

The hall has been prepared for the winter too, with guttering cleared and cleaned and the gas boiler and radiators, have all been serviced. We hope to have had the foyer painted by the time you read this. We think we have overcome the gremlins in the kitchen, which recently caused our water boiler (the one that provides hot water for teas and coffee), to seize up just in time for the start of the Garage Safari and the Farmers' Market and tripped all the electrics, as we were busy serving customers. Which brings us neatly back to the Safari. We were blessed with the weather and even got a mention on local radio. Lots of people turned up due in no small part to Maureen, who advertised on 35 different sites. We had over 100 houses taking part and we were run off our feet in the Village Hall kitchen, but in a good way. The traffic marshals did a sterling job - thank you Jeremy and Gabriel - and altogether, we raised over £1400. This exceeds previous years, so thank you all very much, everyone who took part. The money is equivalent to one month's running costs for the hall, including cleaning, insurance and utilities and so is very important to us, but what was better was seeing some of the Facebook comments about neighbours chatting to neighbours and the enjoyment, that a lot of people got from the event. That in itself makes all the organisation and hard work worthwhile.

From the vicarage

I had thought that for me, job interviews were a thing of the past. But then I spotted an appeal from Canterbury Cathedral for local clergy to volunteer to assist at the service of Choral Evensong that takes place there each evening.

After an informal chat came a voice test - I was given a sheet of music and a note on a piano, and off I went, hoping that what I was singing matched what was on the sheet. Then, a few evenings later came the test: the Cathedral fell silent, I held a tuning fork to my ear, and sang: *O Lord, open thou our lips...* The choir sang the response: *And our mouth shall show forth thy praise...*

Over the next forty-five minutes or so, I sang a bit more, led the prayers and introduced the final hymn. I'd made the grade, and was subsequently installed as an Honorary Minor Canon – which sounds grand, but I'm still just a volunteer really.

Cathedrals need several priests, or Canons, to run everything. The one who organises services is called the Precentor - Canterbury hasn't had one for a while, but that changes in November when Revd Wendy Dalrymple arrives.

The photo that accompanied the announcement showed her standing in front of a stained-glass window wearing a short-sleeved blouse and clerical collar with a splendid array of tattoos on her arms. I won't dignify the bile that this photo prompted by repeating it here. But evidently, someone who is heavily tattooed themselves saw the story and remarked, that they didn't know that people like them were welcome in church – but now they do.

I look forward to meeting Canon Wendy and being on her team. And in case you're wondering, I don't have any tattoos – honest! ... *Brian*



Update on 30th anniversary fundraising campaign

Summary of some items discussed at meeting Tuesday, 19th September 2023



Requests from public and Other Feedback:

- ➤ Overgrown vegetation opposite Village Hall entrance, reported to Kent Highways for cut back.
- ➤ Coffee Mornings at Reece Adams Agreed not to fund, but offer other events held as alternative.
- ➤ Change of waste bin Albany Road, deferred to monitor, due to cost implication.
- ➤ Outstanding concerns of properties in Capel Street under investigation by Dover District Council.

Planning:

Hearing with Inspectorate on DDC Land Allocation Plan Examination (Capel), being held on 5th December at Council Offices. Councillors plan to attend, following the seeking and obtaining of expert advice and guidance.

Neighbourhood Watch:

➤ Issue of dogs in Pétanque Court has been resolved - DDC Environment Officer and Police have taken appropriate action. Future sightings, to please be reported. (Date/time)

Playing Field and Equipment:

- ➤ Goal posts, repositioned. Hedgerow and grass surface waiting attention.
- ➤ Cleaning of junior play soft play surfaces programmed.
- > CCTV change of coverage agreed and programmed.
- ➤ New bench to replace badly corroded/damaged one, ordered for installation.
- ➤ Defibrillator Pads replaced on unit at shop following their use.

Traffic Management and Highways:

- ➤ Minor Highway faults reported to Kent Highways, including; Hedges obstructing roads and footpaths.
- ➤ Installation of drop kerbs on various junctions, following requests from parishioners with wheelchairs, mobility scooters and pushchairs. In these locations, travelling on the road was necessary to get to corresponding drop kerb or avoid parked vehicles, to cross road. It will now enable users, safer ease of access to amenities, i.e., Village Hall, Playing Field and School. Waiting response from Kent Highways to query on lack of tactile surface.
- ➤ Waiting design plan from Kent Highways for double yellow lines at junctions with New Dover Road.

<u>Public Rights of Way:</u> Enquires on access issues ongoing. <u>Speed Watch</u>: Sessions taken place in various locations in Capel Street, New Dover Road and Old Dover Road. All results of sessions are available on Parish Council Website. If you could spare 1-2 hours a week to help educate drivers, join the Capel-le-Ferne Team. More details on page 17.

I also hope that with any future changes, Sharon has enough seniority to be able to pick the Capel delivery (if she so wishes). I wish her the very best of luck in the future. Her arrival in the village has been met with nothing but a fantastic reception. I can't talk for Sharon, (she does enough of that herself), but I do know she has thoroughly enjoyed her time in the village.

When I took over permanently from Jay R.I.P. (A great friend and colleague), along with his/my partner, Tim, I knew full well I was stepping into a massive pair of shoes to fill and very quickly realised how much he meant, not only to us at Royal Mail, but to you all in the village. I took on this round with one simple mantra "Don't let him down". Something I have lived by since day one and still do, to this day. Many times, on delivery, when I have been unsure, I have looked to the skies and asked "what would you do mate" and his advice has never let me down.

It's been trying at times, but ultimately one of the best experiences of my life.




