

# From the vicarage

As we chatted to a friend who told us that she had 'done Dry January' my wife told her that *He* (meaning me) *gives up cake for Lent*. That made me think: how to explain that there's more to Lent than just giving things up? I had to do just that one morning years ago when OFSTED arrived in the school where I was teaching. I was given the job of taking assembly. In front of me, not just those I taught but, at the back of the hall, three inspectors clutching clipboards, scribbling away furiously. The pressure was on.

Lent happens between pancakes and Easter Eggs, I began. Then I moved on the Biblical story of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness – you may know it. On the screen above my head, a slide of a medieval painting showed Jesus, unfazed as the devil appears and tries to lead him astray. The artist had taken the story literally; I wondered aloud how many of them had ever seen anyone with horns and a tail.

Then I showed them a modern painting by a Stanley Spencer, *Christ in the Wilderness – The Scorpion*. Christ sits alone in a barren landscape, looking down at a scorpion in his hand, deep in thought.

I asked: what might Christ be thinking? About the person he really is, perhaps, and how to be his true self? For Christians, Lent is a time for taking time to think about the people we really are, and how to be our true selves.

I finished by reading a traditional Lent prayer. The hall emptied. One of those at the back thanked me for showing the Spencer painting as another smiled over the top of his clipboard.

Once we had all settled down and everything cleared away, Pam gave an update on Malawi and informed the newer members about her story of how she and a friend visited Uganda and Malawi for quite a few years ago, right up until COVID prevented them from going. Pam and her friend had become friendly with a lady called Sarah, who belonged to the Salvation Army and lived in Uganda. They decided to see if they could buy a quantity of mosquito nets for local people who could not afford them, after realising how important they were. They then started collecting donations when their holiday was over, enabling Sarah to carry on buying more mosquito nets which helped the local people tremendously. Each time they visited, they helped a school get supplies of what they needed, especially pencils, so that each pupil had one of their own and coloured pencils for the class to share. Pam told us the story of her friend who went to a supplier for the pencils and managed to get a big supply of rejects, some might have names on or happy birthday, but on closer inspection found quite a few with some rude words on and had to go through the whole lot, as they certainly were not suitable for the pupils. The school had around 1,300 pupils with one toilet for the girls, so money was raised to get toilet blocks built and one included 2 showers for the girls. The school needed new blackboards, so they arranged for a carpenter to make 13 new ones and Pam and her friend gave them several coats of paint and a final coat of blackboard paint.

INSPIRING WOMEN

Over the years they have painted classrooms, raised money for bore holes, so the school and locals could get water, received donations to sort out the very uneven playground, and also made 13 sets of curtains by hand sewing them because the sewing machine that was there had very dangerous wiring. There were so many more jobs to do, it seemed like a never-ending task for them, but they enjoy it and love going there.

The competition was for "A Watery Scene", there was quite a few entries with some lovely paintings. Susanne came in first place; Debbie second place and Vad came in third.

The last thing of the evening was the raffle with some very nice and useful prizes.







Local residents can register for free and without obligation online where you will fill in the details of your roof, like size and position. Installations will generally not need planning permission. However, in some cases, such as in Conservation Areas and on Listed Buildings, planning permission may be required.
