<u>From the Vicarage</u>

I was approached recently by someone who asked me: "What is the Church doing about Muslims?"

He went on: churches are closing, mosques replacing them; the Archbishop of Canterbury says nothing; look at what's happening in the world; something should be done.

Taken aback at first, I pointed out that churches only usually close once they run out of money, that actually the Archbishop has had plenty to say, and that the minority responsible for the horrors that have made headlines recently are hardly representative of the 23% of the world's population who belong to its second largest religion. As for what should be done, he couldn't expect a vicar to go along with what he suggested. The Crusaders tried that centuries ago, and it did nobody any good.

I heard a powerful sermon from the Bishop of Jerusalem when I visited the Holy Land in July. As missiles fell on Gaza, he thundered: Jesus clearly expects a harvest from his followers - peace, not war; love, not hatred.

I would like to have told our friend that Jesus taught his followers to love their enemies and pray for those that hate them - and stuck with the idea even as he was nailed to the cross. Treat those who we think of as our enemies with love, and they stop being our enemies – that's the logic. Perhaps not so easy when we are angry and anxious about what we read in the newspapers.

Peace, not war; love, not hatred. More people in our world should try it. Brian



Summary of some items discussed at meeting on Tuesday, 16th September.



• Request from the public to address the Council: None received • Main Modifications to Land Allocation Local Plan – Three (3) forum sessions had been held when Parish Councillors answered questions and noted residents' views. The Planning Committee would now produce their response, for the Government Inspectorate's attention, on Dover District Council's Consultation for the Main Modifications to policies and sites in the village. • Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople Local Plan - Sustainability Appraisal (SA) Scoping Report (see below) – Agreed by those present, no sites to be recognised by Parish Council. • Equipment status report – Petanque Court future usage meeting - (see separate report below), was attended by approximately 27 residents, a good response and thanks to those attendees for support. Fencing to the Petanque area is being investigated further for costs, with the possibility of providing two (2) gates for ease of retrieving boules. Cut back of vegetation to BMX Trail area to be carried out. Refurbishment of the climbing frame/slide to be carried out. Swings and moving parts on other equipment had been lubricated. Gym equipment instruction sessions in Spring to be investigated further. The replacement of some of the Junior Play Area equipment is still being discussed with children of the village. Two (2) waste bins in Old Dover Road replaced and two (2) more installed on the Playing Field. • Crime Reports – None received. • Speed Watch Scheme – Thanks were expressed to all trained residents and Councillors. Only two further volunteers had come forward to help. The long-term future of the scheme will be deferred until the next Parish Council meeting and discussed further under an Agenda Item: Prioritising Traffic and Calming Management in Village. • Highways - Closure of Dover Hill for Kent Highways to carry out "urgent essential carriage way works on patching and repairs", will now take place in half-term week beginning 27th October. The Dover Hill will be completely closed (both ways), for up to 5 days. "Alternative route for through traffic is via A260 Hill Road, Canterbury Road, White Horse Hill, A20 Trunk Road, Courtwood Interchange, B2011, Folkestone Road, New Dover Road and Dover Hill. Due to nature of these works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours. These works are weather dependant and if adverse conditions prevent them going ahead on planned dates shown, revised dates will be advised".

CAPEL-LE-FERNE VILLAGE HALL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

We have been looking back at old minute books. The very first meeting, before the old hall was built, gave an insight into the community at that time. Older residents may remember some of the names and events; younger ones may be interested in the history of the Old Village Hall which was demolished in the 1980s.

In 1938 there was a building committee of 9 people and an entertainment committee of 17 and another 30 attended the first public meeting. The minutes, which are all in immaculate long hand, are reproduced below:

Mrs Walter was elected General Secretary on the resolution of Mrs Russell and Miss Brown. The Trustees, to act as Treasurers. Chairman Mr T J Barry was elected, proposed Mr Adams, seconded Mrs Walter. Mrs Walter was appointed Press Secretary. Proposed Mr Adams, seconded Mr Howie, that all associations be invited to send representatives. Mr Butcher proposed a vote of thanks to Capel Variety Club whose excellent show had raised £10. It was proposed by Mr Adams, seconded Mr Hogben and agreed, that the Secretary draw up an appeal for Subscriptions to the Fund with the Secretary's Name printed on it. Mr Goodwin proposed, Mr Alkins seconded, that a list of Shares at £1 each be asked for from the Village. To be paid out by an Annual Ballot free of interest. This was carried. There following, announced their willingness to take up shares (*there is a list of 21 names*). The next public meeting was fixed for Monday, 4th April at the School at 8.pm.

Meeting of Trustees and Building Committee – Tuesday, Mar 22nd at the School at 8pm.

Entertainment & Social committee, 8pm, Thursday 24th at Tai Ping at 7.30pm at the invitation of Mr Atkins.

The Trustee and Building Committee meeting was recorded as: Rev D Morgan's resignation from the Committee owing to lack of time was received with regret. Proposed Mr Russell, seconded Mr Mann, that the owner of the site be asked to come upon the committee.

The time to view the sites, were settled as follows. Mr Hartley's land at 3 pm. Mr Copping's at 4pm on Saturday.

The Secretary to find out if this was convenient to Mr Copping and Mr Hartley. The Secretary to order cards (300) which would act as application for allotment and receipts of £1 shares.

The next public meeting on 4th April, attend by about 100 people was recorded as:

Mr Barry (*Chairman*) explained that the object of the meeting was to decide which piece of land was to be accepted; that offered by Mr Hartley or that offered by Mr Copping.

Plans which indicated the positions and relative sizes of the plot were drawn on BBS.

The Chairman stated that there was no restriction of Mr Hartley's land, but Mr Copping had stipulated that the building was to be erected in two years. The ballot was then taken and resulted in 76 for Mr Hartley and 9 for Mr Copping.

The Secretary read the correspondence and the Subscription list and gave an account of the information obtained from the N.P. of S.S and Physical Fitness Council. Resolution: Mr Rantors proposed, Mr Hiscock seconded, that the building committee be left to get on with the work until there was something definite to put before the Public.

At the end of the meeting the Subscription List showed gifts of £73.14.6 and 15 one pound shares were paid up. Amounts under £1 were 7-6. (7 shillings and 6 pence). Total £89.2.0.

Vehicle excise duty was first introduced into the United Kingdom during 1889, but it was not until 32 years later from the 1st January 1921, did it become compulsory to display a tax disc on a vehicle. These tax discs, also known correctly as vehicle excise licences, were issued either quarterly or annually and were made of a paper disc that was unperforated and printed in black on a white background. In 1923 Britain was introduced to the first of the coloured tax discs, which were also perforated. There have been approximately twelve subtly different designs of the disc from 1921 to the present day, the most striking change occurring from 1961, when the design was radically altered to start a style that is still vaguely similar today. Over those years many owners of vehicles have been either arrested or summonsed before a criminal court for the offences theft of a tax disc, fraudulent use of a tax disc, which was when a stolen tax disc was exhibited on another vehicle to give the impression to a passing police officer that that particular vehicle was taxed, when in fact it was not, due to it displaying a stolen disc, or when the owner of two or more vehicles used a tax disc from one vehicle to display on another to evade buying a disc for the second vehicle. Many serious crimes have been detected as a result of a stolen or different tax disc being fraudulently displayed on a vehicle, from an IRA bomber, I believe The Yorkshire Ripper was detained initially due to a different tax disc being displayed on the vehicle he was driving and not that long ago in Lincolnshire, a gang of Lithuanian car thieves, who were stealing good quality cars then 'ringing' them, (this means altering the cars identity). The gang had gone to great lengths to alter engine, chassis and registration plate numbers, carrying out a convincingly professional job, only to get caught out by the police because they forgot to alter the registration number displayed on the tax disc. So 93 years after the issue and display of the first tax discs, from this October, we will be seeing the final issue of the disc that has been a part of our motoring history. Oh no, before you start celebrating, you will still have to pay vehicle excise duty, but the perforated disc that has become part of our lives, will not be issued anymore for display on the vehicle. So how do you know if someone has or has not paid their road tax? You won't. But if they have not paid, they will, for they will receive a fine through the post. For all vehicle documentation is recorded against individual vehicle files. As you drive around a town, travel along a motorway, visit a supermarket car park, go to a Port, visit a petrol station or travel through the Dartford Crossing, you will probably not realise, but your vehicle registration plate will be monitored many times over on your long or short journey by ANPR (automatic number plate reader). Many police cars carry them too. The ANPRs will flag to the authorities automatically if your vehicle is checked by one of these cameras and your vehicle file held at DVLA discloses you have failed to pay road tax on your car, or your car is declared SORNed when the camera views/ records of it on a road. Further if you fail to pay your road tax or sorn your vehicle, the DVLA will fine you by post. You cannot transfer road tax upon selling your vehicle, so you may need to consider selling your car close to when your car road tax is about to fall due for renewal. A final word of advice for those who may live in their holiday home abroad, for a few months of the year and may keep a second car out there

permanently, still registered on UK plates. Some countries, example France, the Police Nationale/Gendarmerie determine whether your car is insured, incorrectly by looking to see if your tax disc is valid and if not displayed, or, out of date will often impound the vehicle never to be seen again. So if you have a UK registered car that remains permanently at your holiday home abroad, get it re-registered on the plates for that country so you do not fall foul of the local police and risk losing your vehicle.
