The accounts were sent to the auditor just after the year end (30th September) and return just in time for the Annual Meeting on **28th November at 7.00 p.m.** This meeting is open to all – an opportunity for residents to ask questions and maybe even thank the committee for their work. Either way it would be really encouraging to see someone in the audience, so note the date in your diary.

CALL FOR NEW COMMITTEE MEMBERS

As secretary, Sally Cook has written to various organisations inviting them to appoint committee members for the next 12 months. Additionally, any resident can nominate someone for election to the committee. This year Julie Young and Jenny Barraclough have retired from the committee, creating 2 vacancies. We would like to reiterate earlier thanks for their many years of help and support on the committee. Would you – or do you know someone who - would like to get involved? The time commitment is a minimum of the monthly meeting on the first Tuesday evening in each month and your involvement can be tailored to match your interests, skills of expertise. Without help the hall would not remain open and no one really wants it to close. It does belong to the local community and receives no regular official income and no professional help in managing it.

REFURBISHMENT PLANS

It's over 30 years since the hall was built and we have identified a number of areas where refurbishment is needed. Disabled access, upgrade to the disabled toilet, windows, flat roof, floor and redecoration. It can't all be done at once. In some ways that might be easier but at the moment it can't all be funded yet and, unless some hero comes forward, project managing it as a single event is more than any of the committee feel able/have time to do. On the other hand, if you have the time and inclination to help, we'd love to hear from you. The various elements are being costed, though we do have an idea of just how expensive it all will be. When we can, we will apply for grants to help, but of course there is no guarantee these applications will be successful.

News from the Farmers' Market



Capel le Ferne Farmers' Market is a member of Kent Farmers' Market Association which was formed in 2007 following a study commissioned by Produced in Kent and carried out by the Kent Business School. This established the considerable value that Farmers' Markets had on the local economy (nearly £3m per year).

KFMA say "We believe passionately that Farmers' Markets provide shoppers with higher quality, more nutritious, easily traceable, fresher local food and drink. In addition, they give Kent's farmers and small food enterprises the opportunity to sell direct to the public and so get a fair price for their products, and offer the chance for communities to get together, and often to replace a closed village shop.

So, where better to find the best and freshest food around than at the Farmer's Market every Tuesday?

Fresh fruit and vegetables, are still available are plentiful and very good quality. Onions, leeks, beetroot, carrots and tomatoes are all full of flavour at this time of year. Root vegetables such as parsnip, swede and celeriac are all wonderful roasted or mashed and perfect with new season's game. Use them in soups, stews, bakes and pickles for rich seasonal colour and taste.

If you usually buy your fruit from the supermarket you'll be amazed by the choice of varieties, flavours and textures of apples at our market. The fruit is freshly harvested, direct from the farm to you. Later in the season fruit is stored to keep it in peak condition. You could eat a different variety every day of the year and never get bored.

Don't miss out on all the best local apples and pears. The later ripening varieties are good for keeping so you will be able to enjoy from now until next summer. Make into pies, crumbles and cakes or try baked with spices and brown sugar.

Seafood is at its best when caught from colder waters so as the sea temperature drops, fish just gets better. Sea bass, haddock and Dover sole will be fishing well.

"Recipe boxes and veg boxes: pre-order for pick up or home delivery"

Capel-le-Ferne's Farmers' Market are making it even easier to shop with them. You can now pre-order direct from the producers and pick up at the market, making it easier for you to plan your meals. If you're doing a big shop or are finding it difficult to get to the market they also do home deliveries, both in the afternoon and in the evening.

They have even put together veg boxes and recipe boxes - kits that contain all the ingredients you need to cook a meal. In an effort to reduce waste, delivery comes in crates which they then take away to reuse. If you aren't in you can order cool boxes for a small returnable deposit.

We hope this initiative will bring more people to Capel-le-Ferne and support our local farmers and procurers. Please spread the word and drum up support for this new venture.

CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of some items discussed at meeting

on Tuesday, 18th October 2016



• **Request from the public to address the Council, Surgery and Other Feedback:** Hedgerows requiring cut back opposite Amin Stores and Battle of Britain site – reported to Kent Highways. 20mph speeding vehicles ignoring new limit – Speedwatch Scheme to be resurrected to hopefully educate drivers to “slow down”. • **Neighbourhood Plan:** A disappointed attendance was reported to discuss initiating a Neighbourhood Plan document for the future of Capel-le-Ferne developments and needs. Councillors decided “due to lack of response, interest and support to defer, unless someone comes forward to help”. • **Neighbourhood Watch:** Speeding and parking continues to be an issue in the village especially in Lancaster Avenue. Accidents on B2011 noted. Care of the elderly in our Village (see separate insert on page 9 “Capel Cares”). • **Equipment status report:** Flower box refurbishment complete. Monitoring of equipment continues – please report any defects noticed to Parish Clerk. • **Highways and Public Rights of Way:** Reinstatement of road markings done in Lancaster Avenue, other areas awaiting Kent Highways to complete. As you may be aware due to continuing reductions in local government funding KCC have to make tough decisions on where to improve traffic and road safety in local areas. This means we have to say 'no' more than we'd like, especially if the request won't reduce casualties. I can confirm that the current safety record around this area has been checked and does not meet our current criteria for the implementation of carriageway roundels. Enforcement is the responsibility Kent Police therefore concerns over speeding should be directed to them, they can be contacted on their non-emergency telephone number 101. I'm sorry I cannot be more positive at this moment in time but I wish to reassure you the County Council takes road safety very seriously and reducing the number of people injured on our roads is one of the County Councils top priorities. Apart from the obvious unpleasant effects of dog fouling there are potential health risks. Dogs can be affected by several types of worm, one of which can cause serious illness in children. It is important that you:

- clear dog mess from public places and your own garden
- worm your dog every 6 months
- wash your hands after playing with dogs
- train your dog to go at home and take a plastic bag and poop scoop when you go out

It is an offence for any person in charge of a dog not to remove any faeces deposited by a dog in their charge. Anyone found guilty of an offence will be issued with a fixed penalty ticket (currently £75 fine). This gives an opportunity to discharge liability to prosecution. Should the fine not be paid, or offences be persistent we may prosecute with a maximum fine of £1000.

The main idea is to help keep elderly villagers in their own homes for as long as possible, where possible, but also, give any support required to other residents, can be investigated.



<p>SUNDAY NOVEMBER 6th</p> <p>2.00pm</p>	<p><u>Jellicoe and Jutland - Richard Latham.</u> Richard Latham is a grandson of Admiral of the Fleet Earl Jellicoe – The Commander in Chief of The Grand Fleet at Jutland -and his only descendant to serve in the Royal Navy. The Centenary of The Battle of Jutland – the largest Sea Battle in history – was commemorated on 31st May this year and he was at sea in a type 45 destroyer to represent the family at a wreath laying on the site of the Battle on that day. Richard Latham's Naval career began with gaining a Naval scholarship to Dartmouth in 1959 and he then served in various ships in 1963/64 including the Aircraft Carrier HMS Victorious in the Far East Fleet and was on active service during the confrontation with Indonesia in 1964. After leaving the Royal Navy in 1966 he was initially employed in the shipping industry and joined the Royal Naval Reserve. He then followed a career in Investment Management and more recently in the Oil and Gas industry. <u>Talk Summary -</u> The talk will cover the history of the Royal Navy during the First World War and compares the relative importance of Jutland with Trafalgar as well as Jellicoe's contribution to victory in WW1.</p>
<p>SUNDAY NOVEMBER 20th</p> <p>2.00pm</p>	<p><u>"A Choppy Passage in The Royal Navy - How I accidentally sank an Enemy Submarine".</u> <u>Commander Colin Tozer RN (rtd).</u> Colin Tozer graduated from The Britannia Royal Navy College, Dartmouth in 1975 as a Sub Lt in the Executive Branch. After 12months sea training, he joined HMS JUNO as the Communications Officer where he achieved his Bridge Watch-keeping and Ocean Navigation qualifications. Having spent over 3years travelling the world in these ships, he spent the next 15 months on Fishery Protection duties in UK waters as the Navigating Officer in HMS Anglesey. His next ship was HMS Brilliant, a brand new ASW Frigate, in which he went to South Georgia and the Falklands War in 1982. He then navigated a frigate, HMS Lowestoft for 12 months before his successful graduation from the RN School of Maritime Operations as a Principal Warfare Officer. Subsequent appointments took Colin to Australia and Canada together with further sea appointments as a Warfare Officer and then as the Executive Officer (2nd in Command) of HMS Cardiff. After a period in command, he came ashore where he spent another 10years or so as a Staff Officer working for Flag Officer Surface Flotilla and The Second Sea Lord. He was promoted to Commander on 2001 and retired in 2004. <u>Talk Summary -</u> This talk is the story of Commander Tozer's experiences in submarines and ships leading up to the largely untold capture of South Georgia in the South Atlantic. He then take you through the true story of how the Argentinian submarine 'Santa Fe' was sunk, a story which has never been told until now.</p>






