From the Vicarage

There were more books, comics and memorabilia than I had seen for a long time, and photographs autographed in person by actors who have appeared in Star Wars and Harry Potter, among other things – at a price, of course. But at the convention that my son took me to recently, the star attraction was an audience with Tom Baker – the fourth Dr Who.

Most weeks I have to write a sermon. Jesus explained complicated things simply by telling stories about fishing, farming and other things that people knew about. These days most people have heard about Dr Who, and using a Dr Who character or storyline in a sermon usually catches people's attention as well as explaining complicated things simply. (Star Trek works quite well, too!)

As Alastair Campbell might say, Dr Who doesn't do God – but then neither do the characters in Jesus' stories. That doesn't stop Jesus using them to make his point. Tom Baker said that he had always found it difficult to play villains – but then Dr Who is never a villain. Like Jesus, he appears as one of us – but at the same time he's different. Like Jesus, he abhors the use of violence. Like Jesus, he has travelling companions who share his adventures – ordinary people who, with his help, end up doing extraordinary things.

So thanks to all those whose imagination has given us Time Lords, Daleks, Cybermen and all the rest. You may not do God, but you're a great help to some of us who do! Dr Who. Coming soon to a pulpit near you! (Well, maybe). **Brian**

The boot fair season has drawn to a close for this season and will recommence in the autumn. The Garage Safari is being arranged for September. Other notable dates are; Last Night of the Proms 12th September, Craft Fair 14th November and Chicory Tip is returning for News Year Eve. More details of all these later!

The committee has been discussing what we need to do to improve the hall and how the post office room can be used. If you have any thoughts or suggestions please let us know. Every month the committee read the comment in the comments book. This has proved useful to monitoring how people feel about the hall and alerting us to things which need attention. On occasion there has even been a compliment.

This month this system was upstaged by the Chairman needing to spend time with the officers from the Licencing and the Environment Department of DDC. One private hirer did not control thee noise level and disturbed a local resident to an unacceptable level.

FIRSTLY – we would like to apologise to the resident concerned. As a committee we do emphasis the hirers' responsibility to keep the noise down and have attended the hall to ask the occupants to be considerate to local residents.

SECONDLY – we would remind all users that the hiring agreement says to keep the nose within reasonable limits. If the volume is raised then doors and windows should be kept shut. Music should stop at 11.30, (unless a successful application for an extension has been made).

IF THE NOISE FROM HIRERS IS EXCESSIVE, PLEASE CONTACT ONE OF THE TRUSTEES, TELEPHONE NUMBERS ON PAGE 11 OF THIS NEWSLETTER. REMEMBER THE HALL IS WELL USED BY MANY RESIDENTS AND IF WE LOSE THE LICENCES THE IMPACT WILL BE FELT BY ALL THE ORGANISATIONS' MEMBERS.

The committee tries to be non-Draconian but sometimes the risk to the hall of being relaxed is too great.

Capel has an active community and the village hall is well used, whether by the Spitfire Judo Club or the East Kent Bridge Club or by the other various organisations who meet for sports or leisure activities. There is something for all ages. Details of these are in the hall. Some, like short mat bowls are in the hall several times a week, others, like the bird show are annual events. If you are new to the village or recently retired there are lots of opportunities to get involved either on a social basis or to join some of the committees. Most organisations are happy for you to attend taster session to see if the activities suit you. Details are in the hall or in Grapevine. * There is some capacity for private hiring, so if you would like to organise a party come and have a look round. There are two halls, which can be hired separately or together. The main hall has plenty of tables and chairs and there is still space for dancing or running round. A PA system means you can hear the music or speaker if you have one – we are happy to show people how to use it. There is a stage with curtains – you could use this for the disco, band, speaker or you could put some chairs there so adults can sit and watch the children run around on the main floor. For AV events there is an electrically driven projection screen, whilst for that very special party there is a net to let release balloons. The small hall is perfect for more intimate groups or meetings, or can be used as the chill out space or food/drink service area. Both halls have use of the kitchen - including instant boiling water (capacity up to 100 cups in 15 minutes) and plenty of china, mugs and cups. A separate hand washing sink complies with Food Hygiene Regulations. The electrically operated shutter allows you to close the kitchen off so your guest can party on while the washer uppers tidy up. Hire either or both halls, depending on how much space you need. Licenced for most things (except hypnosis and boxing) including sale of alcohol, PRS, raffles. If you would like to start a new club or activity then talk to the letting secretary about when a regular booking can be made.







- Request from the public to address the Council: Resident Cherry Leppard enquired on the A20 Traffic Assessment and highlighted the dangers being encountered Cllr. Tutt and District Cllr. Scales addressed this "trial" assessment of Highway England stating the Council would be putting forward their feedback to Highway England and encouraging others to send their comments also by 8th July to: Email: info@highwaysengland.co.uk or call 0300 123 5000. The responsibility of collecting and disposing of dead animals on roadside was also raised by Cherry District Cllr Scales would make further enquiries with the District Authority on this.
- Equipment status report Fencing has now been completed to petanque courts and memorial, bringing the end to the Recreational Project first started in 2011. Refurbishment and replacement of parts to climbing frame/slide will be underway by time of publication and other items being dealt with; replacement of tarmac around grind rails in skate-park and the attention to flaking paint on cross-trainer gym equipment by manufacturer. Removal of a tree causing concern to adjoining property and street lighting will be undertaken rear of Beatrice Road/Lancaster Avenue. Crime Reports (PCSO Gretel May)/Neighbourhood Watch Plants stolen from flower boxes in Old Dover Road, if you have any information, please contact PCSO Gretel May on 07772 226209.
- <u>Traffic/Road Improvements</u>, <u>Highways & Public Rights of Way</u> Lorry parking in village continues to be on-going with District Cllr. Scales pursuing prohibition signage. Negotiations continue on extension of footpath to rear school gate for bike/scooter route.
- <u>Development of Land South of New Dover Road</u> Further contact with Developers requesting their timeline for application submission. Details will be advertised via Parish Council website, Facebook Page and email database system. Please let Parish Clerk know if you wish your email address to be added to the database system for notification, if you are interested in commenting on any applications.

The Certificate was signed by the KALC Chairman and the High Sheriff of Kent and was presented by Mr Ray Evison, Chairman of KALC at the Parish Council meeting on Tuesday, 19th May 2015.

At long last the General and local Election is behind us and things start to settle down again. Locally the elections will have produced some new faces who may have been elected into local politics for the first time or old faces who have done the circuit before. Either way one thing is for sure they form a dedicated team across the District, irrespective of their political persuasion, to try to help the community where ever possible.

There are others who are dedicated every day trying to help as well. They are fraudsters whose sole interest is to help them-selves, by relieving you of your money. As a result of the internet, the majority of these criminals are faceless characters whom you may never meet, other than perhaps on a very rare occasion in a court of law when they are caught, eventually.

So what is the best place to attack, to get their hands on as much of your money as possible? This can be at your home or at your bank. Let us start at home first. On line banking has saved customers a lot of time being able carry out transaction on IPads or mobile phones etc and this is where the criminal performs a deception. The first part of that deception is to send you a genuine looking email purporting to be from the bank. After convincing you they are genuine bank operatives they will ask you to carry out certain plausible actions in order to drain your bank account before you even realise it has occurred.

Here are 8 things a fraudster may request you to do at your bank, that a bank will never ask you to do.

- 1) If a bank contacts you, using any method such as the internet, phone call etc., to check on a recent, or perhaps to confirm a high valued (in comparison to your normal spend) transaction. They will never request your PIN or to confirm any passwords.
- 2) Banks will never instruct couriers or other persons to attend your home address to collect your bank cards or request PINs. So never hand over your cards, PINs or passwords at the front door.
- 3) Banks will never ask you to transfer funds to a new account or request you to hand over money. However criminals may try to convince you that your account is at risk of cyber-attack or a corrupt employee, they will attempt to convince you to transfer your money into a new "safe account."
- 4) Banks will never ask you to carry out a "test" transaction on line. Fraudsters may.
- 5) Banks will never send you an email with a link to a website that asks you to enter your online banking details. This is known as 'phishing.'
- 6) Banks will never ask you to email or text personal or banking information.
- 7) Banks will never provide banking services through 'mobile apps' other than the bank's official app.
- 8) Banks will never cold call you advising you to buy diamonds, land or other commodities. Reputable investment firms never cold call. If a bank contacts you via letter, email, phone call or text and they are requesting any of the above and then attend your bank in person to verify the request is genuine. Further if you carry out regular internet purchases, open a separate account and keep a small balance in that account, using that account only for internet purchase. If you transfer money from another account to your internet account, then have the transaction carried out inside the bank building as opposed to over the internet so you do not leave an electronic trace that a criminal could pick up on. Keep just a small balance in your internet account so if you are attacked by fraudsters you should not lose too much money.

As we approach Summer, we may be approached by a visitor to these shores requesting directions to some location. Be aware at all times they may only want your money/valuables. One current method is they may be in a car and stop to request directions, often at a petrol station. You provide directions; they appear so pleased they attempt to repay your kindness by giving you what may appear to be a valuable article, such as a jewel studded bracelet. They have hooked you. Once you accept it, they will then say they are very low on petrol and could you give them sufficient money to pay for petrol to fill their car. Whatever you offer they will always press for more, before they drive away from the petrol station with your cash but without putting petrol in their car. They know you have money because they will have seen you fill your car and pay for it. So remember if they want to repay your kindness for giving directions, walk away.

Stagecoach has informed Kent County Council that they will be implementing a fares increase on 24th May 2015, to cater for increased operating costs. It is intended that KCC'S increase will be applied by operators on either 24th/31st May or 7th June and will see the minimum fare raised to £1.00 and an approximate 3-5% increase across all over fares. Precise increases will be as follows:

Current fares of £0 - £1.00 = raised to £1.00 minimum fare Current Fares of £1.01 - £3.00 = plus 10 pence





Below are reproduced the minutes of the Village Hall Committee. Included in them are some issues many will recognise for today. Remember that the site referred to is now part of Elizabeth Drive, that the currency of the day was pounds, shillings and pence and that rationing would continue for another 7 years. Just as interesting is the language used, the titles of the 'Authorities' and best of all the idea of a couple of rabbits as a prize for the Ladies Competition

April 24 1947.

The meeting took place in Lancaster Stores. Present Mr Barry in the chair, Mrs Walter Hon Sec (other attendees listed).

It was proposed by Mr Clark & seconded by Mr Stirling that Mr Buckley should become Trustee of the Funds instead of Mr Gardiner. Proposed Mrs Walter, seconded Mr Barkers that Mr Backley should be on the Building Committee. Mr Clark enquired why it was that Mr Gardiner who was not on the Building Committee and had resigned from the Entertainment Committee was always invited to the Committee meetings. The Secretary explained that he was under the impression that being a Trustee implied that M Gardiner was on the committee in an ex official status, always invited, also friends were. Other names added en-block to the committee later in the evening were (names listed).

Mr Adams who undertook to find out the rights of the letting of the school gave his report. It as 'Mr Gardiner was right, the school building is the property of the Ecclesiastical Commission.' At the time of the building the subscribers knew it was to be a church school. The vicar, Mr Simpson supported Mr Gardiner in every detail'.

On Wednesday Mrs Walter and Mr Adams had an interview with Commander Bahin, Secretary of the National Council of Social Services. In the N.C. of S.S. there are entries for a Village Hall in Capel le Ferne in 1925, 1935, 1938 and 1946.

Mr Adams related the information gained on Wednesday 23 April. Briefly enquiries should be made to find if the Town and County Planning Authorities approved of the Village Hall being placed on the site. Particulars of buildings loaned temporarily by the NCSS. (Mr Taylor had brought these matters before the committee on April 3)

- 1. The building will be the property of the N.C. of S.S.
- 2. It will be delivered free to the site
- 3. The erection will be by local contractors. The cost will be borne by NC subject to its approval of estimated which can include partitions, kitchens, lavatories. The VH Committee will pay the contractors but recover the amount from the NC.
- 4. Rent £3 per annum for 3 years minimum, renewal annually thereafter. The NC reserve the right to remove the building at the expiration of the agreement.

Commander Bahin advised that a public meeting be held to raise enthusiasm. He would address the meeting. He also wished to view the site. It was agreed that the Secretary should make arrangements for the Public Meeting and get handbills to advertise it. She should also approach D.R. Council re the approval of the T&C planning authorities. Also that Mr Adams should let members of the building control know when Commander Bahin could view the site. Mrs G Hartley and Mrs T Hartley spoke of the work of the Women's Institutes and it was arranged that the women members of this committee should meet at Mrs Hartleys on Monday 9 inst bringing one or two friends who were interested. That she should also approach D.R. Council to find out how to get the approval of the Authorities of the Town and Planning.

May 9th 1947

The meeting was held at Pando by kind invitation of Mr and Mrs Stirling. The minutes were read and confirmed. A reply had been received from Mr Armstrong, the Dover Rural Council's Building Surveyor asking for a map of the village hall site and an informal application for permission to erect the temporary building thereon. The secretary had fulfilled the request.

The secretary mentioned the various correspondences with K Social Services and referred to the visit of Mr Barry and herself to Commnader Bahin in 1938which was quite evidently bearing fruit now.

Also R Mr Taylor had brought the fact that temporary buildings were being loaned to other villages. The date of the coming Garden Fete was fixed for June 28 (Saturday). Mrs Clayton proposed and Mr Clark seconded that it should be held at the school. Mr Sterling and Mrs Clark agreed to form a Committee for sport. For refreshments the following items were promised ½ lb tea Mrs Walter, coffee Mrs Buckley and Mrs Cooper saccherne Mrs Wills. Other promises had been given at the meeting at Mrs Hartleys. Mr Newbold had arranged about Mr Parrishes Mobile van and would confirm the date. The secretary agreed to see Mrs West about ice creams and Mrs Abbott about lemonade.

May 20th 1947

The meeting was held at Pando by kind invitation of Mr and Mrs Stirling. The minutes were read and confirmed. Mr Clark stated that Mr Warman wished to resign from the VH committee. He sent 10/- towards the sports fund for the fete. It was decided that the secretary should write to Mr Warman accepting his resignation with regret and thank him for his gift. Correspondence:

- 1) The correspondence secretary read a letter from Mr F Taylor in which he regretted being obliged to resign from the committee owing to pressure of work. The secretary to reply to this with deep regret and appreciation of work done by Mr Taylor.
- 2) A letter from Commander Bahin was read in which he gave the address of an architect. It was Geoffrey Ridley Esq.C.B.E. telephone Dover 543 13 Victoria Park Dover.
- 3) A letter from Mr Daniels was read in which he gave permission for the use of one of his meadows to the VH committee for sports on June 28 and in which he wished them every success.
- 4) Town and Country Planning Acts 1932c and 1943 and Country Planning (General Interim Development Order) 1945. A form from the above authorities received which; hereby permit the land situated in Lancaster Ave Capel to be used for a temporary hut to be used as a village hall. The form was signed by Mr W. F. Abbott clerk to the DRC, dated 7th May 1947.

The secretary stated that she had seized the opportunity of buying

5 doz cups at 9/- per doz £2.5 2 doz saucers at 6/- per doz 12 4 doz tumblers at 3/6 per doz 14 Also paying the Semark for use of Room 25th March, 4th April, 24 April 12 £4. 3.

The amount to be paid by sale of small gift therefore a further statement will be made. The sports committee reported progress as did all other workers. A plan of the handbills was drawn up, the Sec to get printed. 30th May 1947
