News from the Farmers' Market



After a slow start from the cool spring, growers and producers are now at full stretch leading up to the summer solstice in June. Capel le Ferne market has far more to offer than just traditional fruit, vegetables and meat. We sell everything from fresh fish and meat to a wide range of pickles, ready prepared dishes and ingredients, as well as wonderful cakes and breads. There is a craft section and a postal service. The benefits of buying at our market are wide ranging, and include the chance to taste before buying so you know exactly what you are getting. By going directly to the source, you can find out at first-hand how the produce was grown or made as well as be given you tips on storing and cooking to help make the most of your purchase. Because you are buying locally and seasonally, pricing is usually competitive with the supermarkets and often cheaper so don't fall for the idea that markets are an expensive luxury. I find my FM fruit and veg keeps better that that from the supermarket. Make a perfect risotto paired with the first tender broad beans (freshly picked little pods can be enjoyed whole) and fresh green peas and stir in a herb butter at the end of cooking once the grains are tender (just whiz butter up in a blender with a handful of mint, parsley, basil and chives). Other vegetable good buys are crisp radishes, spring onions, spinach, and of course **new potatoes**. There are also **early cucumbers, runner beans, spinach and courgettes**, alongside all kinds of salad leaves now in season. It's also the ideal time to plant out 'ready to plant' herbs and summer bedding plants, also available at the Capel le Ferne Farmers' Market.

The long days and the warmth herald the start of the great English soft fruit season with **strawberries** already on sale. Kevin's are some of the best I've ever tasted. One great advantage of local markets is the chance to try some of the finer flavoured varieties. More robust berries grown to withstand the rigours of the supermarket supply chain may not have the same flavour. The finest local **cherries** (Kentish cherries are justifiably world famous), gooseberries and early raspberries are not far away now. A great way to serve raspberries, cherries and strawberries is to crush them slightly, sprinkle with a little Kentish cherry brandy or Italian vin santo and sugar then leave to macerate for an hour. Serve spooned over vanilla ice cream. **Spring lamb** is now at its very finest now and perfect on the barbecue or as a joint simply roasted and served with baby new potatoes and minted broad beans and peas. You can order in advance from Debbie. On the fish front our FM fisherman lives in the village —you can't get more local than that! If your visit to the market coincides with a sunny period, plan the perfect picnic. Fill your basket with locally made cheeses, pates or Scotch egg. Then just add a loaf of artisan bread baked that day, some chutney or relish, a bag of cherries and maybe a punnet of strawberries and you are all set. A bottle or two of beer or chilled white wine and you have the makings of a feast.

Many, many apologies to our wonderful fish stall at the Farmers' Market for accidentally not including them in the list of attendees. You can find Sue in the entrance alternate weeks selling the fish caught by her husband. The scallops this year have been amazingly full of flavour, one of the big advantages of buying local.

Kent County Council is calling for the Department of Health to reconsider its plans to change funding of community pharmacies, over fears it could lead to dozens of rural and suburban sites closing. KCC Cabinet Member for Public Health and Adult Social Care, Graham Gibbens, is writing on behalf of the Council, to express concerns about a current consultation which proposes a six per cent cut. Council members say it would have a considerable impact on access to pharmaceutical services, in particular those that serve rural villages and to specific members of the population, such as the vulnerable and elderly. It's believed over a quarter of Kent's 280 pharmacies could be affected adversely by the proposal, leading to reductions in services and even closures. Though I have it on good word, that there will be no pharmacy closures in the Dover West area, though I will monitor the situation. Graham Gibbens said: "We have numerous suburban communities in Kent served by small pharmacies which could be at risk, as they are dependent on NHS income to remain viable. The pharmacies provide valuable services in these rural areas, often acting as a community hub to the village and preventing social isolation; we are concerned this will be lost. "We are disappointed by the consultation and its proposals which come at a time when we should be using our pharmacies even more to reduce the burden on GPs and A&Es. We are standing up for rural and isolated residents, along with local pharmacies who are an important community link and business provider therefore we are calling for the plans to be reconsidered."

The Health and Social Care Act 2012 transferred responsibility for the Pharmaceutical Needs Assessment (PNA) from the Primary Care Trusts to the Health and Wellbeing Boards on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013. The Kent Health and Wellbeing Board undertook a thorough review of all the pharmaceutical services in Kent and published its PNA in 2014. It found that although overall pharmaceutical service provision in Kent was good, it was felt that the current provision of "standard 40 hour" pharmacies should be maintained especially in rural villages and that the current provision of "100 hour" pharmacies should also be retained.

The Department of Health consultation is also considering a Pharmacy Access scheme and Kent County Council has asked to be involved in this. It is appealing for consultation with all relevant stakeholders, such as the Health & Wellbeing Boards, before any changes are made. *Geoffrey Lymer, Kent County Councillor, Dover West Ward*

Summary of some items discussed at meetings on Tuesday, 17<sup>th</sup> May 2016



Welcome was extended to new co-opted member Mr Gordon Holliday. **Nomination of Officers:** The following were duly elected by members; Chairman – Keith Pilcher, Vice-Chairman – Chris Norris, **Delegates:** Neighbourhood Watch – Julie Shaw, Play Equipment – Keith Pilcher, Village Hall – Jayne Stone, Highways – Brian Tutt, Public Rights of Way – Viv Hale, Planning Committee (with Delegated Powers) – Gemma Greening, Gordon Holliday, Chris Norris, Keith Pilcher and Brian Tutt, Events – deferred to a later date.

• Request from the public to address the Council: None. Surgery and Other Feedback: CCTV system update, increase in number of cameras and coverage discussed and would be addressed at a later date depending on cost and/or funding available, together with more specific details on requirements. • Neighbourhood Plan: See separate insert in this issue. Neighbourhood Watch: Community Warden had endeavoured to recruit new members. System of NHW notifications by Email Database and Facebook Page was favourable as a scheme and was working well. • Equipment status report: Nothing reported. • Highways and Public Rights of Way: Drain, ditches and gullies in Satmar area to be cleaned out to prevent flooding and other drainage issues reported to Kent Highways. • Planning: No further reports on the proposed developments of either sites of Land North and South of New Dover Road. Contact to be made, via Dover District Council, on concerns raised with South side being open and possible traveller use. • Other: Reported - one CCTV Camera required adjustment and a cupboard for housing both monitor and DVR was agreed. Insurance for play equipment etc., following quotations received, Hiscox was agreed. End of Year account 2015-16 were agreed and would be available on website following auditing.

Smoke prevents your neighbours from enjoying their gardens, opening windows or hanging washing out

It is appreciated that some people cannot see through gardens and bushes to see who are sitting in their gardens in the early evening, on the rare occasions when the weather is really good, or know that some people who are out at work, might put their washing out when they return, but bonfires seem to be prevailing again. After 6p.m. isn't unreasonable, but it is, if you don't get home from work until then. Some bonfires are so thick and all that can be seen, is the smoke blowing through the garden, some reported recently as early as 3pm. Government Legislation - Section 79 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990, refers to nuisances caused by smoke. It may well be that smoky bonfires could be a contravention of the Act if they occur on a regular basis, and prosecution may result. It is, however, the view of this Authority that most people are proud of their civic responsibility as they are of their own gardens, and will consider their neighbours before lighting a bonfire. Thank for considering our Village and our Neighbours.


