transport and keeping qualities. (I slice mine an hour before serving, sprinkle a spoon of sugar and a tablespoon of Grand Marnier or Cointreau and leave). Serve with rich golden pouring cream from cattle fed on the lush summer grass and a sprinkling of sugar. Don't miss out on CHERRIES with the season now in full swing (Kentish cherries are justifiably world famous), gooseberries, and wonderful raspberries. This is the month for jam makers and you don't have to make huge vats of the stuff - just a few jars are incredibly satisfying to produce in your home kitchen, taste marvellous and make wonderful gifts.

#### Research shows one in three drivers in Kent use their mobile whilst driving

Research by Kent County Council has found 65% of people fear the biggest risk to them on the roads is drivers using mobile phones whilst at the wheel. The research, by KCC's Road Safety Team, shows that motorists estimate 39% of drivers use a hand-held mobile phone, 34% use a phone to text/use apps/check email/use internet and 49% use a hands-free mobile device whilst driving. Over the past month, Kent County Council is launching an awareness campaign to remind drivers of the dangers of using mobile phones whilst driving. It aims to remind drivers that mobile phones cause a huge distraction whilst driving and that it is a myth to think that it is possible to concentrate fully on two things at once. The reality is that no two activities can be given equal attention - one task will always be more dominant. With a task as important as driving, even just a slip in concentration due to a mobile phone could lead to severe consequences. Vicky Watkins, Road Safety Team Leader at KCC, said, "Using a mobile phone whilst driving impairs reaction time, reduces concentration levels, leads to poorer judgment of speed and distance and reduces your field of vision." Drivers using mobile phones make the roads less safe for us all. "It's a fallacy to believe we can concentrate on two things at once. The reality is one activity will dominate the other". "It's not simply splitting your attention 50:50, it's more like 95:5 with the task seeming the most important taking over - with drivers using a phone that means the call or text completely takes over from the driving". A video will highlight key every day moments where it would be perceived as ludicrous to answer a mobile phone and in doing so, emphasise that driving is another one of these moments. The campaign will be running throughout the month and will be on television and on demand services, Heart radio bus rears, bus stop posters and social media. Inspector Martin Stevens from Kent Police said, "Though the majority of people know it is wrong to phone or text at the wheel, some feel that using apps is acceptable". "Doing this is just as distracting as calling or texting someone and just as likely to cause a collision. Furthermore should a motorist cause a collision or be caught on their phone, we can forensically examine it and find out exactly what the user was doing with their handset". "Using a phone at the wheel is just as socially unacceptable as drink driving and both offences cost lives. Life lost on the road is a life wasted and a family devastated". So next the time you are behind the wheel and get a mention, a favourite, a like or a direct message, ask yourself if you are literally dying to read it? Drivers are also being told not to be fooled into thinking hands-free calls are not illegal or 'safe'. Handsfree phone conversations impair drivers to a similar degree as hand-held calls. KCC's research gives strong backing to the continuing need to raise drivers' awareness of the increased risk they place themselves in when using a mobile phone at the wheel and to remind them that Kent Police are actively looking for them. Matthew Balfour, Kent County Council Cabinet Member for Environment and Transport, added: "We want to help road users to make Kent's roads safer and to reduce the number of people killed and seriously injured in the county". "With this campaign the message is clear, make the right call - don't use your phone and drive". "We've found that a large number of drivers say they know using a mobile at the wheel is dangerous and unacceptable, yet many continue to do so. This campaign brings together the education message with an increased likelihood of being caught - key motivators to changing this behaviour". Contact: Jenny 01303 250928 Barry 01303 257157 Ros 01303 255862 Every year throughout the spring and summer KCC Highways & Transportation receive numerous complaints regarding trees, hedges and other vegetation, which overhang the highway from private property. This matter can pose a number of problems for people trying to use the footways, especially if they are trying to pass with buggies, wheel chairs and scooters. It would be greatly appreciated if you could ensure that any trees and hedges that are bordering the Highway are maintained and cut back to your boundary which would greatly benefit all Highway users. This will help us all keep the highway safe and prevent the need for KCC Highways & Transportation writing to you requesting that you cut back your vegetation. If the boundary of your property borders the footway, then please be aware that: • The full width of the footway/pavement must be available for use by pedestrians. • As well, there must be a minimum height clearance over the footway/pavement of 2.1 metres / 7 feet for any vegetation. If the boundary of your property borders the carriageway, then please be aware that: • If you have vegetation that overhangs into the road, there must be a minimum height clearance of 5 metres / 16 feet, to accommodate buses and HGV's that may use the road. • If your property is rural, then vegetation should be 0.45 metres / 1'6" feet behind the edge of the road and all signs need to be kept clear of foliage for at least 20 metres. Also, I would ask that you pay special attention to your trees, hedges and vegetation if your property is on or near a junction, and/or inside bend of the road, to maintain maximum visibility for road users. Finally, I would like to thank you for the time taken to read this article and wish you a pleasant summer. I am looking forward to working with yourselves and your parish to keep the roads as safe and clear as possible.

<u>Summary of some items discussed at meetings on</u>
Tuesday, 21<sup>st</sup> June 2016



Capel-le-Ferne resident has been recognised in Queen's 90th Birthday Honours List, MICHAEL PAUL MARSHALL has been awarded the BEM - British Empire Medal, for services to the community in Capel-le-Ferne. CONGRATULATIONS MICK, FROM US ALL!

• Request from the public to address the Council: None. Surgery and Other Feedback: Tress in Lancaster Avenue require cut back. Grass cuttings along B2011 blown into highway, which may cause blockage to drains. • Neighbourhood Plan: Further meeting to be arranged and then a Public Meeting will be held to inform residents of the Plan, discuss next stage and ascertain resident's interest - see separate insert; Neighbourhood Watch: No crimes etc., reported. Notifications continue to be sent out via email database and Facebook Page on various scams etc. • Equipment status report: Already circulated to members, items requiring attention; vegetation removal to edges of MUGA; tree fallen across ramps; teen shelter looking worn; missing screw on zip wire; • Highways and Public Rights of Way: 20mph incorrect signage in Capel Street being corrected by Kent Highways; Speed-watch to be reconsidered again with volunteers, with a possible purchase of Parish Council machine to use for traffic management of speeding vehicles and non-compliance of the new 20mph speed zone in educating drivers; block driveway paving to some properties a cause for concern with no drainage facilities provided and water discharging onto highway; cut back of residents' hedgerows also a cause for concern in places where they impinge on the pavement and highway; together with inconsiderate parking on pavements • Planning: No further notifications received regarding Land South of New Dover Road, although concerns have been expressed to Dover District Council on open access to land and possible traveller use. No further reports from Quinn Estates on Land North of New Dover Road. • Other: Bus Shelter outside Battle of Britain site – roof now replaced and shelter will be reposition week beginning 11<sup>th</sup> July to comply with Disability Act; Thanks to all residents that completed forms for the Village Resilience Plan, these details would now be put together for reference purposes; CCTV coverage, camera adjustment, and cupboard for equipment considered - would be addressed again when details of costs are available; Financial Regulations and Standing Orders re-adopted;


