The Farmers' Market has been doing very well, especially as January is traditionally a bad month. We have a new fruit and vegetable stall, and feedback has been good. Zora, who sells home grown cut flowers, has started and will be attending monthly. This means we now have bread, cakes, meat, eggs, honey, cheese, flowers and fruit and vegetables to offer. The stallholder agreement has been updated and given to all existing clients, and the table hire rates have also been updated. The numbers of visitors are increasing, judging by the number of extra tables and chair we are putting out, which is excellent.

As usual it has been another busy month with maintenance and refurbishment. We have finally had flooring laid in Room 101 and are currently evaluating the flooring in the kitchen prior to installing the new dishwasher. By the time of printing, we hope to have had a big clean in the kitchen enabling us to spring clean throughout the room. We are also working on the main doors, which have been a cause for concern recently.

And finally – a tiny little moan. Given the current economic situation our energy bill has been high this winter, but regretfully it is not helped by people leaving lights and heating on. It is important to feel warm and we will even put heating on early for those who ask, but we would ask that people check the building before they leave, to make sure that that the building is both secure and that utilities have been turned off. I remember the hours I spent as a teenager, waiting for the bus to school - and how I would smile whenever I heard older people in the queue start a conversation. If it wasn't the weather, it was their aches and pains that they always seemed to talk about.

Years have passed, and I must admit that that particular chicken has come home to roost. There was a time when I could run up a staircase, often two steps at a time, carrying schoolbooks from one lesson to the next – but now my knees usually complain when I try anything like that. At the bus station the other day I happened to see someone I knew. We started by asking each other how we were. Guess how the conversation went...!

As I write it is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. It is a time when people talk about giving something up – for Christians, a way of preparing to keep Holy Week and Easter. I've been reading about a monk, St John of the Cross, who lived in Spain during the 16^{th} Century and who, to put it simply, compared getting to know God to going on a journey or, more precisely, to climbing a mountain. Katey showed and explained how some of the product's work, including the range of GPS devices for people out and about, and what is presently on the market and devices, which will be available in the future. Some members already use these devices, and a discussion of the variety of devices and service providers took place. Also Smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors can be linked to some Life Line devices, which alerts your service provider, you receive so the right help/responder. The service is billed quarterly and has set rates dependant on which service you opt for. They currently provide a service to 5-6 thousand people in the Kent area. It helps give you and your family members peace of mind. The service checks in with you monthly. If a false alarm is activated, this is not a problem. A very informative talk, especially for any members considering the service.

Eve thanked Katey for attending and speaking to us today.

Jan welcomed our new member, Lesley MacDougall. Birthday cards were given out to members.

One of their Licences names Capel Farm House, Satmore Lane as an Operating Centre which is registered for 4 vehicles to park. Courtesy letter to be sent to contractors, to please consider residents and their properties and keep to the 20mph speed limit.

- TAP (Traffic Assessment Project) ongoing issues on A20. District Councillors and MP Natalie Elphicke urging authorities to review the situation in and around Dover.
- UPDATE >> Hockley Sole junction road surface: Kent Highway Engineer liaising with surfacing engineer for a better solution of surfacing so that it lasts.
- UPDATE >> Lancaster Avenue: added to local needs list for a request of micro surface throughout. Kent Highways major surfacing team will assess this road for eligibility.

Matters Concerning the Parish:

- Grounds Maintenance Contractors for 2024 quotes received. Harmer and Sons (village locations) and Stephen Huxtable for St Marys, accepted and agreed by all present.
- Parish Councillor Co-option Vacancy continue to advertise for a candidate, possibly requesting someone from specific locations not covered by other Councillors, i.e. George Close etc.
- Asian Hornets A donation of £50 was agreed by all present, to be paid to Dover District Bee Association, to help with their work in removing Asian Hornet nests.
- Garden Hedges A request please to all in the village with hedges overhanging footpaths. This is a reminder, that it is Parishioners responsibility to trim hedges that overhang the public footpaths.



Dover District Council is nearing the end of the process to decide how many new houses will be built in the district within the next 16 years. (The Local Development Plan)

Back in 2019 DDC asked landowners if they had land they would like to offer for development.

Here in Capel, **16 plots** of land were offered for development by local landowners during the evidence gathering stage.

After scrutiny, **4 plots** were considered suitable for development by DDC (highlighted in green on the map attached).

In Capel, the Parish Council held drop-in sessions for the two Public Consultations that took place in 2021 and 2022. We informed and advised our Parishioners how to submit their view to DDC. (The Parish Council have consistently challenged 3 of these plots, supporting CAP011)

In December 2023 a Parish Councillor and a small number of Parishioners attended a session with DDC where the Plan was examined by two HM Government Inspectors.

In 2024 these HM Government Inspectors will visit all sites in the district before advising DDC about any revisions necessary before the Plan is finally adopted in the summer of 2024.

Despite the earlier submissions to DDC by the Parish Council and our Parishioners, the two sites in Cauldham Lane have now got either Full or Outline Planning Permission and the third, Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm is likely to come forward with a Planning Application from the Developers within the coming weeks.

Throughout the last 5 years the Parish Council have continued to express their views to DDC about development in Capel but, we need your support to limit future development in Capel. The Parish Council will also be seeking professional advice in relation to development in the Capel Street/Cauldham Lane area.

At the appropriate time, when a planning application is submitted, we will be holding dropin sessions to guide you on how you can express your views to DDC on the submitted development proposal.

Capel Parish Council really appreciate all your comments and support since the start of this process, but we would really encourage as many of you as possible to submit your views to DDC about developments in Capel at the appropriate time. We will advertise dates and times of our drop-in sessions in the near future on social media and in the Grapevine.

The land is higher along the southern boundary and slopes down towards the north. The site is enclosed on two sides by residential development. To the south and east of the site is Cauldham Lane and Capel Street, both of which have linear residential development along them that is predominately large, detached bungalows. The site is bounded by arable fields forming the open countryside to the west and north.

4.270 Lancaster Avenue Recreation Ground is a short distance to the north east, beyond the adjacent residential development. A short distance to the west beyond a hedgerow and tree line, lies the Kent Downs AONB and to the south, beyond adjacent residential development, lies both the AONB and heritage coast including the Battle of Britain War Memorial.
