It's hard to believe that at the time of writing, we are looking ahead to February with Christmas and the New Year so far behind us.

A few developments have happened since early December, including dates and events planned for 2024. An Indoor Boot Fair will take place on the 25 February. We have been lucky enough to secure funding for several lunches during the year, and to provide the Hall with a commercial dishwasher – this will enable us to clear up a lot faster and with less fuss. The one we are looking at has a 2-minute cycle. The pleasure of washing up by hand a 50-cover serving, does tend to pall after a while! We are hoping this will be installed within the month. Once we know how it works, we will write a guide on how to use it. On the horizon is the 80th celebration of D Day taking place – yes, you've guessed it – on the 6 June, starting at the Hall and ending at the Battle of Britain memorial. More on this nearer the time. Traditionally this time of year is very quiet for stallholders at the Farmers' Market, although we continue to be a place where people can get together for a coffee (or tea) and a natter.

From the vicarage

I recall a parent's evening, years ago, in the days when I was teaching Religious Education in school. A parent introduced herself and sat down. Her daughter was a good student - her book was immaculate, work was always completed, and she had done well in her exam – I was really pleased with her, I said.

Mum stared at me, listening in silence. Finally, she spoke. *"It's a funny thing to be good at, isn't it? R.E., I mean..."*

It was then that I realised that Mum wasn't pleased at all. In fact, she was panicking; she probably had dreams of her daughter becoming a doctor, or a lawyer, or a nursery nurse or something – but surely, not a nun! Anything but that!

But why should R.E. be a funny thing to be good at? After all, it's to do with what matters to people, how they find meaning and purpose in their lives and understanding why they do the things they do. It's about understanding, for instance, that there's more to Lent – which this year begins on St Valentine's Day - than just spending forty days doing without chocolate. It's about understanding that there's more to Easter than bunnies – cute and fluffy though bunnies might be - and making up for all the chocolate that you didn't eat during Lent.

I doubt that many, if any, of my former students have ended up as nuns. But over the years I was privileged to meet young people who often surprised others – and themselves – by discovering talents that they didn't know they had. So, if a child you know achieves the unexpected, celebrate it. There's no such thing as 'a funny thing to be good at'! ... *Brian*

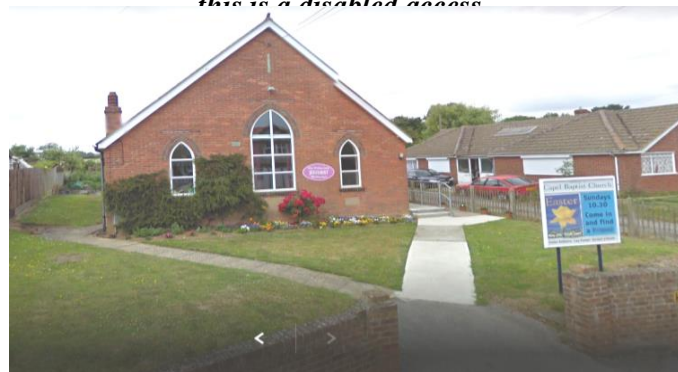

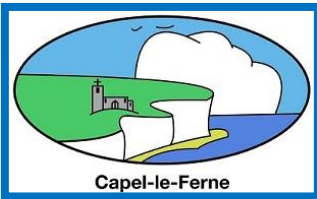

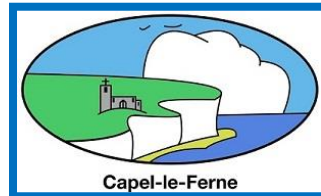

CAPEL-LE-FERNE PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of some items discussed at meeting held Tuesday, 16th January 2024



Requests from public and Other Feedback:

- Cllr. Norris related status of flooding issues, letter from MP Natalie Elphicke and a Section 19 investigation.
- Lighthouse Inn concerns discussed at length. Resolution: No further action until more tangible knowledge or information is received.

Planning:

- All planning applications and comments available to view on Dover District Council website:

Planning>Applications>View-Applications>Planning>Simple Search>Decisions
- Cllr. Pilcher reported on the opportunity to speak to Government Inspectors at Land Allocation Plan meeting.

Neighbourhood Watch:

- Community Warden, Jan Henry, reported on continuation of anti-social behaviour from 2 members of village.
- The future of Community Wardens in Kent, due in April/June 2024. Amount available in Kent will probably decrease, with a beneficial factor being rurality posts.

Playing Field and Equipment:

- Cllr. Pilcher and Cllr. Harris to share responsibility of equipment monitoring.
- Other toddler swing deteriorated and due replacement.
- Skate-park ramps to be inspected in March/April by contractor for refurbishment.
- Football pitch/goal – levelling up goal areas to be considered and rebound mesh fencing installation due.
- Refurbishment planned for; MUGA area, re-lining, new nets and steam jet wash of fencing, tables and benches.
- Co-ordination suggested with Village Hall Management Committee on possibility to providing and locating Christmas Tree.

Traffic Management and Highways:

- Still waiting installation of tactile paving on drop kerbs and outcome of traffic order for double yellow lines at junctions.
- Reports received on TAP and Dover Traffic from MP Natalie Elphicke and District Councillor Hibbert.
- Lorries using Capel Street discussed further with more information and investigation ongoing.

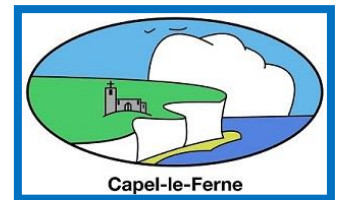
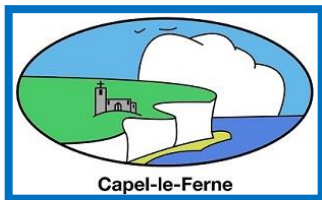

Pam Barr update of her fund-raising for schools in Malawi.

Pam began her journey in 2022 by sending fundraising/money for mosquito nets to a village in Uganda, to her friend Sarah, to help with the ongoing malaria crisis in the country. Since then, money was raised for other items as well, to include renovating materials, sinking bore holes, shower facilities and to put toward health and welfare issues of the people effected in Malawi helping Ruth a School Head Mistress. A horrendous Cyclone (Freddy) hit Malawi, which was an intense tropical cyclone that traversed the southern Indian ocean and was exceptionally long lived, with the duration from the 5/2/23 to 14/3/23 affecting the area very badly throughout this period. It had a devastating impact on every area of life in Malawi, especially amid the Covid outbreak they were already contending with. This greatly impacted on their currency, reduced by 25% and inflation hit 40% costing their economy 1.5 billion. This has had a knock-on effect to their recovery from both the cyclone and covid. Good news has been confirmed, WHO (The World Health Organisation) have now approved malaria vaccines and the government have agreed, for rollout and payment of 18 million vaccines to be given across the country to include Malawi. One child under the age of five dies every minute from malaria across the country, which was a shocking fact of the impact of malaria to us all. Due to factors i.e. Covid, weather etc., Pam and her friend have been unable to return to Malawi as they hoped and have continued the fundraising efforts, here at home, and been able to support the local schools and villagers in Malawi with their needs from the UK. Pam reminded us of the lovely Starfish storey message "I alone cannot save everyone, but will help who I can" which resonated with us. Pam and her friend are raising ongoing funds to help the school Ruth runs and other local villagers. Ruth has taken in 66 families left homeless from the cyclone affects and they are living within in the school grounds camping. Pam's fundraising has made efforts to help with supplies for building shelters, blankets, food, seeds for planting and anything that can help. There are no local services to help rebuild infrastructure/ buildings, shelters and feed the villagers. The environmental effects of the weather have affected planting and growing food and living conditions and these villager's, need the help for the most basic of living needs which we all here in the UK take for granted. Pam has so gallantly and without hesitation donated to her own cost a lot to the fundraising and selfless and modest in this act. Pam will continue to actively continue raising funds and hopes to return to Malawi sometime in the future.

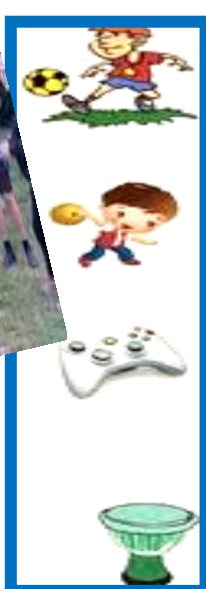

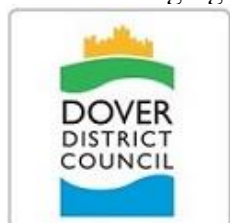

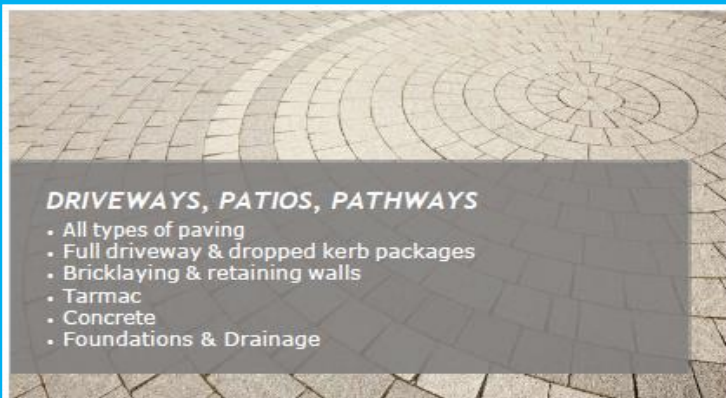
