

February has been another busy month with both a Community Lunch and a Boot Fair to organise. The lunch proved very successful with 27 people in attendance and there are plans to repeat the experience. Lessons learnt include buying in some more dessert plates and that we need a dishwasher!

At the time of writing there are more than 20 tables booked for the indoor boot fair and we hope to have better weather than last time when the heavens opened. Even at an indoor boot fair, people still have to venture forth!

We have received 3 tenders for the flat roof and

will be debating these and potentially others at

our next meeting. Less than 10 years old in places, the roof has caused continuing problems particularly over the last two years and it is important that we have it replaced/overhauled this year. We plan to apply for match funding to help with the cost which will be considerable. Equally there may be access issues for some of our hall users once work is underway, but we have overcome these before and will do again. Since the New Year, the Farmers' Market has suffered from what can only be described as januaryitis! Traditionally quiet in January, with craft stalls choosing not to attend so soon after The market was then hit by the Christmas. sudden decision by Farthingloe Farm bakery to cease taking part after more than 17 years. Luckily, Vanes of Dover has agreed to supply the market and their bread and cakes are of excellent quality. Katie, who used to sell Farthingloe goods, has now agreed to run the bakery for the hall and in its initial weeks has proved very popular. With stalls returning, we are now working on providing a fruit and veg stall with others in the pipeline.

Volunteers have long been the mainstay of the hall, helping out at events such as the boot fairs, the Garage Safaris and not least the Farmers Market. We are always in need of help for these events and have been touched recently by the willingness of people to step up and provide Jan Henry, the local Community assistance. Warden, has been of particular support, always attending the Farmers Market and of late, helping out at the community lunch. Our thanks go out to her. We are still in need of trustees, as the number has reduced from 12 to 6 over the last few years. We meet every month for a couple of hours and keep in touch via email or phone the rest of the time. We can co-opt up to three trustees during the year and would welcome any support.

From the vicarage

I once heard a story — which may or may not be true - of a driving examiner who went to conduct a driving test. He took his seat, told the candidate what to expect, and then waited for them to move off. But instead, the candidate sat looking at the controls, muttering quietly. You have driven before, haven't you? he asked. Well, no... came the reply. But I've done a lot of watching!

March this year coincides with Lent – the forty days of fasting that lead up to Holy Week and Easter. A friend of mine is fond of pointing out that the word Lent comes from the Old English word for Spring – so according to her, it is best seen as an opportunity, as a time of personal growth, rather than just as forty miserable days without cakes, biscuits, or chocolate. It all begins with Ash Wednesday, when the Gospel reading reminds us that there's a right and a wrong way to set about things. Jesus tells his followers: Whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward...

It's a bit like that driving test – we can do any amount of watching, but until we get into gear and take the wheel in our hands we don't go anywhere. And simply setting out to please or impress others doesn't get us anywhere either – that doesn't help us to grow.

So, if you're keeping Lent, I wish you well with whatever you decide to do - and hope that when Easter arrives, we shall all find that we've grown, at least a bit, in one way or another. Brian

REMINDER and FOR INFORMATION PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER

THE ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, CRIME & POLICING ACT 2014

In 2022, Dover District Council introduce a new Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) in accordance with the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. Capel-le-Ferne Playing Field and The Battle of Britain Memorial Site have some restrictions, relating to dogs.

Map attached and areas listed below.

This order would cover:

> Failing to remove dog faeces. > Not keeping a dog on a lead in specified areas; > Not putting, and keeping, a dog on a lead when directed to do so by an authorised officer; > Permitting a dog to enter land from which dogs are excluded.

> Street drinking > Unauthorised camping

It would be an offence to breach any of the above requirements and would be punishable via a fixed penalty notice of £100 (reduced to £75 if paid within 10 days). A fine of up to £1,000 could be imposed upon prosecution. A copy of current PSPO can be found on the link below https://www.dover.gov.uk/.../2022-signed-PSPO-with-maps...

> Enclosed children's play area, Pentaque Court and Skate Park, Lancaster Avenue; (All areas covered by CCTV).

Keeping of Dogs on Lead in Capel-le-Ferne:

> Battle of Britain Memorial, New Dover Road.

Save Our Lychgate! Capel-le-Ferne St. Mary's, Lychgate Appeal
This lychgate has stood at the entrance to the Churchyard since 1894 when
Captain and Mrs Arthur Morris donated it to the village to celebrate their marriage.
For nearly 130 years it has, as might be expected, needed running repairs from time to time
given its exposed location. These have been enough to maintain it – until now.
An architect's survey has shown that rot has penetrated the frame and joints.
Some of these joints are opening up, and the structure is moving as a result.
Extensive restoration work will soon be required if the lychgate is to remain.
Please help by donating whatever you can spare to the St. Mary's Lychgate Appeal,

We send our emails from donotreply@tvlicensing.co.uk (or donotreply@spp.tvlicensing.co.uk).

☑If you are a TV Licensing payment card customer and you make mobile payments via the TVL Pay app, you may receive emails from noreply@paypoint.com. The sender's name will show as 'TVL Pay'.

Scammers often hide the true email address they're using, check the email address. On your device, select the sender's name (or email address) to show the actual email address.

KENT COUNTY COUNCIL BUDGET REPORT

In the last few weeks, we have been very busy preparing for the budget meeting which we had on Thursday the 9th.

Last year we saw the invasion of Russia into Ukraine. Which has not only had a disabling effect on the World and our Country it has also created a huge liability on KCC financially, due to this situation and huge inflationary prices.

Officers over spent by a staggering 67 million pounds which mostly had to come from KCC's reserves leaving us as a Council really close to going into the red. Due to us being the leading group in the council, it is our duty to find a balanced budget however, this is one of the most difficult task a party could do, especially when there are so many uncertainties in the near future, we still have to try and shield ourselves from any unpredictable events that could still rear their ugly head in the near future.

We have managed to undertake this difficult task, but it now leaves us in a position where high-cost issues such as Highways and Adult Social Care will have had have their funding seriously compromised, as well as all other expenditure we undertake as a Council, Adult Social Care which forms the major part of the KCC's budget is mandatory to take priority over departments such as Community Assets and other none mandatory expenses.

This for myself has been an extremely, hard year because I see what the none mandatory expenses can do in helping our local community. As councillors, this is an example of demands placed upon us which we have to manage. I am trying to prepare my communities that we are still not out the woods by any measure and may still have a couple of difficult years ahead of us.

You can have my assurance that I will continue to try to push officers in directions within my division that needs priority attention

On a more positive note, you will be pleased to hear that DCC have just been awarded 18 million pounds from the levelling up fund this will be directly spent in Dover Town and Bench Street which should see a massive improvement for Dover Town and Dover Residents. Encouraging tourism and greater footfall for the area.

If I can just emphasise to the local community that decisions we have to take as Councillors have not been taken lightly during this worrying financial climate which affects us all.
