#### From the Vicarage

One morning recently the telephone rang early. A couple of teachers at one of the schools I work at had rung in to say that they were sick. Could I work in school that day? That morning I discovered that the place had been infested with a cold bug, which was why they had called me in. Needless to say, a couple of days later I awoke with a tell-tale tickle at the back of my throat. This turned out to be no ordinary sniffle, but the full works. I had a list of jobs to do, and I soon found myself fretting about all the things I would have been doing if I hadn't been sitting around nursing a heavy cold. It actually seemed strange not to be rushing off and doing this and that. But then, checking my emails, I found one from another parish priest. It ended, "I hope you're not too busy."

Priests are supposed to pray – it's one of the things we have to promise to do. Discussing that with my friend a while ago made me realise that there are some days when, by spending the day in a school and the evening in a meeting, my prayers get neglected - too busy, as he pointed out, to keep my promises.

Rabbi Lionel Blue once suggested that prayer is like a cigarette – it allows you to pause, but without the health risks. In a strange way having a heavy cold. I've been reminded, has a similar effect. Not only has it made me pause, but it has also taught me how easily being busy becomes a habit – and not necessarily a good one. Whatever you're doing this month, I hope that you avoid the bugs – and that vou're not *too* busy... Brían

Are you eligible for the flu jab?

Protecting yourself against the flu has never been easier for the vulnerable, those people at risk, the young children, older people and pregnant women.

Children aged two to four years old, alongside people aged 65 or older, plus those with long term medical conditions not forgetting mums to be are amongst the priority to receive the vaccine.

These groups are more susceptible; flu can increase the risk of developing more serious illnesses such as bronchitis and pneumonia, or can make existing health problems worse. In the worst cases seasonal flu could result in a stay in hospital, or though very scarce, could even prove to be fatal.

Young girls and boys can receive the vaccine as a nasal spray, instead of a jab. Having one can make a great difference, If you are being offered the opportunity to protect your children, then you should take it, it is not just important for them, but for the rest of the community too, as you are stopping the spread of the infection.

However, there are some misunderstandings and misconceptions about the vaccine so that some people do not feel confident to come forward and get themselves the best defence against the flu this winter.

#### So here are some myth busting examples.

#### You get the flu by having the vaccine!

It is impossible to get flu from having the flu jab. This is because the vaccine does not contain any live viruses. A very small number of people experience side effects, that are similar to those of flu, such as aching muscles, but this is actually your immune system responding to what it thinks is an attack of flu.

#### You won't get the flu if you are healthy!

Anyone can pick up the flu virus, even if you are generally in good health. Usually 15-20% of the population gets the flu each year and it is possible to pass it to those who are vulnerable, as mentioned at the beginning of this article, the very young, those over 65, those with long term medical conditions, such as cardiac or pulmonary problems, cancer etc and pregnant mums to be.

#### The flu vaccine is not safe!

The seasonal flu vaccine is one of the safest vaccines in the world and is given to millions of people in the UK each year. The specific strains of flu that are included may change from one year to the next, but that does not affect the safety of the vaccine or change it in any way.

If you are still not convinced after reading this article, then have a look at <u>www.kent.gov.uk/Health</u>, or have a word one of the surgery nurses. Oh yes, that's another myth, they don't bite! (It is rumoured)!

Also small clips to attach plant pots to trees! As he spoke, we watched him twisting and turning strong plastic tubing, entranced by what he was producing next! A very informative and inspiring talk was enjoyed by all. His on-line company is called Plant support products if anyone wants to know more of what he provides. Our next meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> November is entitled 'Rivers – Windmills – Canals' (see separate poster). The group of us who visited Newnham Court Shopping Village of Maidstone, starting with an excellent lunch at the Inn, had a good day out with a look around Notcutts Garden Centre prior to a talk from a member of staff about 'Spring bulbs'. With a very hesitant staff speaker, beginning her talk half an hour later than advertised, and rather expensive prices for plants and bulbs, we were ready to return home before the rush hour traffic (which we managed!) Well done to the two teams representing CapelARA at the Area Quiz challenge in Ashford on the 16<sup>th</sup> October. One of our teams came 3<sup>rd</sup> – so congratulations! We have recently tried a new layout of the stalls, and would appreciate your feedback on it. The Weekly Draw was also put in place to encourage spending with the winning vouchers!

Sadly we are still short of stalls, and we are searching for more to join us. As you know, we have all the basics provided, but it is also nice to have a few for those extra special 'treats' and to fill the hall. If you have any requests, please let us know, and we will endeavour to find them, although we cannot make any promises! We are pleased that Sandgate Bakery are now slowly getting back to normal, which is great news. During their problems, we would like to thank Cottage Loaf for standing in for them. The Flapjack Company are away at the present time, but will be returning late October. Due to lack of sales we have now lost Beth's Mogador, which is such a shame as she is very local, living in Capel! We have also lost Butterbox Fudge, again due to lack of sales, but we do have a new Fudge stall joining us – Meander – who live in Capel, so again very local, we do hope you will support them.

Due to personal circumstances Jenny has decided to stand back a little from the organising of the Farmers Market after nearly 12 years. She will still be 'on board', but this, unfortunately, puts pressure on Cherry. Julie and Maggie have kindly offered to assist by adding their names to our great list of volunteers, covering holidays, sickness etc, but not actually run the market behind the scenes. This still leaves us short of someone to actually take over the running of the market – can you help? Without someone to actually do this, there is a good probability that the market will close.
