

Housing development in Capel Parish Council Update

Dover District Council is nearing the end of the process to decide how many new houses will be built in the district within the next 16 years. (The Local Development Plan)

Back in 2019 DDC asked landowners if they had land they would like to offer for development.

Here in Capel, **16 plots** of land were offered for development by local landowners during the evidence gathering stage.

After scrutiny, **4 plots** were considered suitable for development by DDC (highlighted in green on the map attached).

In Capel, the Parish Council held drop-in sessions for the two Public Consultations that took place in 2021 and 2022. We informed and advised our Parishioners how to submit their view to DDC. (The Parish Council have consistently challenged 3 of these plots, supporting CAP011)

In December 2023 a Parish Councillor and a small number of Parishioners attended a session with DDC where the Plan was examined by two HM Government Inspectors.

In 2024 these HM Government Inspectors will visit all sites in the district before advising DDC about any revisions necessary before the Plan is finally adopted in the summer of 2024.

Despite the earlier submissions to DDC by the Parish Council and our Parishioners, the two sites in Cauldham Lane have now got either Full or Outline Planning Permission and the third, Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm is likely to come forward with a Planning Application from the Developers within the coming weeks..

Throughout the last 5 years the Parish Council have continued to express their views to DDC about development in Capel but, we need your support to limit future development in Capel. The Parish Council will also be seeking professional advice in relation to development in the Capel Street/Cauldham Lane area.

At the appropriate time, when a planning application is submitted, we will be holding dropin sessions to guide you on how you can express your views to DDC on the submitted development proposal.

Capel Parish Council really appreciate all your comments and support since the start of this process, but we would really encourage as many of you as possible to submit your views to DDC about developments in Capel at the appropriate time. We will advertise dates and times of our drop-in sessions in the near future on social media and in the Grapevine.

SAP44 - Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm, Capel-le-Ferne (CAP006)

The site is located in the west of Capel-le-Ferne with the settlement confines adjoining to the southern and eastern boundaries. The site is a large arable field that is part of a larger field. The land is higher along the southern boundary and slopes down towards the north. The site is enclosed on two sides by residential development. To the south and east of the site is Cauldham Lane and Capel Street, both of which have linear residential development along them that is predominately large, detached bungalows. The site is bounded by arable fields forming the open countryside to the west and north.

4.269 Lancaster Avenue Recreation Ground is a short distance to the north east, beyond the adjacent residential development. A short distance to the west beyond a hedgerow and tree line, lies the Kent Downs AONB and to the south, beyond adjacent residential development, lies both the AONB and heritage coast including the Battle of Britain War Memorial.

RESPONDING TO Housing development – AGENDA ITEM 6b

Dover District Council Planning Policy for Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm. (CAP006)

The site. Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm, Capel-le-Ferne, as shown on the policies map, is allocated for an indicative capacity of 70 dwellings. Development proposals for this site shall include the following:

- a) Design should take into account the topography of the site, including the relationship with existing residential properties. Development should be set back from the existing residential properties and be sensitively designed to respect the character of the area in relation to scale, form, materials, colour palette and to allow transition to the rural landscape.
- b) An appropriate landscape buffer determined by a Landscape Visual Impact Assessment is required to mitigate the impact of the development on the setting of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) to the north west.
- c) Consideration will be made regarding the quality and condition of trees and hedgerows within the site. Detailed proposals should aim to protect those of importance and incorporate them in the overall design of the development and to provide opportunities for biodiversity habitat creation and enhancement.
- d) Primary vehicular, pedestrian and cycle access to the site shall be provided from Capel Street. Access should not be taken from Cauldham Lane.
- e) In accordance with Policy SP13, a wintering bird survey must be undertaken in advance of a planning application on the site. If the bird survey identifies that the development will exceed the threshold of significance, mitigation will be required. A suitable scheme of mitigation will need to be submitted with the planning application for the site.
- f) A site-specific Flood Risk Assessment is required to address the issue of surface water flooding and consider the impacts of climate change over the lifetime of the development.
- g) An Archaeological Assessment for the site must be carried out in accordance with Policy HE3, the results of which should inform the layout and design of the development which is necessary to avoid harm to any archaeological assets identified through the assessment.
- h) Layout is designed to ensure future access to existing wastewater infrastructure for maintenance and upsizing.
- i) A Transport Assessment is required in accordance with Policy T12 to identify off-site highways improvements and sustainable transport measures that are necessary to serve the development. The Transport Assessment must consider and identify mitigation for the Capel Street/ Dover Road, also taking into account the cumulative impact of other sites allocated in the Plan.
- j) Open space requirements in accordance with Policy PM3 shall be provided. However, due to the location nearby of the existing open space infrastructure, off-site contributions to upgrade or enhance those facilities may be sought rather than on-site provision.

Commenting on a Planning Application

Small to medium scale planning proposals which do not conflict with council policies, and which have generated few objections are processed through Planning Services.

The remaining applications are considered by the council's Planning Committee which meets approximately every four weeks. This usually happens when proposals are large scale, raise important policy issues or have received a significant number of objections.

Comments for and against an application are taken into account in both cases.

Valid reasons for comment:

Comments that are clear, concise and accurate stand more chance of being accepted than those that are not.

Do Comment On:

- Does the application match the Site Policy
- Effects on an area this includes the character of an area, availability of infrastructure, density, overdevelopment, layout, position, design and external appearance of buildings and landscaping
- The need to safeguard valuable resources such as good farmland or mineral reserves.
- Highway safety issues such as traffic generation, road capacity, means of access, visibility, car parking and effects on pedestrians and cyclists.
- Public services such as drainage and water supply
- Effects on individual buildings such as overlooking, loss of light, overshadowing, visual intrusion, noise, disturbance and smell.
- Effects on a specially designated area or building such as green belt, conservation areas, listed buildings, ancient monuments and areas of special scientific interest.
- Effects on existing tree cover and hedgerows.
- Nature conservation interests such as protection of badgers, great crested newts etc.
- Flooding or pollution.
- Prevention of crime and disorder

Irrelevant reasons for objection:

Do Not Comment On:

- The identity of the applicant or occupant
- Unfair competition
- Boundary disputes
- Breach of covenants and personal property rights, including rights of way
- Loss of a private view
- Devaluation of property
- Other financial matters
- Matters controlled by other legislation such as internal space standards for dwellings or fire prevention
- The fact that the applicant does not own the land to which the application relates
- The fact that an objector is a tenant of land where the development is proposed
- The developer's motives, record or reputation
