Well, the nights are closing in and the weather is definitely beginning to deteriorate, although there have been some lovely crisp autumn days recently. Days when people want to be and about. There are a number of events planned for the next couple of months at the Hall including a craft fair, carol service, a quiz, a boot fair and the halls' Annual General Meeting (AGM) not forgetting the various clubs that are up and running.

This year's Village Hall AGM will be held in the large hall (to allow for social distancing) on Monday, 29th November at 6.30pm. There are two Annual Reports to go through, as there was no AGM last year. All village residents are welcome as we seek views on the road ahead. Nominations for trustees are also invited. The Christmas Craft Fair will be held on the 21st November from 10am till 2pm, with over 25 different stalls in attendance. Thanks go to Carol Richards for all her hard work on this. There is a Boot Fair this year, but to accommodate the Christmas Craft Fair, we have moved this to the 5th December from 8am-12noon. A Carol Service will also be held at the Hall in December – more details in the next Grapevine.

Under discussion recently, has been the planned extension and improvements to the hall. As many of you may be aware, before the pandemic, talks were under way about extending the Hall. We have had many occasions where we were forced to turn down bookings as the hall diary was already full and after long discussion, had decided to create another large hall to facilitate this requirement. We had managed to save enough to allow us to look for matched funding for the work. However, the pandemic hit us hard and used up nearly all our savings. Through grants from DDC, we have been able to recoup most of this but are intensely aware that should we be closed again, we will face similar issues, so this extension has been put on hold for the time being. This past month has been the only time in 18 months that we have not made a loss. However, we had also decided to re-do the main hall floor at the same time as the extension, as the concrete underneath has been crumbling and needs replacing. So, although the extension will not be going ahead, we are going to replace the main hall floor, including all the badminton lines which have caused us such grief lately. This work will require an initial survey and then there will be a period where the main hall will have to be shut. We will do this at a time to maintain the minimum of disruption to our hall users, but it won't be this side of Christmas, as we still have to source the builders.

So, a busy couple of months ahead at the hall but we hope to see a lot of you there.

From the vicarage

My grandad lived with us when I was small. He was a keen gardener, and in summer the flowers he grew would be smothered in butterflies. I spent hours watching them, and a fascination grew that has stayed with me ever since.

When a friend of mine became a priest, she chose to have her stole – the decorated strip of cloth that priests wear – embroidered with butterfly shapes. For Christians, the transformation from a caterpillar crawling on a leaf, through being a chrysalis hanging apparently lifelessly from a twig, to becoming a butterfly flying across the countryside recalls Jesus walking the earth, then lying in the tomb following his crucifixion, then his resurrection from the dead and all that has followed from it. It spoke to her of her journey through life, growing and changing through some dark times before reaching that moment when her new life as a priest could begin.

By early November, butterflies have all but disappeared. Peacocks and Small Tortoiseshells will have found a tree trunk, outhouse, or even a church for their winter sleep. The colder weather seems to catch out Red Admirals, leaving them lying on pavements, unable to fly and in danger of being trodden underfoot. Me being me, I must admit that I pick up any I find and move them - but that is all anyone can do for them.

At church, November is a solemn month. With it comes All Saints, All Souls and Remembrance Sunday, celebrating and remembering those whom we love, but see no longer. The readings and prayers confront us with our mortality, but also offer words of hope, and a way through. For the moment, the cold, grey days of winter lie ahead. But beyond that, the spring – and more butterflies... **Brian.**








CAPEL-LE-FERNE EVENING WI



Hello everyone, Autumn seems to have arrived far too quickly with the leaves falling off the trees, getting colder and the nights are drawing in so, it's a good job we are able to have all our meetings indoors now. I expect some of us will have made Christmas cakes, or making Christmas gifts, even writing the Christmas cards and sorting out the garden, clearing it up before Winter and putting in flower bulbs ready for the Spring. At our October meeting, Jan greeted the members and introduced our speaker for the evening who was Mary talking about" A Schoolgirl's War ". She told us that she used to be a head teacher of Maidstone Grammar School for Girls.

A wartime scrapbook was found at the school with pictures showing school life during the 2nd World War, which were drawn and painted by Helen Keen an Art teacher at the school. The pictures show some of the events that the girls went through during the war. Concrete bunkers were found years later that had been blocked in, they had been built under the gardens at the front of the building and years later another was found at the back of the school, which also had been blocked in sometime after the war. The bunkers had tunnels and six zig zag corridors that could accommodate a class of 30 pupils in each, there was a lot of steep steps going down to the narrow, cold, damp and mud floored corridors with narrow benches on either side with a Dado rail to keep the pupils backs off the concrete walls. When the air raid sirens went off the teacher and the girls took all they needed to carry on with the lessons, which must have been very difficult with no doors and the teachers in the next corridor trying to speak to her class as well. In each corridor in a corner there was a curtain and behind it contained shovels and pickaxes, in case they were trapped in but also a bucket for a toilet.




The pictures in the wartime scrap book are very detailed and also show some amusing scenes of how life was at the school, with lots of difficult situations including catering for them all with wartime rations and measuring out things like milk for each of the pupils.

Fifty of the old past pupils, some in their Eighties and Nineties, gave their accounts of how they dealt with school life in the war. Some of their comments were read out and had us all laughing at what they got up to, some of them had their photo taken when they went down the shelter to pose in the seats where they had sat all those years ago.

Children come from different areas to visit the school and try to imagine what it must have been like all those years ago and we heard about the funny comments they made, which had us once again laughing. Mary has written a book which includes many of the scrapbook pictures and a lot of the information from the old schoolgirls, it is very interesting giving a hindsight into how their school life was at that time. Sheila thanked Mary for her interesting and amusing talk and also told us about her time during the war at her school also. After our tea/coffee break with biscuits and lots of chatting, we made are way back to our seats. listened to Jan giving out information for the upcoming events, Patricia was given a certificate for being a longtime member and had her photo taken to remember the occasion. All too soon it was time to go home. If you are feeling a bit lonely or fed up and want to do something different, you are welcome to come to our meetings to try us out and see if it is for you. Once you join there are so many sub groups we have, so there should be lots to keep you busy and enjoy.



- Maintain hedges and fences to prevent unwanted visitors from entering your garden.

- Secure sheds and garages with suitable locks and consider fitting shed alarms and security lights.
- Disable lawn mowers and other large machinery when not in use and chain items together or to a solid anchor point.
- Security-mark valuable items taking photographs and recording details such as serial numbers and identifying marks can also help to identify items if they get lost or stolen.

Look after your belongings

- Only take with you what you need for a trip out leave valuables at home.
- If you have a bag, keep it fastened and to the front of your body.
- Keep valuables out of sight, spread around your person (for example keep your phone in a bag, your house keys in a pocket and your money in a jacket).

Every year many pets suffer extreme fear due to the noise of fireworks that can go on for weeks or even months.




Symptoms can include shaking, pacing, crying, attempting to hide or run away, vomiting, being too scared to eat or to go outside in their garden or for walks.

Just one bang from a firework can terrify an animal for many hours.

If fireworks are set off on one night, owners can use medication and other methods to attempt to help their pets, but if fireworks go off for weeks it can be impossible for owners to manage their pets' fear. Exposure to fireworks can cause life long debilitating noise phobias.

You can help the pets in your neighbourhood to feel safe!



If you're going to set off fireworks at home please inform any neighbours who have pets and try to stick to November 5th. Your neighbours will then have time to prepare to keep their pets safe at the right time. Thank you!

Is your dog barking too much?

Constant barking or howling can cause considerable annoyance to neighbours particularly if it occurs at unsociable hours and may lead to enforcement action. Your dog may not like being left on its own for long periods of time but if you do, make sure you ask someone to visit.


