1.	Capel Street		 Problem- Speeding issues at all times of the day. Evidenced by speed watch data. Cars are parked on both sides of the road so two-way traffic is an issue. In addition to this there is Capel School located on this road and we need to consider the safety of the children. Solution - Speed cushions. PLUS, attendance of Kent & Medway Safety Camera Partnership ANPR Units request. Cost - of £7,250 per pair, as per New Highways Works Request Information Pack Version October 2019. 		Speed survey to evidence issues. All traffic calming measures to be considered in relation to speed survey before implementing. It is worth noting that traffic calming is not always appropriate in all locations and can have a number of associated negative effects including noise and vibration impacts. Full consultation with residents required before implementing. Speed surveys to be undertaken along Caple Street. Parish Council to indicate suitable locations for equipment. Speed surveys to be undertaken in March 2021. Once data received, Louise Winch to look at engineering interventions to reduce the speed.
2.	Junctions / Intersections off all side roads on B2011 and Capel Street.		 Problem - Speeding through the village, Speed limit was reduced to 20mph and whilst there are signs, we feel it needs to be reinforced when going from the main roads to the side roads. Solution - Roundels - to be placed at road junctions that currently do not have them. The roundels are to be placed in a visible position and not where cars are likely to park. 		KCC to put together an outline design for location. 1 per junction with the B2011. Louise Winch to put together an outline design for the installation of signage and roundels. Done (emailed to Parish)



3.	B2011	Cost - £160 per pair, as per New Highways Works Request Information Pack Version October 2019. Problem - Speeding and extremely high speeds, evidenced by speed watch data. Solution - 40mm, 40mph speed repeater Dover end, (we already have one Folkestone end). Both signs to include an option to gather and retrieve data. PLUS, attendance of Kent & Medway Safety Camera Partnership ANPR Units request. Cost - £6,870 as per New Highways Works Request Information Pack Version October 2019.	See email dated 21 st September 2020. KCC ITS team responsible for the installation of such an asset.
