The end of the year, besides inviting us to enjoy bad weather, Father Christmas, turkey and too many mince pies, also enables us to look back over the year in preparation for the new one. Our Annual General Meeting will probably be over by the time the Grapevine comes out, but in preparing the annual report for the AGM, it has allowed the committee to take stock of what we have achieved during the past year. Main achievements this year, include the provision of community lunches by the hall and the complete overhaul of the large flat roof. Normal service continued during the latter and during the painting and reflooring of 4 rooms. The community lunches were an idea of a trustee at the early part of the year when nationwide, emphasis was being placed on high heating costs for those on fixed incomes and of the isolation faced by many. Initially we had 27 people attend the lunch with the latest lunch attracting 45. We intend to repeat these in the new year and have bid for funding from our local authority for help with this, although if we are unsuccessful, they will still go ahead. The redecorating has given us an extra storage room, useful for our regular hall users and an additional small meeting room which can also be used as an office. Computers and a wireless printer have been acquired for use by the village residents at the hall, the former being paid for by a grant from Dover District Council. These are available for research, printing documents and forms, and general personal use. Personal information is deleted after each use.


We hope next year to concentrate on consolidating our financial situation, which remains strong despite spending so much on the fabric of the building. New things are happening all the time with the latest being our snap auction which takes place at the hall on 2 December – we hope this will be a tremendous success. It was the idea of Bob Willard who runs the quiz at the Royal Oak, and he will be conducting the auction. Among the items to be sold are a child's bicycle, a car seat, a picnic set, new crockery and cutlery, an Ayrton Senna model racing car and numerous other things. You are invited to bring your own food and drink. We start at 6.30pm.

From the vicarage

If you want to know the true meaning of Christmas, we're told, be like the carrot in one of the cleverest TV commercials I've seen so far this year, based on Roald Dahl's *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. Christmas is, apparently, about being good, unselfish, and prepared to share with others. At least that - along with encouragement to shop in a certain supermarket - seems to be the message of the advert.

It's easier to make sense of the advert if you know the original story. On holiday in Scotland years ago, I came across a book called *The Story of Goliath and Wee Davie*. It is based on the Biblical story in which, against the odds, David the shepherd boy defeats Goliath the Philistine giant in battle. But according to Jimmie Macgregor's illustrated version, alcohol was the real reason for Goliath's downfall – but the humour only really works if you do know the original story.

I was at a clergy meeting not long ago where we were encouraged to have something available in our churches that might explain, in simple terms, what Christianity is about – because the days when it could be assumed that everyone would know the original story have gone.

Over the next few weeks there will be plenty of opportunities to hear the original Christmas story. I always look forward to December, and to catching up with those who come to our Carol Services, our Crib Services on Christmas Eve, and Midnight Mass - and I hope that we might see you there.

And we must remember that being good, unselfish, and prepared to share with others is for life, not just for Christmas. And not just for carrots, either.

<u>CAPEL-LE-FERNE EVENING</u>

After a short amount of business, Jan introduced speaker, Melanie Gibson - Barton with her presentation "Bruges -More than Chocolate". Melanie explained that 2001 was the first time she had been to Bruges, but quickly developed such an affinity for it, that she rented a small house there. Her talk included many aspects of Bruges it's language, lace, cycling and chips! Bruges had been a wealthy medieval port for Europe, but later fell on hard times. This meant that the beautiful Gothic buildings escaped the Industrial revolution, enabling it to become a draw for travellers, from 1890s onwards. The people of Bruges are very proud of their city, allowing no rubbish, limiting cars, decorating front doors following the seasons and events, even setting ornaments and displays in windows to face outwards to passing pedestrians. Summer evenings there are often free music and communal dance sessions. There are modern and not so modern art exhibitions and a museum of chips! The museum describes how potatoes are grown, harvested, prepared and cooked, in beef fat, to be among the best chips ever produced. Obviously, chips are sold in the museum, as well as by many vendors throughout the city. Melanie did mention the famous Bruges chocolate, showing a photograph of her favourite shop with an incredible window display, all made from chocolate. It was an entertaining and informative talk. Several members had visited Bruges, but agreed there was far more to discover during future visits.

Matters arising: Bingo Evening had been well attended, with many visitors, so many that extra tables etc had been needed. Returning to a Friday evening had obviously been a good idea.

Correspondence was briefly discussed: Capel was asked to provide stewards for the East Kent annual meeting in March. Opportunity to be a delegate at NFWI in June. Resolutions for discussion at January meeting were read out.

After the welcome refreshments, which included much sampling and enjoyment tasting competition entries "handmade chocolate item", dates were given although many groups would next meet in 2024. Future Events: Christmas Lunch Wed 6th Dec would include a seating plan as requested.

MOBILE CONTRACT SCAM

Mobile Phone Contract Scam

Scammers will impersonate reputable companies through direct mail as well as email, text and phone calls to try to obtain your financial details. They can also commit fraud and sign up for packages under your name if they have your personal details.

GIFT CARD SCAM

Kent Police report of a new gift card scam

We've received reports of a concerning scam targeting Kent residents. Scammers impersonate your friends or family members in emails, asking for you to purchase sending gift cards on their behalf as they are either short of money at that time or having problems with their online banking.

This is a scam.

If you receive such an email and have doubts, contact the person using a known phone number to verify the request's authenticity. Remember the Kent Police fraud awareness message: Never Assume, Never Believe, Always CONFIRM.






