

"Nothing," I replied.

Stunned silence at the other end of the phone – understandably, perhaps. After all, if you want something, you usually expect to have to pay for it, and if it's any good it will cost you a fortune. No wonder that it came as a surprise to the caller to learn that their child could be christened at their local parish church without it costing them a penny.

Soon the Hallowe'en displays in the shops will have been replaced by the Christmas ones. Businesses survive by providing what people want - they have to make money, and Christmas provides an opportunity to make quite a bit of it. The shops will soon be full of things that we simply must have.

A while ago I read that years ago, when machines began to take over jobs that had been done by hand, there was panic. People would work less hours – so what would they do with their spare time? Then someone came up with an idea – convince them that they needed luxuries. Then they would happily go back to working long hours so that they could afford them.

Perhaps that is why we are often suspicious of things that are cheap, or even free – modern living has led us to believe that such things are worthless. This might be bad news for churches, which are in the not-for-profit business of helping people to find God and reach heaven and only charge what they need to when people want their services.

Children often have as much fun with cardboard boxes, than the expensive toys that come in them. As Christmas approaches, it is worth confronting our obsession with spending by remembering that some of the best things in life are still cheap, if not free.

We had home grown entertainment on the 11th of October when Mike Fawke, who lives in the Old Post Office in Capel Street, gave us a very interesting talk on 'The Role of a Ship's Pilot. Mike is a Pilot on the Medway; Swale and Thames Estuary. Many questions were asked and in spite of appalling weather there was a good audience.

Our last evening of the year will be on <u>Friday November 29th</u> when Dr Becky Parker will be giving us a talk on 'The Sky at Night' Dr Parker is a well-known authority on the subject and this is not a talk to be missed. Dr Becky Parker is Head of Physics at Simon Langton Grammar School Canterbury and has been awarded the first Patrick Moore Medal by the Royal Astronomical Society in recognition of her outstanding work as a teacher of Astronomy. She is a former Head of Education at The Institute of Physics and has established and is Director of The Langton Star Centre, a specialist facility with laboratories, classrooms and an astronomical observatory. 

CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of items discussed at meeting on Tuesday, 15th October.

SPEEDING ON B2011 & OTHER AREAS OF OUR VILLAGE – If you are concerned about this issue, PLEASE HELP!

The Councillors received speeding data from the flashing 40mph signs and concluded that this data indicated an extreme problem with vehicles speeding over 40mph. A presentation on "Kent Speed-Watch Scheme" was given to the meeting by a Kent Police Community Speed-watch Team Co-ordinator. This scheme would entail small groups of the community operating at the roadside to measure the speed of passing vehicles and recording the speed, registration number, make, model and colour of vehicle, together with time. A data sheet is then forward to Kent Police who will issue owners with "Warning Letters", following specific criteria. It was agreed in principle to implement this Scheme in the village and the Parish Council are <u>firstly</u> looking for <u>resident volunteers</u> to work along with Councillors on a rota basis to assist. If sufficient people come forward to help, training will be given free of charge by

the Speed-Watch Team and risk assessments of suitable areas undertaken.

If you would be interested and willing to help, please forward your details to the Parish Clerk (details below) for collating ready for the next meeting on 19th November, when a final decision will be made.

• Anaerobic Digester Plant Planning Application – Members received the Parish Council response document, together with copies of 15 resident responses and a 385 signatory petition, all of which had been sent to Dover District Council. This application was now subject to consideration by the Planning Department. If the application is to be considered by Dover District Council Planning Committee and you wish to speak at their meeting, the following link will take you to the web-page on how you can apply – "Speak on Planning Applications at Planning Committee Meetings" and by completing the form listed.

• The meeting received two requests to address the Council – (1) Anaerobic Digester Plant – Declined by resident at meeting. (2) Skate-park equipment - enquiry if a decision had been made on sound-proofing. • Repair status of Equipment and Noise Level of skate-park - Following investigations with Skate-park supplier on corrosion issue to steel side panels, these would be removed, rubbed down and painted. In view of this, a £200 reduction to the quotation for sound-proofing had been negotiated. Concern was expressed on warranty implications in the event remedial works are carried out. Before further expense incurred, this would be confirmed with supplier and discussed again at next meeting. • Encroachment of moss on Multi Use Goal Area reported. • 210 Tree saplings have been awarded to the Parish Council from Woodland Trust and are due for delivery in November. If you are able to give up some time and help plant them, please inform Parish Clerk and a date and time will be arranged. Community Recreational Project – (See page 7 for full report)! • Neighbourhood Watch – Reminder given on forthcoming NHW Meeting. PCSO reported two break-ins in the village during the last month. One from the area between the Battle of Britain site and the Valiant Sailor Public House and the other, from a resident's shed – both incidents were subject to the theft of tools and a bicycle. • Crime issues – If anyone has anything they would like Police to be aware of, please let them know. See Police insert below. • Highways - The Gas Network Company and Contractors (work on B2011 and Old Dover Road) are being invited to an on-site meeting to discuss concerns on work to date. Capel Street bollards installed will have reflectors fitted in due course by Kent Highways. The position of posts is to the standard Kent Highways' regulations and set in from the road so as not to disturb the concrete settings in the case of works to kerb side/highway or, opening of vehicle doors. Other items - District Councillor Scales reported; he had attended a training session on the National Planning Framework and would be emailing Councillors with hand-outs accordingly and that no details to date had been received from Inspectorate on Land Allocation Document. County Councillor Geoff Lymer reported an indication that Kent County Council are looking at parking around schools – this would be by way of sending out enforcement officers to target parking on zig-zag lines and obstruction of driveways and would issue "fixed penalty notices" accordingly.

Next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday, 19th November at 7.30pm in the Village Hall (Small Hall).

CAMPAIGN FOR NEW BUS ROUTE

Four years ago we suggested a new bus route (to Folkestone Town Centre), along Hill Road, into Canterbury Road and then into town, in addition to the Dover Road route. Unfortunately, we couldn't persuade Stagecoach. However, we now have four buses an hour, as does the Canterbury route. This petition suggests the 101 and 16A alternate along Hill Road, thereby not losing any buses but gaining a different route. Thereby Black Bull Road area could catch the Dover bus, and Dover Road area can catch the Canterbury bus. In addition, we Capel residents would gain easier access to Wood Avenue Library, Two Doctors Surgeries, Dentist, Chemist, Post Office, Hospital, Sports Centre, Railway Station then travelling into the Bus Station. It would also assist us on our journey into Canterbury, as we would not have to go right into the bus station first – we could transfer at Black Bull Road. We are conscious of your request and since you wrote to us in 2009 we have improved the bus service through Capel, which now runs every 15 minutes. Connections to the Canterbury Road can be obtained by changing buses at Keyes Place bus stop to and from route 71, which also runs every 15 minutes. During the off-peak routes 101 and 102 call at this stop at 08, 23, 38 and 53 minutes past each hour, whilst route 71 calls there at 11, 26, 41 and 56 minutes past each hour to provide a convenient connection. Returning from Canterbury Road the times on route 71 are the same (as the route in this area is a one way loop) and routes 101/102 call at the opposite stop known as Tyson Road at 20, 35, 50, and 05 minutes past the hour. We were conscious of your request for improved access to Canterbury Road when we made the improvement to the bus service to Capel. Average overall journey times should now be significantly shorter as a result of the more frequent services.

It is now well established that simple route patterns such as we have in East Folkestone with all the Dover buses following a common route via Dover Road and all the Canterbury buses following a common route via Canterbury Road are easier for people to understand and encourage greater use of buses, notably because such an arrangement enables us to have a more regular timetable. In practice Dover Road and Canterbury Road are close enough for most people to be able to walk between. Experience shows that where buses follow a different route at certain minutes past each hour, passengers don't wait an extra 15 minutes for the bus that takes them nearest to their destination, they just get the first bus that comes and walk, thus suggesting that the variations are frequently unnecessary.

Please rest assured that we are aware of your concerns and wish to continue to improve the bus service to Capel - we are for example hopeful that our discussions with Kent County Council will lead to a direct link from the re-developing Harbour to Capel.

November at Capel-le-Ferne Farmers Market

The clocks have gone back, we are heading into short days and cold nights, and we all crave a little comfort from the kitchen. Slow-cooked casseroles, satisfyingly starchy creamy mashes, rich flavoured roasts and warming puds all fit the bill perfectly so wrap up and head out for a trip to your local farmers market for inspiration. It's a treat for all the senses at this time of year especially if we get some late autumn sunshine to set off the hues of the season. This is also the month to place your orders for Christmas treats to pick up at the December markets so go prepared with your shopping list to ensure you get just what you want.

Game is the meat of choice for cooks in November as the season is well under way for birds such as pheasant, partridge and wild duck. Venison is available both farmed and wild in many markets, and makes a healthy choice as most wild game has 5% to 7% fat, compared to red meat such as lamb with 25% or more, depending on the cut. The lower fat content means careful cooking to avoid the meat drying out, so the old traditional slow cooking methods in stews and casseroles should be reserved for older game birds. Most game is very carefully selected and prepared by your game dealer and no longer hung to quite the same stage of 'gameyness'. Less strong and much more tender, it calls for more modern, time-friendly techniques such as flash frying, grilling or even home smoking are better suited to lean, tender cuts. Look online for ideas as plenty of chefs are discovering the joys of cooking with game. If you want to slow cook for great comfort eating, look out for the cheaper cuts of beef, lamb and pork – shin of beef, belly pork, or lamb neck all cook down to meltingly wonderful mouthfuls of flavour, perfect for colder days.

Root vegetables are at their tastiest now and perfect for mashes, gratins and soups – they improve with the cold and you will notice a marked difference in flavour from locally sourced varieties compared to supermarket specimens. Look out for parsnips, Jerusalem artichokes, swede and turnips. Try cooking peeled, cubed celeriac with a couple of cloves of garlic in the cooking water then mash with a big dollop of local produced butter to go with venison or roast beef. Main crop potatoes are full of texture and flavour and the varieties available locally are worth exploring. Ask the stallholder for advice on which potato to buy – the right one, floury or waxy, will make all the difference to the finished dish. The brassicas really come into their own this month too – kale, spring greens, and all kinds of cabbages are wonderful in stir-fries, soups, and hashes or just steamed with grated nutmeg and more butter! And red cabbage cooked with apple, spices and red wine is another seasonal treat to go with rich pork, or maybe a roasted wild duck.

Apples and Pears are available in abundance this year so try as many local varieties as possible – Bramleys are perfect for using in mincemeat and Christmas pudding so buy them ready for stir up Sunday at the end of the month. The eating varieties can be used in tarts and cakes.

Colder waters make for high quality fish and seafood, and as the temperature drops the range available just gets better. Dover sole, turbot and halibut are rightly considered the very finest eating by cooks and chefs. But also this month why not try some of the lower cost alternatives as many are at their best. <u>Security mark your valuables for safe-keeping</u>. If you've invested in an expensive new phone, tablet, power tool or bike, make sure you take steps to keep it safe from thieves. It takes seconds to security-mark your valuables and register them with an online property database, which could help the Police, identify them and return them to you if they get lost or stolen.

Security tips for caravans and holiday homes. Now the holiday season has ended, take a few extra measures to keep your holiday home or caravan safe over the winter months. Secure your property using adequate locks and take all valuables back home with you – don't tempt thieves. Consider fitting a burglar alarm or security lights to deter unwanted visitors, and leave your curtains open so that intruders can be spotted more easily if they enter. If you see anything suspicious, need to report a non-urgent crime or would like to talk to your neighbourhood officer, call Kent Police on 101.

<u>Scams (and how to avoid them).</u> Fraudsters are trying to trick people into handing over their bank cards and revealing their PIN numbers. Don't be fooled. This is how they do it:

- A fraudster telephones pretending to be the police or from your bank they claim your account has been used fraudulently.
- They tell you to hang up and call the police or bank back to ensure the call is genuine. They stay on the line so when you redial you think you are through to the police or your bank. But you're not. They then tell you to give them your PIN number.
- They send a taxi or courier to collect your card. With your card and PIN they can access your money.

Remember:

- The police and banks will never ask for your PIN or bank card over the phone. So never give them to anyone.
