From the vicarage

Having been a teacher, I've spent years encouraging young people to plan for the future – to think about what they would like to do in life, and to work hard to try to make it happen. I had done the same at their age - I can still remember nervously opening the envelope containing my exam results, the excitement of being given my first teaching post, and seeing what would be my classroom for the very first time.

But I never thought about how it would end. You might expect retirement to be marked by farewell speeches and the presentation of a clock or something. But for me, it was different.

At our monthly Messy Church, I looked – unsuccessfully - for a dice and counters. Arriving home, I decided to check my school bag. As I rummaged, assorted pens, crayons and a notepad emerged, along with a copy of Shakespeare's *Macbeth* - a memento of my last assignment. I had home tutored a lad who, though excluded from school, still wanted to sit his English GCSE; I had ordered a copy of the play so that he could tackle his coursework. It arrived at the same time as an email from Mum to say that he had changed his mind - and now he didn't want to work with me anyway.

Time had passed since then, suitable offers of work had dried up, and I realised that as is sometimes the way with endings, retirement had crept up on me without me even noticing.

There were no farewell speeches, carriage clock or gardening vouchers for me. Instead, I just emptied my bag, rehomed my board pens and revision guides, presented myself with a copy of a Shakespearean tragedy, and celebrated with a cup of tea... *Brian*





Join us on the evening of Thursday 6th June as we commemorate D-Day with a clifftop beacon at the Battle of Britain Memorial

It may have taken place four years earlier, but the Battle of Britain played a huge part in the D-Day landings.

It is generally agreed that the Normandy landings would not have been possible as early as June 1944 had the RAF's success in the Battle not kept these shores clear of enemy boots and the south coast available as the embarkation point for the Allied invasion fleet.

The evening celebration will give visitors a chance to enjoy the illuminated site, while the whole of the Battle of Britain Memorial, including The Scramble Experience, shop and café, will be fully open from 8pm until 10pm The beacon will be lit at 9.15pm, heralded by a bugle call. Supporters and visitors will be joined at 8.30pm by a torchlit procession of villagers from Capel-le-Ferne who will walk to the site from the village.

Traffic Management and Highways:


- > Tactile paving on drop kerbs installed. Concerns expressed on disappointment on work and request for an on-site meeting with Highway Officer or Engineer.



For many understandable reasons, enforcement and broad-stroke campaigning have made little progress over the past decade, and focused, large-scaled education is currently only organised efficiently in the shape of Speed Awareness Courses after an offence is detected. Modern preventative educational methodologies like Speedwatch have yet to been utilised to its fullest extent. Now is a good time to change that..

Research show that on average 97% of speeding offences (not including Speedwatch observations) are detected by speed cameras. The vast majority of these are fixed at the roadside in areas known to both local residents and regular commuters, hence - and in spite of the so-called 'Halo-effect', they have little effect in areas not covered by camera technology.

Equally relevant - and especially to rural areas where fatalities are four times more likely to happen than in urban areas, the discussion about road safety has a tendency to focus on number of collision casualties alone. In most areas where Speedwatch operates and where speeding evidently is a concern to the communities, the qualityof-life issue as well as feeling safe when using the roads recreationally, are equally important to the affected areas' residents. This is not an attempt at diminishing the dismay of the high number of fatal and seriously injured victims but a reminder that the problem of speeding goes well beyond quantifying its consequences with casualty statistics alone.

Inconsistently applied enforcement methodology is not likely to change socially perceived acceptable behaviour if the majority of those caught speeding either are not - or consider themselves habitual speeders. Increased compliance with the law can be achieved with other means than enforcement. In the case of Speedwatch, personalised education is a methodology that is just as efficient to help bring the problem under control.

Organising concerned, proactive community volunteers on a grand scale is vital to succeed with this goal.



Recently, I got called by our Pest Controller Technician to inform, that somebody called the Police to inform them that there was a person with a firearm on site.

We assume the call originated from the Village and that is as far the Police would disclose.

The force turned up in an unnecessary large volume of armed police officers, which they were just reacting to the call, on for this situation and was overwhelming when they all turned up!

FOR INFORMATION ... The Trust has the legal right to control the numbers of pests to keep the grounds safe to walk on and avoid rabbit holes from causing injuries to visitors on site. The PCT conducts all this with all the legal requirements and documentations, and warning signs are put out at entry points to the site during the period of operation, so it should not come as a surprise to individuals who enter the site.

FOR FURTHER INFORMATION ... We are also still sadly seeing dog walkers, after opening hours, exercising their dogs off the lead. This is in breach of Dover District Council's Public Space Protection Order, (which carries fines if broken), as a Dog Restriction Order is in force on site that all dogs must be on a leash.
