Well, the summer holidays are practically over; the children are nearly back at school and the hall is now fully open for business. Cupboards are unlocked, the 'comfy' chairs are available and its full steam ahead. However, we still recommend the wearing of masks and using soap and sanitiser and are keeping one eye on local COVID developments.

The Garage Safari will be running as usual on the first Sunday of September which this year is 5<sup>th</sup> September and will be starting a little earlier than usual at 8am. This is because we realised that people were turning up early anyway to look at the stalls so decided to make it official. With this in mind, we anticipate finishing around about 2pm. Food and drink, including breakfast bacon butties, lunch time rolls and lots of cake, will be available at the village hall. We ran out of food last year so are increasing supplies! Maps showing the location of the various stalls will be available also at the Hall. At the time of writing, we had upwards of more than 60 stalls but last-minute bookings can be made via Cherry Leppard on 01303 255114. We ask that people using cars to get to the village, park on the green area next to the hall – access via Lancaster Avenue. There will be someone there to assist with parking. It would be appreciated if visitors would refrain from double parking in Capel's narrow streets and particularly across resident driveways.

We are also currently planning a McMillan Coffee morning on Saturday, September  $25^{\text{th}}$  from 10.30am to 12.30pm – obviously, all proceeds will be going to the charity. Please come along and support. There will be a raffle, an opportunity for a chat and yet another chance to eats lots of cake. Supplies of cake would also be gratefully received.

The Hall has been having its electrical lighting overhauled during the summer and we tend to do a lot of general servicing and testing while people are away on holiday. After the painting has been done, we will be considering what other maintenance/improvements need to be done. If you have comments on this, then please feel free to use the comments book (kept in the kitchen), so they can be considered at the monthly meeting. We have had enquiries about whether we intend to hold the Indoor Boot Fairs this year in November and February. At the moment this is still being debated, but we will let you know as soon as a decision has been reached. We are also working on next year's Village Fete to take place on the 18<sup>th</sup> June. Ideas at the moment include funfair rides and a musical evening. If you would be interested in taking part in the fete, then please get in contact. We would love to hear from prospective stallholders, catering vans, bands, organisations who want to take part in a display or people who want to help on the day. 

#### From the vicarage

While out shopping recently, we passed a young woman sitting in a doorway clutching a piece of paper: *I'm hungry*, *please help*. We gave her some change, knowing that she would soon be hungry again.

Sadly, surviving on the charity of others becomes a way of life for some, and it is not always easy to know what to do for the best when approached. Once, on my way to a meeting in Canterbury – and so wearing my clerical collar - someone staggered up to me in the street. Someone had thumped him in the head the previous evening, he said, and he had had a headache ever since. The police had done nothing, and at the Kent and Canterbury Hospital he had been told to go to the QEQM Hospital at Margate. But how to get there? He was already late for his appointment and had no money.

Yes, I know what you're thinking – I was being taken for the proverbial ride. But since "On your bike" was neither Christian nor practical in the circumstances, I walked him to the bus station, found a bus that was going to the QEQM Hospital, explained to the driver where he needed to get to and bought his ticket. But he didn't take a seat; now he needed to find his friend. He must have been one of the bus driver's regulars; thanking me on his behalf for his ticket, she scolded him: "I've told you before about asking for money!"

I have no idea where he ended up. But the New Testament Letter to the Hebrews warns: "Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some have unwittingly entertained angels." So, maybe I did the right thing after all......Brian.

Stage 3 of the lighting works has commenced. The pedestrian route to The Wing is currently slightly more difficult than normal as we proceed with our exciting scheme to floodlight the main features at the Memorial site.

The footpath in front of the Beaverbrook Wall just inside the entrance to the site is currently out of bounds for cabling work, and we regret any inconvenience caused to pedestrians or those in wheelchairs or pushing buggies. Those on foot can still access to The Wing and other areas by following the route around the back of Hunting Lodge (the building to the right of the entrance gates) or via the gate in the centre of the site, near to the bus stop. This will be closed but not locked and visitors using this access are

asked to close the gate behind them. We are sorry for any inconvenience, but we are sure the lighting scheme will make up for what is expected to be just one week's disruption.

A template will be made, so that it is all the same size. It will only be the actual pennants, as they will be put on the ties.




