The display will be part of an inspection of the band, which is based at the Sir John Moore Barracks in Shorncliffe, Folkestone, by Headquarters Army Music, Kneller Hall. Dear Friends,

It was a Friday morning when the wind blew. From the office window at the Vicarage, Yours Truly saw the recycling bin on its side, and rubbish strewn across the garden.

I heaved the bin upright, wedged it against a wall, and replaced the rubbish inside. Then another gust of wind landed a neighbour's bin in the road, and its contents in our hedge.

Reminding myself to love my neighbour as myself, I righted my neighbour's bin and picked its contents out of the road. No sooner had I finished than another terrific gust of wind blew a cloud of card and paper along the street, along with a torrent of tins and cartons. Another gust took it all either into our hedge, or across our garden.

Now I had to love all of my neighbours at once. Filling a bin sack, I wondered - if I made a time capsule of my sack and buried it, what would our descendants make of our rubbish, discovering it years from now?

No milk bottles, but plastic milk cartons would date the hoard AM – After Milkmen. Cat food sachets would tell their own story. But what of the dozens of yoghurt pots, their labels carefully removed, or the blister packs?

A few cigarette packets and some beer cans would reveal our guilty pleasures – but our main vice would seem to be pies and cakes, nearly all from supermarkets. That packaging, and the catalogue that landed on the path, would show us to be tribe of shoppers.

The ring binder and papers on the lawn would show how our society was organised, and archaeologists would be fascinated by the writing on the scraps of paper raked from under the hedge.

However, the dustcart arrived, and these treasures showing how we lived and what mattered most to us were lost forever...



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Lions on track to help keep Air Ambulance flying at night

Night-flying Kent, Surrey & Sussex Air Ambulance is appealing for runners, swimmers and cyclists to sign up for this year's Tonbridge Lions Triathlon and help save lives 24 hours a day. Lions Clubs across the South East have pledged to raise £250,000 for the Marden-based charity over the next 10 years. The funds will be a significant contribution towards the additional £1million-a-year needed to provide a 24-hour service which was launched last month (December 18th). **The triathlon is to be held** on May 5th at Tonbridge School's sports complex which was used by the Australian Olympic team as a training base for the London 2012 games. Competitors can choose a sprint consisting of a 400-metre swim, 25km ride and 5km run or the standard route which is double the distance. Triathlon chairman Tom Simmons said: "This is the second year the Tonbridge Lions Club has arranged for the Tonbridge Triathlon to be linked up with Kent, Surrey & Sussex Air Ambulance. "We once again welcome the opportunity to be able to offer the means for the general public to take part in the triathlon and also raise funds for this much-loved and vital charity. "The Air Ambulance needs approximately £6m each year to maintain their service in the counties and provide 24- hour cover. The pilots, doctors and paramedics are extremely dedicated to their task and deserve all our support." Tonbridge was the first Lions club launched in the UK in 1949 and has raised more than £275,000 for charity in the last 10 years. The triathlon alone has raised more than £125,000 over 24 years and organisers are aiming to raise a total of £13,000 from this year's event.

There are 500 places available with an entry fee of £46 for the standard distance, £42 for teams of three and £39 for the sprint. To book a place go to www.tonbridgelions.co.uk or call 07549 949615.

CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of items discussed at meeting on Tuesday, 18th February.

- The meeting received no requests to address the Council. Community Recreational Project (Watch this space on page 7)!
- Equipment status Cllr: Pilcher attended training on "inspections of play equipment". Signs are to be fitted to play area gates stating no dogs allowed and including Police and Parish Council contact details. The fitting of automatic closures on the gates will be researched further for safety purposes. A regime will be addressed to replace some of the junior play equipment with requirements that will be recognised by village children. Increase of fees reported for Annual RoSPA Inspection this is as a result of additional equipment now on site. Speeding on B2011 Funding applied for via Police County Commissioner's fund to acquire a Digital Message Screen, solely for Parish Council use. Sharing a machine with other Councils will also be investigated further. Land Allocation Local Plan Thanks were expressed to Parish Councillor Chris Norris for his excellent exertions in discussing the village response with the Government Inspector recently. This was in connection with the three (3) sites in the plan; Land to the south of New Dover Road, between Capel Court Caravan Park and Helena Road, Land to the north of the junction of Capel Street and Winehouse Lane and Land between 107 & 127 Capel Street, together with Capel-le-Ferne's designation as a Local Centre. The Inspector will take into account the representations submitted on the Land Allocations Local Plan. The Inspector will now visit all areas and following the closure of the examination, will prepare a report with recommendations that will be binding.

- <u>Highways</u> Several issues had been raised regarding the Southern Gas Networks works in Cauldham Lane, including the road closure and flooding of diverted route. This was successfully dealt with by contractors Morrisons Utility Services. Emergency repairs listed for numerous pot-holes in the County. No further flooding had been reported in the Village during the recent atrocious weather conditions.
- <u>Neighbourhood Watch</u> Internet communications continue to be sent to residents on alert messages and information. Please contact Parish Clerk if you wish to be included on the email database, or "like" the Parish Council Facebook page, details below. PCSO Gretel May reported the following crimes; 2 lorries broken into (one on Old Dover Road and one in lay-by New Dover Road), and a number plate removed from vehicle in Cauldham Close. Kent Police continues to monitor speeding on B2011 at various locations and times.
- Anaerobic Digester Plant PlanningApplication Conditions on approved planning application still not finalised by Dover District Council. Other items Four (4) quotations received by members for the annual grass cutting contract in village. Agreement was reached to accept Harmers and Sons Grounds Maintenance for another year. Kent County Council confirmation had been received that Chantal Blythe would be leaving to be a full time Mum and not returning as our Community Warden. Unfortunately, KCC reported, "at this moment Chantal will not be replaced due to financial implications. This does not mean that there will never be a replacement, however Capel-le-Ferne will still be covered within the team on an adhoc basis (minimum of one and a half days) or whenever the need to deal with your issues or concerns". Councillors requested Clerk to write to various people on their concerns that "connection with the local community may be lacking without a full time Warden".

Next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday, 18th March at 7.30pm in the Village Hall (Small Hall).

This, luckily, has not thwarted our customers as you are all still coming along to support us, which is great.




