The recent changes in government legislation on COVID measures as most of you are aware, have impacted on the Village Hall just like everywhere else. The Hall risk assessment has been changed from the 19 July and the main features of this are as follows

- It is no longer obligatory for facemasks to be worn in the hall although this is recommended
- The sanitisers and handwashing facilities remain in place and the public are encouraged to use them
- Restrictions on numbers using the hall have been lifted although must still fall within former insurance protocols hall users can discuss when booking the ball
- Sanitisation of shared crockery and kitchenware remains a concern so cupboards containing these will remain locked until end of August. The committee is investigating buying a commercial dishwasher.
- The stage is now open and a one-way system for the hall is no longer compulsory.

All hall users will be given an updated risk assessment. During the holidays we will be overhauling the electrics in the small hall and painting the foyer and corridor. We apologise if this causes any inconvenience to anyone using the hall, but we will be working around hall bookings

At the time of writing, plans are under way for both the New Residents/Volunteer lunch on Saturday 7 August and the Garage Safari on Sunday 5 September. It's not too late to register your attendance at the lunch – it's open to new residents who've arrived over the last 19 months and/or anyone wanting to help out at the hall. We have invited current regular hall users and volunteers so you can get to know what happens within the community. Booking is required for numbers, so please contact Sally Cook on <u>eures1994@yahoo.com</u> or Caroline Bunting on <u>c.bunting@btconnect.com</u> for details.



From the vicarage

I read that in Britain, more than three million pets were bought during lockdown. It's easy to understand why - many of us look to our pets for love and companionship. We have a family of cockatiels, who seem to find someone arriving home as exciting as anything you can imagine.

Of course, the downside of pet ownership is that inevitably the moment comes when we have to say goodbye. More than once when I was teaching in school, I was asked by a grief-stricken child whether their much-loved pet might have gone to heaven. And frustratingly, nothing – not even the Bible - offers a clear answer.

We had a goodbye of our own recently. At ten years old, Peter Rabbit – the name that the pet shop gave him always stuck – was ancient by bunny standards. In later life he had needed almost monthly visits to the vet to have his teeth fixed. Arriving home, he would be sleepy for a day or so and then normal service would resume – eating, being stroked, and running over my foot. But then age finally caught up with him, and we laid him to rest in the garden where his hutch used to stand.

It was after dark one evening about a week later when I noticed that something had triggered the light outside the front door. I investigated – and there, playing on the garden path, was a young wild rabbit. At one point it stretched up the door and looked through into the porch. But before I could fetch my camera, it hopped off across the garden and disappeared.

Bunny heaven? I used to tell children that I believe that God loves our pets just as much as we do - and I still do.Brian.

The situation got so dangerous and with the children using the Lane for school we decided we had no choice but to pay the bill ourselves. The trees sit outside of our boundary but it would appear that the land is not registered to anyone, which begs the question, how was permission granted to work on the lane recently.

The trees are now sorted but what if there are any future issues with the land.

Stage 3 of the lighting works has commenced. The pedestrian route to The Wing is currently slightly more difficult than normal as we proceed with our exciting scheme to floodlight the main features at the Memorial site.

The footpath in front of the Beaverbrook Wall just inside the entrance to the site is currently out of bounds for cabling work, and we regret any inconvenience caused to pedestrians or those in wheelchairs or pushing buggies. Those on foot can still access to The Wing and other areas by following the route around the back of Hunting Lodge (the building to the right of the entrance gates) or via the gate in the centre of the site, near to the bus stop. This will be closed but not locked and visitors using this access are

asked to close the gate behind them. We are sorry for any inconvenience, but we are sure the lighting scheme will make up for what is expected to be just one week's disruption.

We were all dressed for the cold wind in coats and jumpers, even if it was supposed to be Summer, but counted ourselves very lucky as the weather forecast predicted rain for the morning, it had all dried up by the time of the meeting and left only a very gusty wind coming off the cliffs. Carolyn's husband had kindly put bunting up to welcome us into the garden. With all the extra side tables and chairs that had been brought in, there was enough for all on the large patio so we didn't have to go onto the wet grass on the lawn. Everyone looked happy with smiley faces as they came in and found a chair to sit on. Pam gave out a piece of paper to everyone which saved her having to try to shout out in the fierce wind, she welcomed the members and thanked all the people who had helped to organise and set it up, she also informed us of future events. Cups of tea and coffee were handed out along with the individually wrapped lemon cake made by Caroline, Debbie's strawberry and cream cake and Carolyn's chocolate crispy cakes.

Alison organised the Lucky Dip with items wrapped in pretty paper or gift bags with a number attached, she made little envelopes and inside put a small slip of paper with a number on it. she went round to everyone with her box of envelopes. After choosing one and opening it to find a number, members went to the table to find the matching number and opening the package there was a lot of oohing and aaahhhs, along with "that's nice" and "that will come in handy "comments. Then it was time for tea and coffee refills which was needed with all the talking and also feeling a bit cold it quickly warmed us up. All too soon it was time to say our goodbyes and get ready to leave. Pat had a boxful of cupcakes for everyone to choose one to take home with them to eat later. After helping to clear up it was time for home having had a lovely afternoon.

Whoops!!!!!! in last months' Grapevine I said we would be having the tallest sunflower competition at the July Garden meeting but it isn't until the August Garden meeting. SORRY. But on the positive side, that gives us a whole month more to see how much bigger they will get and they should have flowers on them by then.





Our July Garden meeting was held in Eve's Garden. Pam welcomed everyone and gave an update on future events and the sub groups dates. Our speaker for the afternoon was Sue telling us about the interesting life of Laura Ashley, her early beginnings and being evacuated in WW2 back to Wales where she was born before her parents moved to London. Because there were so many children sent to the Welsh town, there wasn't room for her at the school so instead she went to a secretarial school at age 14. It was then sometime later she became a secretary for the W.I. lasting 7 years, her marriage to Bernard, raising 4 children and being extremely poor at times she somehow managed to find a way to make money. She remembered some of the crafts her grandmother had taught her, she made 20 scarves and persuaded John Lewis to sell them, which sold out very quickly. Along with her husband who made a printing machine for her and a silk screen frame they created more of her designs on tea towels, scarves, napkins and table mats. They opened their first shop in Wales selling locally produced honey and walking sticks besides their own products. Her dresses became so popular after she made the first one, they soon became in demand. They eventually opened up factories for fashion and textiles. She was known to be very kind to her staff. Later on, there was even more variety with her clothes and furnishings. Sadly, Laura died many years later at 60 after falling down the stairs at her daughter's house. Sue brought dresses and fabric with her to show us how heavy and good quality they were, she was wearing one herself which looked really smart. Jan thanked Sue for giving us such an interesting talk.

Jan read out a poem about someone eventually deciding to try a W.I. meeting, after thinking it might not be for her and was surprised at how friendly and ordinary everyone was, it was quite amusing.

Of course, no Garden Meeting can pass by without tea and coffee and this time there was all sorts of scones, cheese, sultana and plain ones, to go with the clotted cream, jam and butter. There was sausage rolls and butterfly cakes too. The competition was to make a garden scene on a plate, they were very cleverly done with adding flowers and foliage to make them look like mini gardens. After announcing the winners of the competition, it was on to the raffle which contained some useful and yummy items for the lucky ones to choose from. The afternoon flew by and soon we were saying our goodbyes and looking forward to the next Garden meeting in August.

Restarting surgery sessions at the Farmers' Market, on a Tuesday morning, will be given consideration at next meeting.

Surgeries, when they return, are attended by the Chairperson and Clerk of the Parish Council. • <u>Waste Collections:</u> The Manager of DDC Waste Department, returned our telephone call. We quote:

"Veolia, who were given the contract awarded to them this year, were responsible for the decision to change the collection arrangements and the online reporting system, to make it more efficient?????!!!! Which it hasn't. When asked, are they not now in breach of their contract, he stated, yes, and this is being dealt with by the "powers that be" within DDC. When asked about Folkestone Council decision to temporary suspend Garden Waste collection and would this be happening in Dover District, he commented that no decision had been made as yet by Veolia or DDC. Also, when asked why the District Councillor with Portfolio of Environment had not replied to email from Parish Council, he remained silent!

He continued with an assurance from Veolia that all missed collections for Capel-le-Ferne will be dealt with tomorrow, Saturday!"

Fingers crossed he is correct!!



On-going discussions with Kent Highways continue!

Capel Street

Plans received from Kent Highways, indicating location of further road markings and repeater signs, will be considered by a working party of Parish Councillors. This will include the decision on further traffic management of installing reduction in carriageway width in short sections, with priority from one direction.

New Dover Road

As the traffic survey results were disappointing, Councillors will give thought to what other traffic management improvements can be applied to slow down traffic.

Dover Hill

The works carried out by Kent Highways were not as expected when meetings were held two years ago. The Phase 2 was expected to include lane reduction from two into one, further down the hill. The work carried out, does nothing to help the original reason for the request made, to slow down traffic that speeds up the Hill in two lanes.

Councillors for our area and Folkestone East area have been contacted regarding Highway's reasoning on change of original request. Ongoing communication will continue with all parties involved.







Dogs lose heat through panting, can only sweat through their paws, and are at high risk of getting heatstroke. Follow our top tips to keep your dog cool in the heat.

PROVIDE SHADE AND WATER /

Provide constant access to shaded areas inside and out.

Sensure there is always cold, clean, fresh water available.

KEEPING COOL

- Prevent sunburn by using pet-safe sunscreen on ear tips and nose.
- Brush your dog regularly to keep their coat thin and free from matts or knots.

Use frozen toys, paddling pools or water sprinklers to entertain and cool your dog down.

WALKIES

Head out in the early morning or late evening when it's cooler.

Oon't run or cycle with your dog when it's hot.

Avoid pavements. If the ground is too hot to touch with your hand for a few seconds, it's too hot for paws!

REMEMBER:


