

2022 has been our first full year without COVID restrictions and the hall, is now busy and thriving with the large hall fully booked months in advance on top of the various clubs using the facilities. It has been a pleasure to welcome back old clubs and see new ones establish themselves.

Work has taken place around the hall during the year with new flooring, a new cooker and general decorating. A new sound system has been installed and a hearing loop to aid those with hearing impairment. The hall now has broadband installed, with free Wi-fi available to all hall users, with booster so that all areas of the hall have a strong signal. Next year there are plans to create easy access for those without the internet or a computer – more news of this in the next Grapevine. Our latest issue has been the flat roof over the foyer which has developed several leaks. Recent weather has exacerbated this, and repair work has taken place to sort it out. However, work is also planned to overhaul the roof completely.

Coming up in December is the Carol Concert at the Village Hall on the 11th December and the Christmas Farmers Market on 13th December. All are welcome and the school choir will be in attendance. The final Farmers' Market before Christmas will be 20th December. Don't forget to put your Christmas orders in soon. A community lunch is planned for the new year with all Capel residents welcome, although there will have to be a limit on numbers, so tickets will be issued. A two-course meal will be provided. If anyone is then interested. please contact eures1994@yahoo.com. And as well as the indoor Boot fair on the 27th November, there will be another on 26th February. Doors open at 8am.

And then on the 28th November our Annual General Meeting will be taking place. We do ask that as many of you as possible attend. The new Annual Report will be on display in the hall after the meeting has discussed it, together with the annual financial report. It has been a busy year with the various maintenance and refurbishment projects, but our prices remain very competitive, and our accounts remain healthy.

From the vicarage

I am writing this on Remembrance Sunday - a day of looking back and remembering, as well as looking forward and praying for a better tomorrow. It also happens to be the deadline for the December edition - which means that even though as I write, Advent hasn't even begun, by the time you read this Christmas will be well and truly on its way.

Some say that Jesus could possibly have been born around September – shepherds would not have been watching flocks in the fields as late as December. But in the year 336, the Roman Emperor Constantine chose to celebrate the birth of Christ on 25th December, and the tradition seems to have stuck. Since it was the time of year when pagan midwinter celebrations were in full swing anyway, some suspect he may have simply got in on the act.

But what is there to celebrate? Read about the Nativity, and Mary and Joseph turn out to have more in common with today's homeless couples looking for somewhere to stay than we would like to think; for women to have to give birth in the same circumstances as Mary today, would cause an outcry; and refugees of our own time, know all too well what it must have been like for that couple and their baby, when they had to flee to Egypt to escape the homicidal King Herod.

But for Christians, Christmas is a time of looking back to how Jesus came into the world as one of us – and remembering that it's often when life is at its messiest and most difficult, that people tend to find him. And that Christmas is also a time of looking forward and praying for a better tomorrow.





After singing Jerusalem, Jan introduced a skilled demonstrator, our very own Eve Muggeridge, who gave a fascinating and informative demonstration of how she produces beautiful stained-glass window/wall hangers. Explaining basic health and safety (body, feet, face), Eve showed a variety of different colours and textures of glass, explaining as she used a cutter to score glass and then tap it to separate it, how it needs to always be treated with care. Having ground the edges, she drew round the template, cut it out, edged with copper foil, soldered (carefully) it all together, to produce a beautiful glass bird to hang in the window, simple as that! Eve always works from a template, of which she has hundreds, including birds, animals, transport, flowers, Christmas decorations & many specially commissioned items. Ladies were invited to admire, and buy, a range of examples of her skilled hobby.

During refreshments ladies were invited to guess the weight of the cake and number of sweets in the jar, both in advance of Saturday's coffee morning.




