Well the recent Zoom meeting of Capel Village Hall Management Committee went extremely well and quick this month as we got through quite a lot on the agenda. After spending some time on the Farmers Market (more on that later) we decided that it would be a good idea to put some things in the village diary. Particularly as we have been asked about these things on more than one occasion. So there will be no village fete this year or at least not one organised by the committee. We have however set aside a date for a village fete next year. So put June 25th in your diary for 2022. Volunteers, ideas and offers of help and sustenance gladly received. A sub committee will be set up in the near future and its first meeting will be broadcast on the internet and at the hall so keep your eyes peeled. Failing that just contact the Trustees. The Garage Safari will be going ahead this year on the 5 September. More information will be released on this in next month's Grapevine. Also this year we plan to have a book sale. You have all been very generous with your donations of books and puzzles to the point that in common with a lot of charity shops this week, we have been somewhat inundated. Not that we are complaining – absolutely not – but we have decided to have a book sale at the hall to help us reduce the numbers a little. For this we have chosen June 6 between 10 and 12. One of the lovely things about Zoom (in between freezing) is that you can record meetings. We discovered this by accident in a previous meeting when by mistake I pressed the wrong button. It has meant that whoever takes the minutes can participate freely in the discussions without missing anything and the minutes are accurate. Of course it is a bit odd listening to the sound of your own voice!! But I think most of us would like to be able to get back in the hall for some proper face to face meetings. As previously mentioned, we spent some time discussing the Farmers Market, each person taking responsibility for I would like to thank separate parts of the operation. Chris Pegler at this point who has taken over responsibility for marketing the hall and the Farmers Market Facebook and the net, and also the Parish Council in the personage of Maureen Leppard who is also helping us

We have two new stalls including cut flowers grown by the vendor and a local writer who will be having new stalls alongside the fruit, veg, bread, jams, wool, bags, jewellery, candles, plants, cards, a photographer and a new egg stall. Barry, Michael and Roy are stars in organising the stalls and Cherry continues to do a lot of the running around behind the scenes. Someone else I would like to thank is Jan, our Community Warden, who has supported us all through the pandemic and out the other side.

Another thing discussed at the recent meeting was a visit from Kent Fire Brigade to do an assessment for the hall's plans in the case of fire. This took place this last week and lasted several hours. On a scale of 1 to 5, one being broadly compliant and five being dangerous and totally unacceptable (they shut you down apparently) we scored So thanks to everyone over the years who have facilitated this and also the current trustees who helped in the preparation of the visit.

The last thing I want to say is this. Running the hall has not been easy over the past year with new COVID 19 legislation to read and understand, the rules changing, introducing signage and sanitisers to the hall, risk assessment, track and trace..... the list is endless and the trustees, cleaner and lettings secretary have worked hard to ensure the hall has continued to remain open when it could and viable when it couldn't. But we want to thank the residents of Capel too who have been supportive, turning out to the Farmers Market when they can, bringing books and puzzles for the use of others and also for observing (most of the time) the social distancing and facemask issues, and not minding when they were gently (mostly) reminded of them. Our plans may yet change because of COVID but let's be optimistic and enjoy the long hot summer ahead of us. I did say optimistic right?


We also have our own brand of Coffee - This Is Coffee, and a selection of Lost Sheep Coffee Beans and Capsules.

From the vicarage

Sitting with a cup of tea and clicking through the channels with the TV remote, I came across an old film that I hadn't seen in years. And since *Emperor of the North* features spectacular landscapes and steam trains, my cup of tea lasted much longer than intended.

Set during the Great Depression in 1930s Oregon, the plot features a battle of wills between a crazed train conductor (Ernest Borgnine) who will stop at nothing to see that no one ever gets a free ride aboard his train, and a tramp (Lee Marvin), whose reputation for outwitting Borgnine has led other tramps to dub him *Emperor of the North*.

Another, younger man (Keith Carradine) attaches himself to Marvin. Jumping aboard moving trains and hiding in freight cars, the older man looks out for the younger one as they face trial and tribulation together. But the partnership crumbles; the young man is interested only in himself, and in stealing his mentor's crown. When Marvin and Borgnine finally fight it out aboard a flat wagon, he just stands and watches.

It's a temptation almost as old as time itself. We depend on each other for so many things in life - but at the same time the thought of being the one who gets noticed, takes the credit and wins the admiration of others is so enticing. The New Testament tells us that even Jesus' disciples struggled with it; more than once he had to remind them that for them, true greatness lay in serving others rather than in being served themselves.

A similar point, perhaps, to Marvin's parting shot to his selfish protégé in the film's final scene as he throws him from the train into a pond: *You had the juice, kid, but not the heart...***Brian**



It is good to see all the beautiful colours of the spring flowers everywhere and what a treat to see all the daffodils on the road verges and around the village hall, a lot of these were planted by the W.I. who thought it would be a nice way to remember our past members who had died and arranged to have them planted near to where they lived or at a favourite place of theirs.

There was a nice surprise for the members just before Easter to receive a little homemade package decorated with Easter adornments of rabbits, baskets and flowers, it was filled with little chocolate easter eggs, a very moreish treat.



We have had another bag delivered to us instead of our usual monthly Tuesday meeting, inside there was 2 labelled packets of sunflower seeds, one had yellow seeds and the other mixed colour ones all carefully put in tiny bags inside a small flowery envelope.

following a risk assessment of damaged top to middle ramp.
Several layers of the wood have been melted away, causing a trip hazard.
Concerns that wet weather, even if covered,
will get into the wood and may result in the panels becoming soft, leaving the question of being unsure what pressure it will take before collapsing.

Please do not climb over fence and use the facilities, as dated/timed "warning" photos have been taken of the notices and chained gate in situ, for insurance purposes.

Endeavours will be important to the Parish Council to open the Skate-Park as soon as possible.



Bonfires are often used to get rid of garden wastes.

This can lead to smoke and fumes which may cause problems for those living and/or working close by.

Smoke can interfere with a neighbour's enjoyment of their garden, put them off opening windows and hanging out washing.

How do I dispose of waste that I would usually burn?

These days it is not necessary to burn waste. Most areas in the district now have kerb side collection for both garden waste and recyclables. If you are a keen gardener composting is a good alternative to burning. If none of these options are suitable you will find that the

Kent County Council Household Recycling Centres (Tips), will accept most waste items and recycle it.

Government legislation

Section 79 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 refers to nuisances caused by smoke. It may well be that smoky bonfires could be a contravention of the Act if they occur on a regular basis, and prosecution may result. It is, however, the view of this Authority that most people are proud of their civic responsibility as they are of their own gardens, and will consider their neighbours before lighting a bonfire.

Kent Homeless Connect – A Message of Hope

Kent County Council (KCC), with partners Porchlight and Look Ahead, have a message of hope for some of the county's most vulnerable people on World Health Day which was on the 7th April.

Kent Homeless Connect (KHC) has been designed by Kent Council (KCC) for people homelessness, or at risk of being homeless, who also have complex needs such as mental or physical ill health or drug or alcohol problems. It is delivered by two charity partners – Porchlight and Look Ahead, bringing together a wealth of services and providing people with a one-stop-shop approach to finding the support they need.

Steve Kennett spent three years living on the streets, battling his addiction to drugs, before eventually going into recovery. He entered a rehabilitation centre that he later became a volunteer for. The support Steve received enabled him to obtain valuable qualifications and he went on to gain full time employment with KHC in Tunbridge Wells, using his experience and understanding to help others to turn their lives around. In Steve's words:

"This service is so important because people who are in the desperate place that I once was, will find it much easier to

"If you are living on the streets anything that makes it easier for you to get support, or for your family and friends to find help for you, is so important."

Designed for equal access to services, regardless of postcode, Kent Homeless Connect works across the entire county and is a first for Kent. It means that support is simple to reach because it brings together access to services across local authority boundaries.

Kent Homeless Connect recognises that people with very complex needs are likely to need support from a range of services at once. It brings together local expertise to make that possible throughout Kent, so support can be coordinated and tailored to the needs of each individual wherever they are, ensuring some of the most vulnerable people in the community are able to quickly access the right high-quality

The Covid-19 crisis has increased the health inequalities for this hard-to-reach group and a new website has just been launched to help potential clients and professionals access the service easily, along with an online eligibility checker, that identifies whether someone qualifies for this specialist support. "The launch of the streamlined new website will go on to further simplify access to this service and I would like to thank our partners, Porchlight and Look Ahead for their hard work in making all of this possible."

Donna Pearson, Head of Operations at Look Ahead said:

"Look Ahead is delighted to increase access to those who need it the most in Kent. We are pleased to work in partnership with Porchlight to deliver these services on behalf of KCC.

"We are committed to bringing the highest quality service within easy reach of vulnerable homeless people with the most need and we hope, that with the launch of the Kent Homeless Connect website, even more people will be able to access support. Our aim is to continue providing specialist help for people to recover from homelessness giving them the tools to begin a new chapter in their lives."

It would be lovely to see the local authorities construct or convert buildings into small purpose built hostels in each major town in our county where the homeless could have a safe room on a temporary basis for up to six months to allow the collaborative partnerships to arrange for them permanent accommodation, which would provide the vital points of having an address, in order that they can open a bank/ post office account which are one of the very reasons they have difficulties applying for rented accommodation and job interviews. Let us put other projects which will be costing millions of pounds, such as the Dover Fast Track bus service, on hold until we have resolved the very pressing issue of caring for our very own people first. Signing out.


