HMRC Scams Targeting Students

TO STOP FRAUD™

Scammers are aware that many students will be taking on part time work to support themselves during their studies at university or during the 6th Form. The scammers will target them with phishing emails and texts, stating that they may be due a tax rebate or need to pay a fine for unpaid tax. Let your sons and

daughters know about these scams and remember that the HMRC will never email or text with threats or offers of a rebate for overpaid tax etc.

Bank Impersonation Scams

We have reported on these several times during the past year and the below from Take Five is a timely reminder about the threat posed by Bank Impersonation Scams which have increased nationally by a massive 94% during 2020.

TO STOP FRAUD

As always, if unsure, apply ABC and never Assume or Believe it is your Bank and always Confirm by ringing them back using a trusted number that can be found on the back of your debit or credit card.

Remember, your Bank will never request that you move monies to safe accounts or request details of your passwords or PIN numbers.


