From the vicarage

Perhaps Lord Alan Sugar's TV programme *The Apprentice* is like Marmite – you either love it or loathe it. You might know the drill: each week, two teams engage in tasks that test business acumen. Many find following the fortunes of the budding entrepreneurs who compete against each other week by week compelling viewing, building to a climax as each member of the losing team tries to avoid being fired by Lord Sugar at someone else's expense.

My ears pricked up when a recent episode came on that saw the teams designing and marketing Easter eggs. Some say that Easter eggs originated with early Christians in Mesopotamia dyeing eggs to represent different aspects of the Easter story, a custom which eventually spread across Europe where, during the 1800s, the first chocolate eggs appeared. What would the teams come up with?

The winning team produced an exotic chocolate log rather than an egg. The others, remembering that Santa Claus (originally a 4thcentury Christian bishop) rewards good children with presents, decided on a space theme for their egg with an idea for an astronaut character who would reward good children with chocolate!

As I watched, I began to despair. The task had been to design and market an Easter egg. Hadn't anyone heard of Jesus? The empty tomb? Resurrection?

In the boardroom, Lord Sugar questioned the idea of the astronaut. Surely, he said, everyone associated the Easter Bunny with Easter eggs! By now my misery was complete – I just wanted to fire everybody!

At each of our churches on Easter morning we shall tell the Easter story - about the empty tomb, and Jesus rising from the dead and appearing to his disciples. There may well be Easter eggs to follow - but sorry, no bunnies or astronauts...! ... Brian

It had become clear that the resident had been scammed - both contact numbers for the JEWELRY' backing card.




