As I write this, the sun is out, and it is warm enough to be outside without a coat. Good weather tends to make you want to be out and about, and we have been heartened at the number of new people using the Hall and attending the Farmers' Market in recent months.

At our next couple of meetings, we will be discussing things that need doing in the Hall, maybe not immediately but certainly over the next six months. We have already released a list of forthcoming events but if, in using the Hall, you have thought the Hall would benefit from having something done, or would like some kind of activity, then please contact any of the trustees so that we can give your ideas due consideration.

Our meetings do tend to follow similar themes with occasional special items being discussed. For example, on every agenda we have maintenance, finance, lettings, Farmers' Market, diary events, 100 club and fundraising. The latter is important as the Hall is run of a very simple premise. Regular letting fees cover the costs of running the Hall, such as utilities, rubbish removal, insurance, licences and cleaning. While private hire and fundraising cover maintenance and renovation.

At our last meeting we discussed the dishwasher issue (which doesn't come up every day), while at the next we will talk about the Halls' investment bank account. As well as trustees attending monthly meetings, we also have impromptu ones to clear out storerooms, plan community lunch menus or put up/take down Christmas decorations. All the trustees give up their time to work on various events while Sue, our lettings secretary, goes above and beyond taking Hall bookings and paying bills by trying to get the best utility rates or fighting companies on overpayment. Fred our cleaner goes the extra mile in fixing those annoying little things that always seem to need repair. Our volunteers turn out in all weathers to support the Hall, whether to man the kitchen, or putting out tables and chairs or help with traffic marshalling at events. Most of your work goes unremarked unless something goes wrong (which it rarely does), but to you all I say thank you.

### From the vicarage

Canterbury Cathedral is a World Heritage Site and Mother Church of the Anglican Communion. When the Dean and Chapter stage events such as organ recitals or art exhibitions, alongside the daily services nobody usually minds.

The rule is that events in churches and cathedrals should be 'seemly' – so you can stage a concert or a talk on local history, but not an evening of adult humour. But what about a 'silent disco'?

Mobile phone footage of the recent event in Canterbury Cathedral posted online, shows people dancing along to '90s music played through headphones and enjoying themselves. Some argued that a silent disco might be a good way to introduce the Cathedral to those who might otherwise not visit. But others made it quite plain that turning cathedrals into nightclubs, as they see it, doesn't tick the 'seemly' box. Nevertheless, Canterbury Cathedral's 'silent disco' contributed about £10,000 towards the £30,000 per day it needs to keep its doors open. Few realise that cathedrals are funded neither by the Church of England nor by the taxpayer, but by donations and income from visitors.

Neither are parish churches publicly funded. Like other parishes we rely on our parishioners to help to raise the 'Parish Share' – the amount needed by the Diocese to keep our local churches functioning – which for us this year is £29,000. Apparently, a similar situation elsewhere led a churchwarden to go into her local pub and explain the situation to the locals. They each agreed to donate the price of a chocolate bar to the Parish Giving Scheme each month.\* That, or a disco? I'm still trying to decide... Brian







### Dover District Council Planning Policy for Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm. (CAP006)

**The site.** Land to the east of Great Cauldham Farm, Capel-le-Ferne, as shown on the policies map, is allocated for an indicative capacity of 70 dwellings.

Development proposals for this site shall include the following:

- a) Design should take into account the topography of the site, including the relationship with existing residential properties. Development should be set back from the existing residential properties and be sensitively designed to respect the character of the area in relation to scale, form, materials, colour palette and to allow transition to the rural landscape.
- b) An appropriate landscape buffer determined by a Landscape Visual Impact Assessment is required to mitigate the impact of the development on the setting of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) to the north west.
- c) Consideration will be made regarding the quality and condition of trees and hedgerows within the site. Detailed proposals should aim to protect those of importance and incorporate them in the overall design of the development and to provide opportunities for biodiversity habitat creation and enhancement.
- d) Primary vehicular, pedestrian and cycle access to the site shall be provided from Capel Street. Access should not be taken from Cauldham Lane.
- e) In accordance with Policy SP13, a wintering bird survey must be undertaken in advance of a planning application on the site. If the bird survey identifies that the development will exceed the threshold of significance, mitigation will be required. A suitable scheme of mitigation will need to be submitted with the planning application for the site.
- f) A site-specific Flood Risk Assessment is required to address the issue of surface water flooding and consider the impacts of climate change over the lifetime of the development.
- g) An Archaeological Assessment for the site must be carried out in accordance with Policy HE3, the results of which should inform the layout and design of the development which is necessary to avoid harm to any archaeological assets identified through the assessment.
- h) Layout is designed to ensure future access to existing wastewater infrastructure for maintenance and upsizing.
- i) A Transport Assessment is required in accordance with Policy T12 to identify off-site highways improvements and sustainable transport measures that are necessary to serve the development. The Transport Assessment must consider and identify mitigation for the Capel Street/ Dover Road, also taking into account the cumulative impact of other sites allocated in the Plan.
- j) Open space requirements in accordance with Policy PM3 shall be provided. However, due to the location nearby of the existing open space infrastructure, off-site contributions to upgrade or enhance those facilities may be sought rather than on-site provision.





### Commenting on a Planning Application, Advice and Guidance

Small to medium scale planning proposals which do not conflict with council policies, and which have generated few objections are processed through Planning Services.

The remaining applications are considered by the council's Planning Committee which meets approximately every four weeks. This usually happens when proposals are large scale, raise important policy issues or have received a significant number of objections.

Comments for and against an application are taken into account in both cases.

#### Valid reasons for comment:

Comments that are clear, concise and accurate stand more chance of being accepted than those that are not.

#### **Do Comment On:**

- Does the application match the Site Policy
- Effects on an area this includes the character of an area, availability of infrastructure, density, over-development, layout, position, design and external appearance of buildings and landscaping
- The need to safeguard valuable resources such as good farmland or mineral reserves.
- Highway safety issues such as traffic generation, road capacity, means of access, visibility, car parking and effects on pedestrians and cyclists.
- Public services such as drainage and water supply
- Effects on individual buildings such as overlooking, loss of light, overshadowing, visual intrusion, noise, disturbance and smell.
- Effects on a specially designated area or building such as green belt, conservation areas, listed buildings, ancient monuments and areas of special scientific interest.
- Effects on existing tree cover and hedgerows.
- Nature conservation interests such as protection of badgers, great crested newts etc.
- Flooding or pollution.
- Prevention of crime and disorder

### Irrelevant reasons for objection: Do Not Comment On:

- The identity of the applicant or occupant
- Unfair competition
- Boundary disputes
- Breach of covenants and personal property rights, including rights of way
- Loss of a private view
- Devaluation of property
- Other financial matters
- Matters controlled by other legislation such as internal space standards for dwellings or fire prevention
- The fact that the applicant does not own the land to which the application relates
- The fact that an objector is a tenant of land where the development is proposed
- The developer's motives, record or reputation






