Thank you to all those who attended our Speedwatch Conference in April and hope that you found it useful and interesting –

Thank you to Martin Stevens for his presentation around Serious Crash Investigation team and how speed is a factor to some collisions and shows that the work we are all doing slows traffic down in the areas of where we live. Thank you also to those that helped me put the conference on.

CSW online presented and ran a couple of workshops and we hope that this has also helped with the use of the website.

More and more schemes are now using CSW online and I along with Simon from CSW are assisting with the support to team members, to ensure that they are not afraid to use the system.

From **1st June EVERYONE** who is involved in Kent Speedwatch will be required to be registered and using the system, the old data processing spreadsheet is approaching its end of life and the author of this Derek is retiring so I will have no support for its use.

We are required by policy, health & safety and insurance to have a central database required information, including team member details, scheme locations and observations of vehicles. For those that have signed up and are using the system THANK YOU, for those that have not please can I ask that you forward this document to ALL of your scheme members and we can get them registered.

Why register when we have been doing it for years?

Since we have amalgamated various schemes from around the county, some information around the team members is missing for whatever reason – some members have left, moved away or otherwise, so this is our opportunity to collate our current Speedwatch team members so we know who we do have.

But I was trained by....

As coordinator they can request myself to OVERRIDE training IF required, the system is designed for NEW members so this is why training is the first thing it asks you to do – some teams have used this as a refresher too..

This is over the top for Speedwatch and is over bureaucratic!

It could be seen as this, however Speedwatch support consists of two people, myself and a volunteer, to enable us to develop Kent Speedwatch and support you with enforcement we need to have a way in which we can access information quickly and readily.







We are now in the process of sharing information with Kent County Council Highways as well as Medway Council and this assists them in decision making around road improvement plans etc. In relation to the processing of data, this is now streamlined and you can see when we have sent the letters and what letters have been sent. Remember we are also sharing our observations with Sussex and likewise, we are seeing an increase in cross border visitors, especially in Hawkhurst. Working with Sussex Speedwatch and Sussex Police this will assist us and them to deal with our cross border offenders.

"I need help to set up CSW online I don't know what to do?"

Most of this is done for you- we have been working hard in the background all of your sites should be listed, all previous observations will be showing too, the only data we are possibly missing is the operator information and the equipment.

Is the system safe and are my details safe?

ALL personal details are 100% secure and held under encryption and are safe.

I've registered but no email has come through?

Check your Spam/Junk mail folder as mail appears to fall into here as it's an automated email.

How to register.

If you could log onto <u>http://kent.communityspeedwatch.co.uk</u> and register on CSW.









Then register to join **existing** group - please DO NOT create a new group – all groups are shown on the system already.



Join existing group as an Operator

Select Kent from the drop down

Then select Your Police District

Then select your group from the drop down -

Complete your details, Click the link on the email once received to verify your email address and then undertake the training, when you have completed your training etc. You will then be approved to join the group and you're ready to go.

Please don't be put off - it's the initial set up that takes a little time - all of your sites are already shown as well as your historic data, all we need to do is amend your equipment settings and you are nearly ready to go -

For anyone of your group members who do not have access to a computer please let me know and I will explain their process.

I am on the end of the phone to offer phone support and if required I can come and provide 121 assistance too. Please ask. I can be accommodating in relation to meeting times and will come to you.

Kent County Council Grant Funding ** EXTENDED FOR 2017/2018 **

Kent County Council (KCC) is pleased to announce they have awarded the contract (which will supply Kent CSW with equipment) to **CA Traffic Ltd**.

The total cost of the unit is currently **£2000+ VAT**. KCC have agreed to fund 50% of the unit price, excluding the VAT, with the remainder being self-funded by your Parish/Town Council etc.

The criteria for the equipment are as follows:-

- For new start up groups
- Where current defective equipment is not viable to be repaired
- For current schemes where shared equipment is an issue
- The grant funding is currently for Kent Parish/Town Councils and excludes Medway at this time
