So, the roof is finally finished, and we can move on to the internal decoration of the entrance foyer. The roofers have been very good at working round us, but the noise and upheaval has on occasion caused irritation to our hall users for which we apologise. But at least we have a secure roof ready for the winter weather. Although the summer weather hasn't been that good recently! I should like to thank Alex and his team for doing such a sterling job and to thank the hall users for their forbearance.

Our most recent community lunch seems to have gone down very well (literally) and we look forward to doing another event probably in October. We hope to have proper bowls next time although personally I think the strawberries in cups were a triumph! Watch this space for dates and details. An event looming up is our Garage Safari which takes place on the first Sunday in September every year. This year that's the 3 September and it starts at 9am. To book your stall and get it on the map please put a fiver in an envelope with your name and address on it and either put it through the door at 29 Albany Road or give it in at the Farmers Market. Ask for Sally or Cherry particularly if you have any queries. We will be providing parking at the event, next to the recreation ground alongside the hall, and would ask all visitors to park there and then walk around the village. We cannot enforce this, but it does prevent you parking across someone's drive and annoying the locals. Refreshments can be found at the Village Hall, and we will try not to run out too early this year of bacon butties and cake.

A new event will be arriving in October, namely that of the Snap Auction. Items will be auctioned off by our seasoned auctioneer Bob and we hope it will be an evening of fun and frolic. We will also be holding our normal indoor boot fairs in November and February. We do get asked occasionally why we run all these fundraisers for the hall, particularly when our number of loyal volunteers are at an all-time low. After all the fees we charge for the hall do cover the utility charges, the insurances, the licences, the cost of cleaning and general maintenance, which is not bad considering the most expensive rate we charge for residents for the big hall on a Saturday night is £15 per hour. Well, the reason is the upkeep. The extra expenses we incur for painting, flooring, new windows, doors, electrics etc are normally funded through fundraising. Our most recent expense – the roof – has cost us over £18,000 which is the most expense we have experienced in a long time. So, we would encourage you to support the Village Hall and its activities, so that we can continue to provide a venue which is fit for purpose for the many clubs and organisations currently using it.

Over the years I've been given several keepsakes. Some are notelets from grateful couples who were still buzzing with the excitement of their big day – and others, more poignantly, sent with thanks for help through sad and difficult times. One is a photo, given as a memento of a christening when I was still a curate. I had just taken the baby girl in my arms and turned towards the font when she grabbed hold of my beard – and someone, camera at the ready, caught the moment and sent me a copy.

I was in that same church once when someone walked in and gazed around. I hadn't seen him before, but he told me proudly that it was *his* family church – it was the place where they always celebrated weddings and held funerals.

But it was actually others who, Sunday by Sunday, had kept it going until what they could afford to put in the collection, no longer met the cost of keeping it open. Sadly, that baby girl's children – she will be a teenager by now – won't have the option of being christened in the same church as their mum.

I've always liked the idea of serving in a church that is there for people when they most need it – but even I must admit that that's getting more challenging. Our numbers have dwindled since the pandemic - but we've responded by holding *more* services in the parish, not less! At least for now, there is a service in each of our churches nearly every Sunday – and everyone is invited!

Along with that there are bells to be rung, a choir to sing with, flowers to be arranged and friends to be made. Come and give it a try... *Brian*

Following the Parish Council meeting on Tuesday, 18th July 2023, a Neighbourhood Plan for Capel-le-Ferne was discussed further. A decision, by a majority vote of Councillors, was <u>not</u> to pursue a Neighbourhood Plan for Capel, taking into account the following points of information;

>> The average costs are estimated by the Ministry of Communities, Housing and Local Government (MCHLG) at £20,000 to £86,000 per plan. Plans are likely to vary in costs depending on the complexity and size of the proposal. Capelle-Ferne likely to be £20,000 to £25,000. This just doesn't seem viable so close to a new local plan being approved by the Secretary of State. >> There is also a basic grant available of £10,000, so the cost to the Parish Council, using public Precept funded monies, could be £10,000 to £15,000, although for a village the upper figure is probably unlikely.

As is the electorates' probability on considering and agreeing spending this amount in view of information available.

- >> The estimated time scale is currently 3 to 5 years. >> A neighbourhood plan takes hours and hours of volunteers' time. All types of professionals needed, and at the end of this, it has to go out to consultation, then be accepted by DDC. A massive task, hence why they rarely get completed.
- >> If the village had supported back in 2016, the timing would have been more appropriate. >> The success rate of Neighbourhood Plans in Dover District is dismal, as many seem to have stalled for whatever reason. The idea of a local plan is to establish building, not to stop it. >> However, you do get a say where development is best suited. But this is considered not viable now, because of Dover District Council Land Allocation Local Plan.

The Parish Councillors welcome all communication enquiries on issues relating to our village. So, if we can be of any further assistance, please do not hesitate to contact us.

REPORT OF CRIMINAL DAMAGE WITNESSED and RECORDED ON CCTV

Could we please request that you do not allow your dog to destroy our lovely trees on the Lancaster Avenue Recreational Field. Footage of a man allowing his dog to strip at last 5 feet of bark from a tree, without any signs of stopping it, could now cause the tree to die. The footage has been downloaded and will be passed to Kent Police as an act of criminal damage. KENT POLICE CRIME REFERENCE NUMBER: DP-32203-23-4606-01

Under the present Public Space Protection Order for this location, dogs are allowed off lead to exercise, but if anti-social behaviour of some dog owners continues, the Parish Council may need to consider the location is re-evaluated as a "Dogs on lead" area, which will carry a fine if enforced.

UPDATE - CRIMINAL DAMAGE TO TREES ON PLAYING FIELD

On further investigation, at least six trees have been damaged and some more recent than previously reported. So, is it still happening?? Please, if you witness any attacks on our lovely trees, report to Kent Police as Criminal Damage and, only if safe to do so, take a snapshot of the offender. The Parish Councillors will be discussing ways to prevent this happening further. Thank you for any help that can be provided.









Some updates and reports for you as follows.

- > KCC are appealing for more foster parents to join the fostering team so if anyone in the Parish is looking to or have ever considered fostering. Please come forward.
- There is a consultation out regarding waste recycle centres. This is for opening times and closure of some sites in Kent I urge residents to give their views on this consultation please.
- ➤ Kent Fire and rescue and trying to make people more aware. When charging some devices, they are urging people to research and check the quality of these devices when buying them.
- ➤ Also, Kent Fire and Rescue are asking people not to charge E-bikes/ scooters in hallways and entrance to houses or flats due to blocking emergency access points in case of a fire.
- ➤ Operation Brook is due to come back in place at the beginning of school holidays.
- ➤ Kent Trading Standards are cracking down of the selling of illegal vapes and the selling of these to underage children. If anyone is aware of this happening, please report to Kent Trading Standards.
