By now plans for the Village Fete, VE75 and numerous other summer activities that the Village Hall Management Committee have either organised or were due to take part in, would be well in hand. Clubs and societies that meet at the hall would be organising their programmes for the year and the Farmers Market would be in full swing with plants, jams, craft and other delights on sale, while people had their weekly get together over a cup of tea or coffee.

Instead the Hall doors are locked, and the Halls are silent. The books and puzzles remain inaccessible and clubs are unable to meet. The Farmers Market <u>is</u> operating but on a much-reduced basic food only principle, mainly thanks to willing volunteers and stallholders. We are not entitled to any Government help and in common with most Village Halls, our insurance as comprehensive as it is, does not cover us for lack of income in this particular circumstance. With no income, but continued monthly expenditure – insurances, utilities, contracted workers etc – we are haemorrhaging money that had been earmarked for other projects. However careful management has allowed us the luxury of having this money in the first place, so we can continue for some time yet.

We have been advised by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York that during the present virus emergency, the Church of England policy is that there should be no church services until further notice. Accordingly our parish have cancelled all services at Alkham, Capel-le-Ferne and Hougham with immediate effect. Special arrangements for weddings and funerals can be made with our vicar, who should be contacted in the first instance. We will advise any further changes to the situation.

# From the vicarage

I remember her well; there I would be, standing in front of the class waiting to start the lesson while she chatted and laughed with her mates, my blood pressure probably soaring. Time passed. She and her mates left school, and I didn't see her again.

Not until, that is, a few years later when I lay in a hospital bed having undergone surgery for bowel cancer. She had swapped her school uniform for that of a student nurse; I remember waking briefly around 2 in the morning and recognising her. She was standing next to me, checking my vital signs.

Almost ten years on I still remember her, Jess, Amy, Gary, Emily, the two Elaine's and all the others who cared for me – especially Rebecca, the junior doctor who, when things were going wrong, kept me from going to my Eternal Home. The NHS was as wonderful then as it is now – perhaps it's taken the coronavirus crisis to make us realise that we've tended to take those who work in it, along with so many others whose work makes everyday life possible, for granted.

For me, the past decade has been a bonus – I've learned how easily things in this life – and life itself – are taken for granted. In this country, decent sanitation and modern medical science have protected us from what the Prayer Book calls the 'pestilence' that our ancestors so dreaded – until now.

No doubt treatments and vaccines will be developed that will defeat this particular pestilence. But I wonder – when it does, will we go back to our old ways of taking things for granted and complaining when things go wrong? Or will we have learned the value of 'Thank You?'



Last Wednesday the 8th April 2020, saw Chancellor Rishi Sunak announce that frontline charities across the UK will receive a £750 million package of direct cash grants. As part of a UK-wide package of support, £360 million will be allocated by government departments to charities providing key services and supporting vulnerable people during the crisis. The aim is for charities to receive money in the coming weeks.

As well as this, £370 million of funding will be made available to support smaller charities at the heart of local communities which are making a big difference during the COVID-19 outbreak, including those delivering food, essential medicines and providing financial advice. The application system for the National Lottery Community Fund grant pot is expected to be operational in the next couple of weeks.

At a Kent level we have already sought to support the voluntary and community sector and have contributed £200K to a new *Coronavirus Emergency Fund* set up by the Kent Community Foundation (KCF) to support charities in Kent and Medway. We have recently agreed with KCF for emergency bridging loans to be available as part of their social lending programme. Loans of up to £60,000 are available and, in exceptional cases, may be increased to £100,000. These loans will be funded from our original donation to the Big Society Fund, now the Kent Social Enterprise Fund.

I hope that charities in Kent will benefit from this funding and that the money will help support the work being delivered by District hubs helped by the Kent Together helpline. As at 5pm Thursday the 9th April 2020, the helpline had dealt with 1,279 people in its first week and processed 2,129 different requests for help. There was clearly a need and I am sure the need will grow as Covid-19 retains its grip on our lives. I have been reflecting on how much has changed since mid March. There are now more than 1000 confirmed cases in Kent. Our working and personal lives have been thoroughly disrupted.

We know more about PPE than we ever imagined we would need to and have read more government guidance than perhaps we would have wanted to. Some services have had to close and there have been real challenges for us all. But the spirit and determination shown by our KCC staff has been inspiring. We have never worked closer or more successfully with our partners and providers and I am pleased that our reasoned arguments have met with a measure of success in influencing colleagues in government to accede to our requests.

I hope you had a Happy Easter. We may be lucky enough to have some good weather. It feels strange, as it did last weekend, to be sending a message to our residents to stay away from our parks and beaches and stay at home, but if we are going to beat this virus and reduce the massive workload of the NHS staff currently, by staying at home, not congregating in social groups then there is a high chance the virus can be prevented from spreading amongst us, overwhelming our hospitals and thus increasing the lock down duration. So stay safe.



# **CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL**

Due to no meeting in April 2020, the Parish Council continued to deal with matters



concerning the Community remotely and these have been recorded and will be added to the next meeting minutes accordingly. The following pages are dedicated to the New Land Allocation Local Plan HELAA (Housing and Economic Land Availability Suitability Assessment)

# HAVING NOW CONTACTED DOVER DISTRICT COUNCIL ON THEIR TIMETABLE FOR THE CONSULTATION, WITH THE PRESENT SITUATION WITH COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS, WE HAVE RECEIVED THE FOLLOWING REPLY.

"We will not be going out to consultation on the new Local Plan in June – my best guess at the moment will be that Members will see the proposed plan in the Summer and we will consult in the Autumn subject to the current restrictions being eased sufficiently to do so. As you say the situation at present would not allow a meaningful consultation in my view and there is sufficient flexibility in the timetable at present to allow that to happen. I will be writing to all Parish Councils about this in due course when there is a bit more certainty." Lois Jarrett, Head of Planning, Regeneration and Development.

## **Housing Development in Capel**

Capel is situated at the South Eastern end of the North Downs. Land to the North, East and West of Capel is designated as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), whilst to the South there is the Heritage Coast.

Generally, it is difficult but not impossible for development to be approved in these areas.

Most housing development schemes are delivered through a Local Plan.

A Local Plan involves Dover District Council (DDC) initially asking local landowners to offer plots of land for possible housing development.

This land then goes through a process of scrutiny and public consultation, with a final assessment by a HM Government Inspector.

DDC's first Local Plan started around 2008 where around 10 plots of land were offered for development in Capel. The scrutiny and consultation process was completed in 2013 with the HM Government Inspector agreeing that 3 plots of land were suitable for development providing up to 105 dwellings.

The 3 plots were:

- George Close formally Grasslands
- Land at the junction of Capel Street/Winehouse Lane/Hurst Lane
- Land between 107 127 Capel Street

When the development on these 3 sites is complete, Capel will have 79 new homes.

DDC are now working on the second Local Plan. Starting in 2018, local landowners offered 15 plots for possible housing development in Capel (excluding 107-127 Capel Street). These are identified by the coloured sections on the map.

During the initial suitability assessment, 11 of these plots have been ruled out as shown in red on the map.


This leaves 4 plots of land which may be considered suitable for development. These are shown in amber and green on the map.

The next phase in the process will be a period of consultation where Parishioners and Capel Parish Council can post their views with Dover District Council for consideration.

The Parish Council are currently working on their response to the Local Plan and invited Parishioners to express their view for possible inclusion in this response.

Your views can be sent to the Clerk for the Parish Council either electronically or by post before the end of May.

The Parish Council must stress that whilst we welcome your views, it is vitally important that you also present your views in writing to Dover District Council during the consultation period.



# **New Dover District Local Plan**

We are in the process of producing a new Local Plan. The Local Plan sets out planning policies and proposals for new development in the District over the period from 2020 to 2040. Once adopted, the Local Plan will replace the current suite of <a href="Development Plan">Development Plan</a> documents.

# CAP001 Land adjacent to 101 New Dover Road CT18 7JD (Red)

**Unsuitable site:** - unacceptable impact on the AONB and the setting of the heritage coast - access is constrained - continued linear development along the New Dover Rd could lead to potential coalescence with development in Folkestone and Hythe District.

Not taken forward to the next stage of assessment as site is unsuitable.

CAP002 Site adjacent Capel Garage, Old Dover Road, Capel-leFerne CT18 7HN (Red) Unsuitable site: - unacceptable impact on the AONB and the heritage coast - unacceptable biodiversity impact - concern as to whether access is achievable.

Not taken forward to the next stage of assessment as site is unsuitable.

# CAP003 Land at New Dover Road, Capel-le-Ferne CT18 7JB (Red)

**Unsuitable site**: - poor relationship to settlement - unacceptable impact on the setting of the AONB and heritage coast.

Not taken forward to the next stage of assessment as site is unsuitable.

# CAP004 Land south of New Dover Road and east of Winehouse Lane, Capel-le-Ferne CT18 7JB (Red)

**Unsuitable site:** - poor relationship to settlement - unacceptable impact on the setting of the AONB and heritage coast.

Not taken forward to the next stage of assessment as site is unsuitable.

# CAP005 Land at New Dover Road, Capel-le-Ferne CT18 7LH (Red)

**Unsuitable Site**: - Site is located in the AONB, with high landscape sensitivity and the AONB unit have commented that they would strongly object to this site coming forward. - KCC have no highways objections.

Not taken forward to the next stage of assessment as site is unsuitable.

# CAP006 Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm, Capel-le-Ferne CT18 7LZ (Green) Number of units: - 100

**Suitable site:** - This site is well connected to the existing services in Capel and would form a logical extension to the village. - No high-level constraints exist on the site and access is achievable. - KCC have commented that access to the site is achievable, albeit not ideal for the level of development proposed. Concern over whether a secondary emergency access is achievable. - Development here would only be acceptable provided: - Sufficient screening is provided along the western boundary to mitigate the impact of development on the AONB - A full ecological survey is undertaken - Existing trees and hedgerows are retained - A Transport Assessment is undertaken to address highways concerns - The infrastructure requirements arising from the site are met.

# CAP007 Land north west of New Dover Road, Capel-le-Ferne CT18 7HH (Red)

**Unsuitable site:** - unacceptable impact on the AONB and its setting (half of the site is in the AONB) - site is in a very prominent position and development here would have a poor relationship to the existing settlement - constrained access.

Not taken forward to the next stage of assessment as site is unsuitable.

# CAP008 Land on the south side of Winehouse Lane, Capel-le-Ferne CT18 7JE (Red)

**Unsuitable site:** - poor relationship to settlement - constrained access - unacceptable impact on the setting of the AONB.

Not taken forward to the next stage of assessment as site is unsuitable.

# CAP009 Longships, Cauldham Lane, Capel-le-Ferne CT18 7HG (Green)

Number of units: - 10

## **Public Rights of Way**

"The laws in England and Wales provide you with the right to walk, ride, cycle and drive in public rights of way in the countryside. Public rights of way include footpaths, byways and bridleways. Public rights of way are listed and described in Definitive Maps and Statements (legal records of public rights of way)".

## **Footpaths:**

This public right of way is meant for pedestrians only. You are allowed to walk your dog as long as it is under your close control. When walking a dog, you must ensure that it keeps to the public footpath and does not trespass into nearby properties. Prams, pushchair or wheelchairs can also be used on a footpath.

### Landowners:

Should not put up misleading signs to prevent people from using a public right of way. They are not allowed to harrass, intimidate or prevent members of the public from using a public right of way. We have many PROWs in and around our Village which include those adjacent to;

The Battery Site, Battle of Britain Memorial Site, Clifftop, Recreation Ground and across Farmers' Fields. You are not in the wrong by using any of these designated PROWs.


