The Chairman of the Parish Council was welcomed to the Village Hall Committee meeting and exploratory talks on how the Village Hall and Parish Council might work closer together for the advantage of the local community. These talks are at a very early stage but bode well for the future.

The new dimmable lights are now installed – the dimmer switches are by the p.a. system. Initial feedback is that people like them and certainly the lights appear less harsh but just as bright. A big THANK YOU to all hirers who have put up with the disruption, and a sincere apology that our communications system fell down and not everyone was forewarned. Not what we would have wanted but there were circumstances beyond our control. Next step is painting the ceiling – Friday/Saturday/Sunday Bank Holiday weekend. Unfortunately the **hall will be closed daytime** while this happens. We did explore many other options but the painters need full daylight to see the ceiling properly and the work needs doing during the school holidays. While we're sprucing up the hall the kitchen is due a facelift but at the moment we don't know the dates.

Good news for those who hire the small hall -30 new chairs are being ordered with comfort in mind. Some will have arms, but storage issues means that the number is limited. They will be suitable for meetings and craft activities will need to use the old folding plastic chairs. Glitter and glue on the expensive chairs will not be appreciated.

The specification for works to the front entrance has been agreed and the intention is that work will commence next year. An architect will need to be commissioned to produce the drawings, planning permission sought and the fund raised.

This year we will be running a Last Night of the Proms event; if it is successful it could become a permanent event. Please join us for the evening – more fun than watching on your own at home.

THANK YOU TO HALL USERS OF THE NEED TO KEEP NOISE WITHIN REASONABLE LIMITS, ESPECIALLY

WHEN THE DOORS AND WINDOWS ARE OPEN. We are grateful that hirers are considering neighbours.

If the volume is raised then doors and windows should be kept shut.

Music should stop at 11.30. (Unless a successful application for an extension has been made.) REMEMBER THE HALL IS WELL USED BY MANY RESIDENTS AND IF WE LOSE THE LICENCES THE IMPACT WILL BE FELT BY ALL THE ORGANISATIONS' MEMBERS.

Capel has an active community and the village hall is well used, whether by the WI, Parish Council or by the other various organisations who meet for sports or leisure activities. There is something for all ages. Details of these are in the hall. Some, like short mat bowls are in the hall several times a week, others, like the gardeners' show are quarterly events.

If you are new to the village or recently retired there are lots of opportunities to get involved either on a social basis or to join some of the committees. Most organisations are happy for you to attend taster session to see if the activities suit you. Details are in the hall or in Grapevine.

* There is some capacity for private hiring, so if you would like to organise a party come and have a look round. There are two halls, which can be hired separately or together. The main hall has plenty of tables and chairs and there is still space for dancing or running round. A professional PA system means you can hear the music or speaker if you have one – we are happy to show people how to use it, in fact we'd rather give a demonstration than have someone find out by trial and error how it works – or doesn't. Problems have been reported when microphones are not switched off after use. Trustees are therefore suggesting that the batteries are removed when not in use and hirers bring batteries for their event. This will ensure that the microphone will last the duration of your event. There is a stage with curtains – you could use this for the disco, band, speaker or you could put some chairs there so adults can sit and watch the children run around on the main floor. For AV events there is an electrically driven projection screen, whilst for that very special party there is a net to release balloons. The small hall is perfect for more intimate groups or meetings, or can be used as the chill out space or food/drink service area. Both halls have use of the kitchen – including instant boiling water (capacity up to 100 cups in 15 minutes) and plenty of china, mugs and cups. A separate hand washing sink complies with Food Hygiene Regulations. The electrically operated shutter allows you to close the kitchen off so your guests can party on while the washer uppers tidy up.

Hire either or both halls, depending on how much space you need.

Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator Cllr: Julie Shaw is recruiting members at the Farmers' Market and is working towards inserting articles in the Grapevine, distributing leaflets and a meeting or community day. • Traffic/Road Improvements: Still pending decision by other agencies on; 20mph trial speed zone for Capel Street, Kent and Medway safety camera partnership assessment of B2011, HGV signage relocation Old Dover Road. Highways: Footpath South side of New Dover Road under investigation following reports of weeds and surface cracks; Green Lane bridleway (playing field to school rear gate) awaiting funding availability; Concrete planters installed by Kent Highways to alleviate HGV parking on B2011 adjacent to Courtwood Roundabout subject to further discussions; A20 Traffic Assessment Phase and Courtwood Roundabout slip road closure – lobbying of Highways England and other agencies to continue by Councillors. It would be appreciated if Public could also assist by sending further letters/emails on this issue and related concerns of the Trial - See page 7 for relevant persons to contact with their email addresses. • Development of Land South of New Dover Road: Still waiting information from Dover District Council Planning Department on application. Senior Citizen, Disabled person and companion Bus pass

Kent Council co-ordinates the English National Concessionary Travel Scheme, which provides free off peak travel on local bus services across England for older and disabled people.

To be eligible for a senior citizen's bus pass, one must be a Kent resident, living in Kent for more than six months per year as your sole and principle residency and must be of eligible age. That age used to be 60 years, but has risen recently to 65 years of age to come in line with the pensionable age for women. The pass means one can travel free at off peak times on local bus services, across England from 09h30 to 23h00 Monday to Friday and all day at weekends and public holidays.

One may use the bus pass on Maidstone/ Gravesend/ Tilbury Ferry and Canterbury Park and Ride. But as a general rule the pass does not give entitlement to travel free on scheduled coach services, ferries, trains, trams, or community transport schemes, though some exceptions do apply. You can apply for your bus pass up to three months before you become eligible.

Disabled Person plus companion bus pass is only eligible to disabled residents of Kent who cannot travel alone. Acceptable proof is the most recent Disability Living Allowance uprated letter with higher rate mobility or evidence you are in receipt of Personal Independence Payment with a score of at least 8 points for moving around, or recent evidence that you are in receipt of Attendance Allowance, or Daily Living Component of a Personal Independence Payment at the enhanced rate, or you are registered blind or a letter from a specialist doctor confirming you are unable to travel alone with the reason for this.

Once a bus pass has been issued it will be valid for five years. KCC will automatically renew your pass about three weeks prior to its expiry date. Should you have an enquiry regarding a bus pass contact <u>buspass@kent.gov.uk</u> or telephone 03000 41 83 83.
