

From the vicarage

My mother had two brothers. Both served in the Forces during the war; afterwards, the family relocated from London to Ramsgate. But the younger of the two took a job at a hotel in the Lake District, met and married my aunt, and settled at the opposite end of England to the rest of the family.

Each summer they would visit, and for my sister and I there would be outings and trips to the beach with our cousins. Our uncle was the best kind of uncle – kind, funny, and full of stories about his adventures as a lorry driver, delivering flour in and around Cumbria. Sadly, those adventures ended when he became ill. He lived just long enough to see his first granddaughter.

By then I had passed my driving test. The annual visits continued, now usually in the opposite direction. However, my aunt travelled to Kent when I married, and for my ordination - she liked the idea of her nephew being a priest. But as the years passed, age and the onset of ill health took their toll. It was during one of our visits that the inevitable conversation took place: yes, I would assist at her funeral when the time came.

Following her ninetieth birthday infirmity confined her first to her flat and then to her bed. Then came the pandemic and all that it has carried with it and finally, last month. There could be no funeral service as such; I wouldn't be able to keep my promise.

On All Saints Sunday, the first Sunday of November, I will join with others in giving thanks for those who rejoice with us, but on another shore and in a greater light. Then I shall light a candle, and think of her... Brian



Hello Everyone, even if we can't go to the meetings at the moment we can still remember some of the interesting and fun times we have had that bring a smile to our faces. At times the speakers have had us in fits of laughter and other times it could be listening to the members stories, some sentimental and others gave us an insight into their lives as they remember different times in their past.

At one of the October meetings we had a speaker that was talking about mushrooms and toadstools which might seem like an odd thing to talk about but he was very knowledgeable about so many species from tiny ones to really huge types, lots of different colours and shapes. With the help of the slide show he pointed out which ones were poisonous and which were edible, although I don't think I would remember with my memory which mushrooms were edible? So, I play safe and only get ones from the supermarket or greengrocers so no foraging for me. The speaker had a great sense of humour and told us many funny stories of people being deliberately poisoned or being made ill by someone as a payback for past grievances, or just because they might have been a bit evil.

Another October meeting WI member Kath Clark told us about when she was a young girl growing up in Capel village, which then was mainly farms and very few houses. With her fantastic memory recalling some events of the war and the start of the village growing bigger with more bungalows and houses being built, roads being made, lighting and drainage being installed. Kath spoke about all the different village shops such as butchers, hairdressers, fish shop. wool and haberdashery shop, sweet shop and post office amongst them. Back then they had deliveries of all sorts including milk, meat and coal to name but a few.

Last year we had a keep fit session starting with slow gentle exercises gradually getting more energetic until there wasn't too many of us left trying to keep up. It was quite hilarious with feet and arms going the wrong way and out of rhythm and with all the laughing at each other some just couldn't do it anymore. Susan the instructor told us she started the exercises after having heart problems and continued with doing them for her health and felt so much better.

Pam regularly sends out a newsletter just to keep in touch with everybody and always has some sort of quiz or puzzle to keep the brain from seizing up. This time we had a piece written by Jean about her life when she was young and how, even during the war, she still went to school for half days and a lot of the time was spent in air raid shelters. In the evenings she made scarves, gloves and socks for the men on board a naval ship. She left school at 14 to go to work, but she said they still had fun at times. It is so nice to hear some of the different stories or interests from the members.

It is that time of year to start thinking about Christmas (big groan) and make a start on writing Christmas cards, Christmas cakes and Christmas puddings, if that is what you do. A lot of people just buy good quality ones from the supermarket and some people don't send cards but send a message on social media, but for those of you that do, it should keep you busy for a while.

Keep safe everyone and keep your chin up (or in some of our cases our chins.)



• Communications with Highways Engalnd, A One + Contractors and Kent Highways, on the A20 closures for works to Roundhill Tunnels, overnight. More signage requested to stop drivers from using the B2011 and use the agreed diversion of Churchill Avenue, up A260 Canterbury Road to re-join the A20 at Spitfire Roundabout. Response has shown some slight progress. Thank you to all residents that have assisted in this campaign by emailing the agencies.

• Highway Improvement Plan prioritised by Kent Highways and waiting a virtual meeting with Councillors to discuss further on progressing a programme of works.

<u>Planning:</u> • (<u>HLAA/LALP</u>) - Dover District Council Land Allocation Local Plan Consultation</u> – Still waiting Notification for a public consultation date.

Neighbourhood Watch: • September monthly update from PCSO circulated for information. Joint PCSO and Community Warden walkabouts continue. Vehicle on Old Dover Road, Tax re-checked.


<u>Other:</u> ● Checks being made with Land Registry on new ownership of Land South of Old Dover Road – still waiting website update.


Training/workshops/seminars: Clerk attended virtual workshops on: Effective Communications and Engagement in a Lockdown World and National Data Protection Webinar. Other online seminars available: How to recognise and assist disabilities in community. Finance Conference. Health and Well Being. Plus Kent Association Local Council courses.

Due to the COVID-19 Government Regulations currently in place, Councillors voted 5 to 4 in favour of meetings being cancelled until further notice. The Parish Council are continuing to operate by discussing and making decisions remotely, under Delegated Powers given to Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Clerk. The safety of Parish Council Members and the Public is important to "Save Lives and Control the Virus" and it has been recommend by the National Association of Local Councils (NALC), that we revert to delegated powers decisions and/or consider the use of Zoom online meetings, or something similar, until Covid-19 regulations are relaxed.

When meetings resume, venue and dates, will be arranged and notified accordingly.

BE AWARE and STAY ALERT

MESSAGE FROM KENT POLICE Staying safe as the nights draw-in

Dark nights are nearly upon us and Dover District residents are being advised not to be in the dark when it comes to being safe and securing their homes.

As the days get cooler and the nights draw in, criminals will exploit the cover of darkness if they can, so residents need to make sure they are not easy targets.

Crime prevention doesn't have to cost a lot of money, there are simple measures you can take to reduce your chances of being a victim.

Personal Safety

We all want to be as safe as possible when out and about. Street crime is often opportunistic, so making yourself less of a target, moving with purpose and being aware of your surroundings will go a long way to keeping you safe. Here are some simple precautions you can take.

Be prepared

Plan your route in advance. Carry a charged mobile phone and some cash, and tell someone where you're going.

Be assertive

From the moment you step out onto the street in the morning, look assertive and act and walk with confidence. This will always make you appear in control and much less vulnerable.

Be aware

Using a mobile phone, whether making a call or texting, wearing a hood or listening to loud music, all affect your awareness of your surroundings.

Do you secure your home and garden?

Burglars are often opportunists who will target an open window, an unlocked door or valuables on display if they think they can get away with it.



As well as locking doors and windows using the keys each time you leave you can also:

* keep keys, cash and expensive items away from doors and windows, out of view

* use timer switches on lights and radios to make your home look occupied

* repair broken or faulty windows or doors

* keep gates locked and boundaries secure

* lock away bikes, tools and garden items which could be stolen or used to break into your home.

Do you lock and alarm your vehicle?

Some burglars may break in to your property looking for the keys to your vehicle.

Always store keys away from doors and windows and take them with you when you go to bed. It's a good idea to store electronic car keys in a signal blocking pouch so they can't be scanned by thieves.

As well as locking and alarming your vehicle, you should also:

* remove items left inside - including jackets and loose change

* secure items in your boot, out of view, if you need to leave your vehicle while you're out - but try not to leave anything inside your vehicle overnight

* park in a garage, a secure car park or well-lit location whenever possible

* wipe away sat nav suction marks left on your windscreen - this could be all it takes to entice a thief to break in, hoping the sat nav is still inside.

Remember: If you're clearing ice from your windscreen and need to go back to the house, remove the keys from the ignition and lock your car. Don't be tempted to leave it running.

Parish updated as to the Government's consideration for a possible

HGV park within the our Dover West Ward.

I have effectively requested our elected MP Mrs Elphicke to confirm that she will object to the above proposals on our behalf. I will update you with her reply, though if the last email I sent to her is anything to go by, apart from an acknowledgement, I am waiting still. Though I appreciate she has much on her mind at the moment.

Dear Mrs Elphicke

I have been alerted that there are proposals for a lorry park on the land next to B&Q, on the Whitfield enterprise zone. I am led to believe that, whilst central government had been investigating possible sites for post Brexit customs clearance centres in Kent, there had been no formal approach to build one in Whitfield or anywhere in Dover for that matter.

That situation has not really changed. The government still has not stated officially that they propose to build a clearance zone on the Whitfield site. In July there was an announcement that possible sites were being considered in the area by the Dept of Transport; but we were not informed of any locations.

In September an official from the DfT visited the area and met with the Leader of Dover District Council. The primary reason was to look at the Duke of York and Whitfield roundabouts so they could see, at first-hand, what the traffic issues were from the exit at the Port of Dover on to the A2.

At that time the Leader enquired whether a customs clearance zone was being considered within the Dover District and was not given an answer. A second meeting took place 3 weeks ago when the same question was put. The Leader was advised that one was being considered, the construction is likely to be undertaken via a Special Development Order; which stream lines the planning process. This would allow a clearance zone to be built by July 2021, when new customs procedures will come into effect.

Whilst recognising the intention of legislation that gives the government powers to use Special Development Orders, I believe in order for Councillors to fulfil their elected mandate, there should be as much transparency, disclosure and consultation as possible on major infrastructure plans such as lorry parks and border control points.

Any such proposals should take account of the impact on local communities, importantly, how that could impact upon property prices and the future saleability of properties in the immediate and surrounding villages, how this will impact on the local road network, proximity to existing built up areas, avoidance of harm to open landscape and potential harm to ecology, water quality, heritage and archaeology and the increase in what is considered an area of high internal combustion engine emissions pollution under Public Health. The electorate who voted for you to represent their voice for the Dover, Deal area in Parliament, will wish to know :-

• That you will be totally supportive of their objections to any HGV park anywhere within Dover district other than within the confines of Dover port.

• That you can assure your electorate that you will put their case against an HGV park being considered in the Whitfield or any other Dover area, to Parliament and in particular to any Select Committees convened for discussing such proposals.

• That you can give to me, like you, an elected representative of the people, a total assurance that there will be a total transparency in any consideration given to such projects within the Dover District area. We can not afford to be capricious to our electorate under any such circumstances.

• Planning obligations under section 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 was introduced by the Tory Government to ensure there are ways that local authorities in the United Kingdom can secure additional public benefits from developers during the granting of planning. Planning gains seek to capture some of the uplift in land value which is generated by the granting of planning permission, or Special Development Orders, should you fail to stop the construction of such an HGV park in the Dover area.

Will you give us an assurance that you will fight for the equivalent of a s106 agreement to compensate the Local Authority, should you fail the local electorate in preventing an HGV park from being constructed in the Dover District area.

I look forward to receiving your reply stating your intended stance in this matter.

Whilst on the subject of replies, I am awaiting still for your reply to my email to you dated the 15 September 2020, regarding housing issues. Yours sincerely.




