The New Year heralded new plans for the village hall as Trustees used their monthly meeting to discuss forthcoming events. It is likely to be a busy year.

The next indoor boot fair will be on Sunday 23 February with doors opening for customers from 8am until noon. This will be the last of the indoor boot fairs until the next one in November.

On March 28 there will be a quiz at the village hall to start at 7pm. Categories include general knowledge, food and drink, history. science, music and film and tv. There will also be an opportunity to get your table money back!

This year is the 75th anniversary of VE Day, in anticipation of which the Early May Bank Holiday has been changed to Friday 8 May. This will be marked by services and community events across the country. As part of the Capel commemorations, a street party is planned for Lancaster Avenue with music and fancy dress. A village fete with lots of music and children activities will take place on the 20 June. Lots of stalls and catering stands are also planned. Volunteers would be most welcome as it is likely to be a busy day with lots going on. We are hoping that the weather will be kinder to us this year.

Other things discussed at the meeting included the plans for the hall expansion. Following an open meeting last year, it was decided to build another large hall to add to the existing facilities with the possibility of being able to separate it into two should the need arise. moment we are having to turn away bookings as the hall is over subscribed. More facilities including toilets and a second kitchen ae also planned. These are very early stages but we will keep people informed as we go.

All of these take a fair bit of organising and a tidy bit of work on the day. If anyone would like to help us out, then we would love to hear from you.

Once again the Village Hall was full up at the annual Carol Service, a really good start to Christmas. Capel primary school pupils sang some lovely Carols and the St. Radigunds choir also sung. Afterwards teas and mince pies were served.

The collection was for Crisis looking after homeless people and raised £142.70. thanks to everyone, a very worthwhile cause.

From the vicarage

Cold, miserable February has never been my favourite month. But when I was a student and still discovering church, I encountered something that happens every 2nd February that changed all that.

Church would be worth a visit that evening, others had told me. I walked in from a bustling South London Street as the organ sounded the first notes of a hymn. Before long I was in the middle of a procession, clutching a hymn book in one hand and a candle in the other, following everyone else around the church. Candlelight flooded the place, incense hung in the air – it was a celebration unlike anything I had ever experienced before, and I found myself wanting to go back for more.

The Gospel read during the Candlemas service, forty days after Christmas, recalls Mary and Joseph taking the infant Jesus to the Temple and being met by the old priest Simeon. Seeing the child, he knows that his days are done: *Now, Lord, let your servant depart in peace; for my eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of your people Israel...'* No sadness for Simeon at the prospect of leaving the world, or not seeing the child grow up. Simply joy at holding the Light of the World in his arms who from then on would light the way for him and the rest of humanity through this world and into the next. Joy, too, at the prospect of departing in peace.

I've seen the commercials on TV for simple, fuss-free funerals. They might suit some, but I'm with Simeon – for me, the prospect of leaving this world with joy and hope is worth making *some* fuss about...**Brian**

Generous donations at her funeral amounted to £450:00 which has been forwarded to Canterbury Pilgrims Hospice in her memory.



My Grandparents and Aunt lived at 157 Capel Street, prior to numbering, their home was known as Devonia, they were Walter, Hettie and Sybil Butcher. Granddad had died in 1941, a few years before I was born. Granny lived to be 89 and died on Boxing day in 1958. Sybil Butcher, my aunty Sybil, passed in 1974, I understand she was at one time a Sunday School teacher, she is included in a group photo in 'The Village in the Clouds' (page 65).

In the late early sixties Sybil had a black and white dog called Spot.

I visited frequently with my mother, Gladys, older sister of sybil, throughout my childhood. Of course I continued to visit into my teens and twenties. I can certainly recall the people I came to know from those happy days and hopefully some may still be living around the village.

- 1) Waiting Kent Highways to undertake works to the junction Winehouse Lane/Dover Road.
- 2) Works to Dover Hill will be carried out in new financial year to change road layout.
- 3) Thanks expressed to Brian Tutt for conducted tour of village regarding drainage system.

• Village Action Plan points raised:

1) On-going investigations into the Broadband coverage and Water supply continues.

• Member Vacancy:

Nomination received from Lisa Alfsdotter. Following discussion with candidate with a question and answer session, the Councillors duly co-opted Ms Alfsdotter to the Parish Council.

• Neighbourhood Watch:

- 1) Thanks for support were expressed and a gift presented to Community Warden Andrew Hawkins, with best wishes for his move to a new area. A welcome was given to Janice Henry, who commences Community Warden duties in Capel and Hawkinge from 27th January.
- 2) Members were informed of incident relating to Fire and Rescue Services attending Playing Field to cut a youth from one of the baby swings after getting stuck the swing will be replaced as soon as possible.

- 2) Continual arrangements being persued to arrange a meeting regarding future of ER252 (New Dover Road/Old Dover Road) and link with new development path.

This would be a slight increase of Band D Council Tax Charge from £57.37 to £62.17 (Increase of £4.80 per annum).



Fireworks are used by people throughout the year to mark different events, e.g. bonfire night, New Year, Chinese New Year, Diwali, etc. While they can bring much enjoyment to some people, they can cause significant injury, problems and fear for other people and animals.

Fireworks can be a source of fear and distress for many animals. In particular the sudden, loud noises that many fireworks make can cause fear.

Animals affected not only suffer psychological distress but can also cause themselves injuries, sometimes very serious ones, as they attempt to run or hide from the noise. Although most reports of welfare problems caused by fireworks relate to domestic pets, other animals can also experience fear, distress and/or injury as a result of them. Farm livestock are easily frightened by loud noises and sudden bright lights and can be at risk of injuring themselves on fencing, farm equipment or fixtures and fittings within their housing if startled.



New Year, New You?

'New Year, New You' is the message to Kent residents who are facing increasing health issues from poor lifestyle behaviours including inactivity and unhealthy eating.

Along with smoking and drinking too much alcohol, these can have long term effects on people's emotional and physical health, leading to an increased risk of many types of cancer, heart and lung disease and stroke.

In 2017/18, the percentage of Kent adults (over 18) classified as overweight or obese was 62.8 per cent* which is slightly higher than the national figure (62 per cent).

KCC Director for Public Health, Andrew Scott-Clark said: "The best way to tackle problem weight is to eat a healthy, balanced, reduced-calorie and sugar diet. You can also maintain a healthy weight and prevent many illnesses by exercising regularly, at least 30 minutes a day of brisk walking. Priorities focus on changeable factors such as helping families to improve poor diets and help for those who need to lose and maintain a healthy weight.

"KCC supports national initiatives such as Change4Life and One You, alongside community-based weight management programmes for adults and fun activity based programmes for families with children and educational programmes in schools. Services like One You Kent which really can help a new you, this new year."

Try the 'How are You?' quiz, Easy meals app or Active 10 app at www.kent.gov.uk/healthyweight You can also book up for a free Health Check and find out more about a range of tools, tips and local support services that can help you at www.oneyoukent.org.uk

Sally from Tunbridge Wells lost 11kg with one-to-one support from the One You Kent team, team as well as joining the September Counterweight Group in the Camden Centre, Tunbridge Wells. She said: "What a great group to join, really friendly people... supportive and made my journey very enjoyable. So very happy to lose the weight I have with the support I received I recommend it to anyone who wants to lose weight and feel great."

Anthony from Dartford lost two stone and quit smoking with One You Kent. He said: "One You Kent and its amazing team of wonderful staff have enabled me to lose weight and stop smoking which have helped me tackle sleep apnoea and regain my confidence to re-enter the workplace. They made the difference for me and helped me rebuild my life."



Andrew Scott-Clark added: "We want more people to get the help they need at the right time and this could be in a range of different ways. People do not have to struggle alone, we want them to seek support and information to help them live a healthier life. If people are depressed then we urge them to see their GPs or contact Live Well Kent - who provide community mental health support services. For more information, go towww.livewellkent.org.uk"

KCC supports the national Dry January campaign and encourages residents to be aware of how much they are drinking by using the 'Know Your Score' interactive online anonymous test –

www.kent.gov.uk/knowyourscore A range of formal and informal support is also available, such as AA and Smart Recovery (peer support) in Kent and Al-anon for friends, family and carers of alcoholics. KCC Public Health commissions specialist treatment providers to provide structured treatment for alcohol addiction.

Meanwhile, figures for Kent last year show a decrease down to 15 per cent of residents being smokers – approximately 185,000 people – and the number of people who have never smoked is on the rise, up to 56.2 per cent.

If you're aged 40 to 74-years-old, and not on GP cardiovascular register you will be invited once every five years for a NHS Health Check. Your blood pressure, height and weight will be checked along with blood cholesterol and you'll also be asked some questions about your lifestyle and family history. The check will identify the risk of you developing heart disease, kidney disease, stroke, diabetes or dementia in the future.

For advice about small changes you can make to improve your health and wellbeing, and find more support in your area regarding your lifestyle, see www.oneyoukent.org.uk(search for 'Health Checks') or call 0300 123 1220 (option 4) to find a clinic near you.




