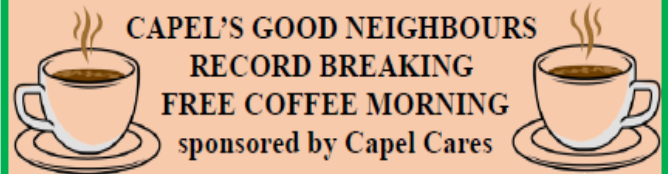

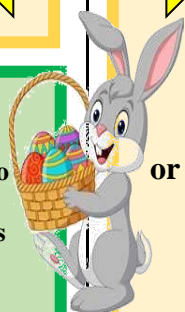

The Farmers' Market has been doing very well, especially as January is traditionally a bad month. We have a new fruit and vegetable stall, and feedback has been good. Zora, who sells home grown cut flowers, has started and will be attending monthly. This means we now have bread, cakes, meat, eggs, honey, cheese, flowers and fruit and vegetables to offer. The stallholder agreement has been updated and given to all existing clients, and the table hire rates have also been updated. The numbers of visitors are increasing, judging by the number of extra tables and chair we are putting out, which is excellent.

As usual it has been another busy month with maintenance and refurbishment. We have finally had flooring laid in Room 101 and are currently evaluating the flooring in the kitchen prior to installing the new dishwasher. By the time of printing, we hope to have had a big clean in the kitchen enabling us to spring clean throughout the room. We are also working on the main doors, which have been a cause for concern recently.

And finally – a tiny little moan. Given the current economic situation our energy bill has been high this winter, but regretfully it is not helped by people leaving lights and heating on. It is important to feel warm and we will even put heating on early for those who ask, but we would ask that people check the building before they leave, to make sure that that the building is both secure and that utilities have been turned off. Thank you and we look forward to seeing you at some of the planned events.

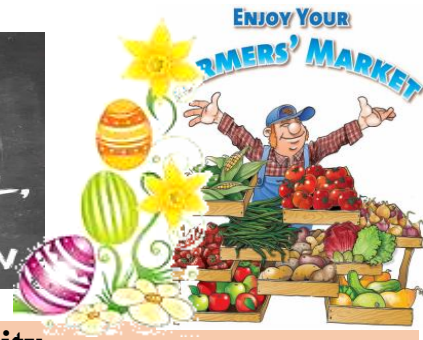





### From the vicarage

I remember the hours I spent as a teenager, waiting for the bus to school – and how I would smile whenever I heard older people in the queue start a conversation. If it wasn't the weather, it was their aches and pains that they always seemed to talk about.

Years have passed, and I must admit that that particular chicken has come home to roost. There was a time when I could run up a staircase, often two steps at a time, carrying schoolbooks from one lesson to the next – but now my knees usually complain when I try anything like that. At the bus station the other day I happened to see someone I knew. We started by asking each other how we were. Guess how the conversation went...!

As I write it is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. It is a time when people talk about giving something up – for Christians, a way of preparing to keep Holy Week and Easter. I've been reading about a monk, St John of the Cross, who lived in Spain during the 16<sup>th</sup> Century and who, to put it simply, compared getting to know God to going on a journey or, more precisely, to climbing a mountain. It's a journey that, like life itself, has challenging uphill stretches.

One of his 'big ideas' is that God wants to help us along on the journey – but we must realise that we can only accept what's on offer if we're prepared to risk letting go of what we already have. We can't accept anything new if our hands are already full.

So perhaps I'll try less giving up, and more letting go this Lent. And I'll joyfully embrace life with wonky knees ... Brian

At church we collect items in our Green Box. When ready, we contact Moira who lives in Old Dover Road, who then arranges for them to be taken to the warehouse.



President Jan welcomed members on this very rainy dreary February evening. Members stood to sing Jerusalem. Carolyn provided the gorgeous red roses for the table and Jan thanked all members, who have taken part in the providing the refreshments and facilitations of this evening's meeting. Tonight's competition was for red themed items (to collaborate with Valentine's theme), with a healthy turn out of entries from our members. As discussed at the last meeting in January 2024, the proceeds from the Blue Pig competition entries were to be donated to a charity. Pam's Malawi Charity was suggested, and votes were taken and agreed by all, to proceed with donating the funds from year 2023 of £35.00. At our last meeting members voted on the WI Resolutions. The majority of 9 votes, were counted for the 'impacts of poor housing conditions' category and this will be put forward on our behalf. Mary, our WI member, entered a written piece into the 'Joan Belcher cup' competition and came 2<sup>nd</sup> with a wonderful piece of writing called 'Love me Love my dog'. A loving tale of a couple and their adorable St Bernard called Brutus. Mary read the tale to us all, which was truly entertaining and thoroughly enjoyable read. A lovely plant was presented to Mary to celebrate her entry by Jan. The WI 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary cloth, with names of members from 1959 to 2009, has lovingly been updated to include the missing members names by Pam. She has added the new names in purple and green colours, that were members up until 2019. Next additions will be members up until 2029. The tablecloth is used on occasions, such as the Birthday meeting and all agreed, to use at the annual general meetings. The evening meeting included the addition of a chippy supper, from a local fish and chip shop in Folkestone. The meal was hot, delicious and filling! Members brought an abundance of condiments, and all enjoyed their meal washed down with a lovely cup of tea/coffee. A perfect feast on such a wintery evening sourced and delivered by Alison, which was greatly appreciated. Our evening Guest Speaker Katey, from Lifeline 365, gave a talk regarding the service they provide. Life Line 365 have a suite of products and a specialist team on hand to provide 24 hour, 365 days of the year service, to help you feel safe whilst staying independent in your own home.

Katey showed and explained how some of the product's work, including the range of GPS devices for people out and about, and what is presently on the market and devices, which will be available in the future. Some members already use these devices, and a discussion of the variety of devices and service providers took place. Also Smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors can be linked to some Life Line devices, which alerts your service provider, so you receive the right help/responder. The service is billed quarterly and has set rates dependant on which service you opt for. They currently provide a service to 5-6 thousand people in the Kent area. It helps give you and your family members peace of mind. The service checks in with you monthly. If a false alarm is activated, this is not a problem. A very informative talk, especially for any members considering the service.

Eve thanked Katey for attending and speaking to us today.

Jan welcomed our new member, Lesley MacDougall. Birthday cards were given out to members.

Forth coming events: - WI Birthday meeting invitations were received from Dover WI, Temple Ewell WI and Whitfield WI. The next craft meeting is on Thursday 15/2/24 and Thursday 29/2/24. Home Economics is on 21/2/24 and the theme will be buttons. Lunch club will take place at Farthingloe Farm, Dover on 20/02/24. Alison will be attending the Annual Council meeting on 19/03/24 on our behalf. The Spring Group meeting is on 26/03/24. Bingo will take place on 5/4/24 and posters are available. Members were reminded, yearly subscription is due and to see Alison regards payment. The summer Educational Outing was discussed for Goddington Park, Ashford. There are gardens, a main house to explore with a garden centre and tearoom on site. Dates were discussed and 11/07/24 agreed. Our competition winner Vad won with her entry which was a lovely red necklace. Members were reminded to sign up for the rota of duties. The entertainment commenced, the raffle was drawn and we played an enthusiastic game of Tea Party Bingo. Jan gave an update on Pat, a member who is currently very unwell. 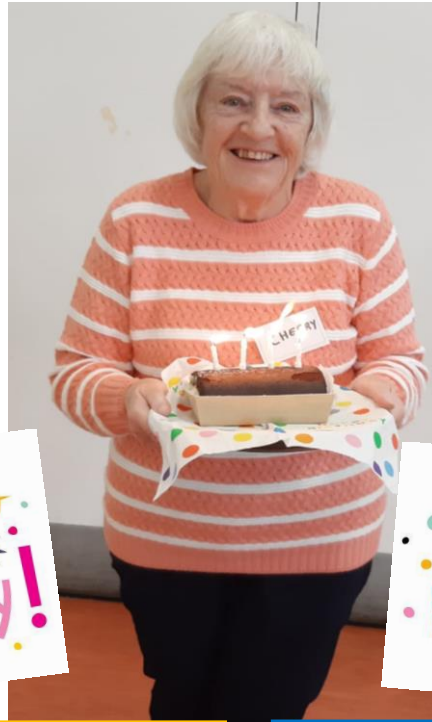

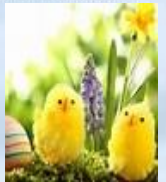

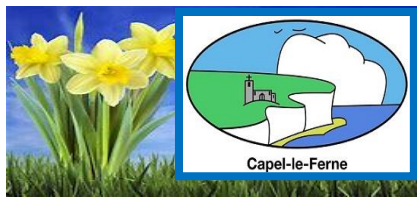

### Summary of some items discussed at meeting held Tuesday, 20<sup>th</sup> February 2024

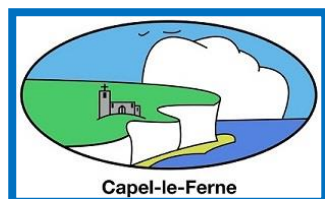

## **Housing development in Capel** **Parish Council Update**



Dover District Council is nearing the end of the process to decide how many new houses will be built in the district within the next 16 years. (The Local Development Plan)

Back in 2019 DDC asked landowners if they had land they would like to offer for development.

Here in Capel, **16 plots** of land were offered for development by local landowners during the evidence gathering stage.

After scrutiny, **4 plots** were considered suitable for development by DDC (highlighted in green on the map attached).

In Capel, the Parish Council held drop-in sessions for the two Public Consultations that took place in 2021 and 2022. We informed and advised our Parishioners how to submit their view to DDC. (The Parish Council have consistently challenged 3 of these plots, supporting CAP011)

In December 2023 a Parish Councillor and a small number of Parishioners attended a session with DDC where the Plan was examined by two HM Government Inspectors.

In 2024 these HM Government Inspectors will visit all sites in the district before advising DDC about any revisions necessary before the Plan is finally adopted in the summer of 2024.

Despite the earlier submissions to DDC by the Parish Council and our Parishioners, the two sites in Cauldham Lane have now got either Full or Outline Planning Permission and the third, Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm is likely to come forward with a Planning Application from the Developers within the coming weeks.

**Throughout the last 5 years the Parish Council have continued to express their views to DDC about development in Capel but, we need your support to limit future development in Capel. The Parish Council will also be seeking professional advice in relation to development in the Capel Street/Cauldham Lane area.**

**At the appropriate time, when a planning application is submitted, we will be holding drop-in sessions to guide you on how you can express your views to DDC on the submitted development proposal.**

**Capel Parish Council really appreciate all your comments and support since the start of this process, but we would really encourage as many of you as possible to submit your views to DDC about developments in Capel at the appropriate time. We will advertise dates and times of our drop-in sessions in the near future on social media and in the Grapevine.**

A resident purchased trainers from what they thought was the official website. After the payment was complete there was no confirmation email and they received no response when contacting support. They did not receive a refund.

Fraudsters often set up websites that look real but are in fact fake.

## SOLICITOR LETTER SCAM

Ever received a letter demanding payment from a solicitor, not meant for you?

A Kent resident has reported receiving letters from a solicitor. The request for payment was due to an incident where petrol was not paid for at a filling station. The letters threatened a CCJ (County Court Judgment). If it wasn't paid, they would be sending bailiffs to the property.

While this was an error, the resident did not want bailiffs at his home. After repeated attempts to contact the solicitor, they still haven't heard back.

This could be a scam to try and get you to pay money or identity theft where a fraudster using your personal details to commit offences.

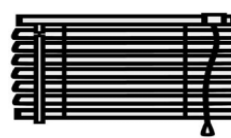
